

## ADITI MAHAVIDYALAYA PRINCIPAL'S ADDRESS

This beautiful morning, all of us have got together to celebrate the 23<sup>rd</sup> Annual Day of our college with great joy and immense exultation. If there are no stars, there would not be any beauty in the sky. If there is no difference of opinions there would not be any creative and innovative ideas. Similarly, if there is no Annual Day in our college, there would not be any chance for our young and dynamic students to uphold the pride of the institute, to catalogue the challenges we face, the endeavors we made and the success we achieved and to show what we were and what we will be. Here am I hence, much privileged to stand before you, to extend sincere and profound wishes and greetings, to bring the warmth of our affection, through the stream of love, to welcome each and every one of you and I deem it my privilege to place before you a brief report of the activities of the college for the academic year 2017–18.

I am profusely elated to take an opportunity to introduce the chief guest of the day Sh. Vijay Sampla to our College. Thank you Sir, for taking time off from your busy schedule, and so graciously consenting to be here this morning, as Chief Guest for the annual day of the college. Sh. Vijay Sampla is the Union Minister of State for Social Justice Empowerment, Member of Parliament (Lok Sabha from Hoshiarpur). He is the state president of Bhartiya Janta Party in Punjab. He has held several key posts in the BJP's Punjab Unit. He was the chairman of forest department and *khaadi udyog* in the government of Punjab. He is a well-known Social Worker. He is working many Social Welfare Societies to help people. His political journey began after he was elected the *Sarpanch* of his Sofi village (Jalandhar District).

I am honoured and privileged to welcome our Guest of Honour Sh. Prem Das Rai. He belongs to the Sikkim Democratic Front (SDF) party. Mr. Rai is currently a Member of Parliament (Lok Sabha) from the Sikkim constituency. In 2002, he was awarded the prestigious and selective Eisenhower Fellowship (USA) for his contribution to Sikkim's economic and industrial growth. Mr. Rai is currently a Member of the Parliamentary Standing Committee on Finance, the Parliamentary Standing Committee on Subordinate Legislation, and the Parliamentary Consultative Committee on Tribal Affairs and DoNER Ministry. He is also the Secretary General of the North-East MPs' Forum, Member of the Governing Council of Centre for Environmental Health, Public Health Foundation of India (PHFI) and Integrated Mountain Initiative (IMI), and Member of the Advisory Council of Population Foundation of India (PFI). He heads the Parliamentary Committee on Population and Development. Not only this but Mr. Rai serves as Chair for the Steering Committee on Anti-Drugs under the Department of Social Justice and Women Empowerment, Government of Sikkim, which has started a unique program in Government schools called SAATHI. He is Co-Chair of the Steering Committee of Educational Quality Improvement Program (EQUIP), under the Human Resource Development Department, Government of Sikkim. Until recently, Mr. Rai served as the Deputy Chairman of the State Planning Commission of the Government of Sikkim, and was a former General Secretary of the Sikkim Democratic Front Party. Currently, he also serves as the editor of the *Political and Economic Journal* of Sikkim, and as SDF Spokesperson, commenting primarily on National issues. Mr. Rai has undertaken leadership courses at Yale, Oxford, Harvard and Princeton Universities on invitation. He has also lectured in Universities and Institutions in Tokyo, Japan,

sponsored by the Sasakawa Foundation and has attended the United Nations General Assembly and Security Council working sessions. In 2012, he was awarded with Distinguished Alumnus of IIM Ahmedabad and is also a Distinguished Alumnus of IIT Kanpur.

I am absolutely delighted to welcome our esteemed Guest of Honour ADJ Sh. Dhirender Rana, Secretary, DLSA (North). He completed his B.A (Pass.) from Ramjas College, University of Delhi in 1999. He enrolled in LL.B course from University of Delhi in the year 2002. Thereafter, he enrolled with the Bar Council of Delhi in 2005. He practiced for about three years on the Original and Appellant Civil, Criminal and Matrimonial side in various District Courts in Delhi as well as in the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi and before various other- judicial fora. In 2008, he joined Delhi Police as Sub-Inspector. Thereafter, he joined Delhi Judicial Services in July, 2009. He completed his LL.M. from Kurukshetra University in 2011. He worked as Metropolitan Magistrate including special Court under N.I. Act, Traffic court and also various police stations before joining as Secretary, DLSA (North), District Courts Rohini. At present, he is on deputation.

I am also delighted to have amidst us Mr. Rajan Srivastava, Founder and President of Shree Narayan Sanskritik Chetna Nyas (SNSCN). This organization has been working in India for over fifteen years, focusing on alleviating poverty and social injustice. The aim is achieved through well-planned and comprehensive programmes in health, education, livelihoods and disaster-preparedness and response. His involvement with SNSCN has stemmed from his deep-rooted desire to help less privileged children and his commitment to education. The most impressive fact of this organization is that it focuses on the empowerment of women and girls because they are disproportionately affected by poverty and discrimination. Run by Shree Narayan Sanskritik Chetna Trust, the food cart has been providing cheap and hygienic meals to workers from lower-income sections of the society for the past few years. The initiative was started by Mr. Rajan Kumar Srivastava, chief patron of the trust, as a tribute to his now deceased parents. The food cart sees 400-450 people lining up every afternoon before the counter to get a token to avail the meal. Mr. Rajan Srivastava is currently the president of Lions Club of Noida.

We need not say much about our chair person. The whole campus is vibrating with and echoing her prominence. We have the pleasure of Welcoming Professor Neeta Sehgal, Proctor, University of Delhi. She is serving the University in the capacity of Proctor since January 2016 and was former Head of the Department of Zoology (2013 to 2016). She is a member of several academic Committees of various Universities. We are very much grateful to Professor Pamela Singhla from the Department of Social Work, University of Delhi to grace the occasion. Both, Professor Sehgal and Professor Singhla are also the University representatives of our Governing body.

The theme for today's annual day is the "North East MOSAIC." The reason behind this being that we are able to remind ourselves and all citizens about the love, brotherhood and the spirit of integrity that prevails in our country. The programme is a harbinger of nurturing an integrated feeling and admiration for the most magnificent regions of our country, which had earlier been

neglected despite the finest and the most unique forms of dance, art, handicraft, martial art and culture and to ensure safety for the people from northeast to bring back their confidence.

## PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

The academic year 2017-18 has been a year of active growth and fulfillment of our students in various spheres of life, where the prime focus has been to sensitize them about numerous bounties our country offers. It is an honor for us to be awarded the 'Girl Centric Tertiary Education & Training Award' at World Women Summit 2018, at IIC, Lodhi Road, New Delhi. Due to the persistent efforts by college principal towards promotion and upliftment of girls, she was invited as Guest of Honour at 'BetiyaaPadao – ShrishtiSajao' award function at Maharaja Agrasen College by Betiyaa Foundation and Light of Nation. The college believes and endeavors towards empowerment of women in all walks of life. To celebrate womanhood by moving beyond psychological and social barriers, our college became the first rural college in University of Delhi to install a sanitary napkin vending machine in collaboration with C.S.R. Research Foundation, and work in rural areas adjoining college spreading awareness about maintenance of personal hygiene of women, which is their basic right for a safe existence. The same was appreciated by university and a letter was sent from Vice Chancellors' office to all colleges referring the same. This year witnessed installation of two reverse osmosis machines in college for provision of safe clean drinking water. We firmly believe that a healthy mind can reside only in a healthy body, and following the same we celebrated International Yoga Day, teaching everybody basic yoga techniques and asanas for a healthy life; audition for fashion show for health awareness under the aegis of ministry of AAYUSH, organized a cross country race emphasizing relevance of physical activity as a pre-requisite to a healthy life.

A free medical camp for all staff members of college was organized where they got their blood pressure, heart, sugar level and bone density monitored by a team of medical specialists from super specialty B.L.K. Hospital. For provision of oxygen rich pure air in college campus, tree plantation drive was conducted, and girls were not just informed but also motivated to adopt a plant each at least up till their graduation. Moving forward with vision of nationwide movement of 'Swachhta Abhiyan,' the college organized Swachhata Pakhwada to sensitize locals of the region about importance of maintaining cleanliness. Specially designed leaflets containing information on common do's and don'ts, symptoms and precautions for vector borne diseases were distributed in and around college during the year. In line with 'Ek Bharat Shrestha Bharat' vision of our government, the college organized the North East cultural festival 'Orunodoi-2017' to celebrate the richness of beautiful state of Sikkim, by inviting M.L.A. of Bawana Sri Ram Chander and area councilor Shri Brahm Prakash as Chief Guests. Mesmerizing dance performance by special dance troupe from H.R.D., Sikkim was held, vibrancy of attires of the state was felt through the fashion show on the theme and regional delicacies were prepared by the students. Carrying the theme further, 20 students of our college (most of whom belonged to B.P.L. families) got the opportunity to visit the state of Sikkim by air for a cultural exchange program, who learnt from and respected its rich cultural heritage. We were honored by government of Sikkim for promotion of cultural exchange with the north-east, and also received a letter of appreciation from M.H.R.D. government of India for the same.

To promote spirit of nationalism and common brotherhood among young blood, we celebrated the 'Rashtriya Ekta Diwas' by organizing a 'Run for Unity' in remembrance of legendary iron man of the country Sardar Vallabh Bhai Patel. Various events were organized on the occasion of 'Subhash Jayanti' and 'Nirvan Diwas' to pay homage to people like Subhash Chandra Bose and B.R. Ambedkar, who had the courage and wisdom to envision a free and empowered India and work for it. On similar lines 'Matrabhasha Diwas' was celebrated to spread awareness about rich ancient legacy that literature of our mother tongue holds. A seminar was organized discussing the importance of and challenges confronting Hindias a common language was organized. We at Aditi believe that growth of a nation cannot take place in isolation—it involves growth of every person, region and culture; taking a step further in direction our college had organized various seminars on personality development, public speaking, G.S.T. and our budget, Income Tax Simplified for common use, tools and techniques of Tally- E.R.P. 9, mock group discussion sessions, benefits of adoption of organic farming at grass root level, careers in banking industry, all of which aimed at equipping students about recent trends and advances in society.

To achieve holistic development of our girls, we had organized hands on workshop on health and wellness through Yoga and Naturopathy, climate change and disaster management; an open talk was organized to encourage survivors of sexual and gender based violence and reproductive health of women; photography and painting competition to promote creative potential of students was organized, all of which were presided over by eminent field experts. Under good practices, extensive lecture series was launched. To sensitize girls about their legal rights, eminent lawyers of our honorable supreme court Ms. Monika Arora and Ms. Pragna Parande were invited as resource persons. The college had organized community walk to slums of Nizamuddin, which exposed students to various problems faced by people residing there for whom daily survival is a struggle in itself. A painting competition for the underprivileged was organized in collaboration with Delhi Public Library at slums of Shahbad Diary to spread awareness about importance of books and maintenance of cleanliness; and to spread a smile and happiness among the elderly destitute, a visit to old age home in Kanjhawla was undertaken; all of which sensitized our students about relevance of their contribution to the society where they belong.

Furthering the vision of student empowerment, we had organized a road safety training session in collaboration with Delhi Traffic Police and Herocop, and the first ever biker club of our college was made where our girls were taught bike riding which until now has been a predominantly male oriented vehicle. As a part of the 'Virasat Series' by Spic Macay , breathtaking Kathak performance by Ms. Gauri Diwaker and screening of legendary films of Hindi cinema were show-cased. This exposed the students to numerous vocations they may take up as per their orientation. Principal of college Dr. Mamta Sharma was awarded with the 'Bharat Ratna Dr. A.P.J. Abdul Kalam Gold Medal' for her outstanding contribution to research by Global Economic

Progress & Research Association. To encourage research orientation on development and innovation of techniques to tackle challenges coming in way of maintaining a clean environment, we organized a two day U.G.C. funded National Conference on "Recent Advances in Chemical Sciences towards Green & Sustainable Environment: Swachh Bharat Abhiyaan Perspective" by inviting experts from among students, academics and industry. Various experts from all fields were invited as resource persons for environment sensitization and former Chairperson Sh. Jal Singh Rana graced the conference as Chief Guest. The conference was a huge success as could be seen from large number of participation coming from across Delhi and other states. Contributing to the green initiatives of the college, we have entered into a partnership with 'Greenotech' under which waste paper generated in the college gets converted into stationery items. Today the college is going to sign P.P.A. to install solar panels on the roof tops which shall meet the energy requirements of the college thereby reducing electric cost. The college also proposes to install a compost machine to make the college campus garbage free and ecofriendly. The college has received sanction from Hon'ble Member of Parliament, Shri Udit Raj from his MP fund for installation of open gymnasium for students and staff members.

## DEPARTMENTAL ACHIEVEMENTS

### DEPARTMENT OF B.EL.ED.

The undergraduate community of the department continues to thrive and remain active, even though it is highly diverse, during the academic session 2017-18. The department celebrated National Education Day on November 11, 2017 and Constitution Day on November 26, 2017 in which students participated enthusiastically. The B.El.Ed. students continue to score well and bring laurels to the college. Our student Meenakshi Pal of third year secured 3rd position in the university. Second year student Pooja Siwatch stood 1st in the university and first year student Ojasvi Sharma came 2<sup>nd</sup> in the University of Delhi.

Fourth year student Meenakshi Pal was selected for all-rounder trophy of B.El.Ed. Department this year. Ms. Meenakshi Pal from third year, Ms. Pooja Siwatch from second year and Ms. Ojasvi Sharma from first year will be awarded Vaishali Tomar memorial scholarship for the year 2017-18.

The B.El.Ed. programme offers immense scope for incorporating interdisciplinary ideas through projects, colloquia and others activities. Fourth year students were placed in different MCP schools for their primary school internship. For internship at middle school level, these students were placed in Directorate of Education schools. Student interns actively engaged in teaching elementary school children with systematic feedback and evaluations under their supervisors. Interns maintained regular reflective journals that include a reflection of the teaching-learning process in the class room.

The pedagogy of social science students of fourth year visited Bawana Jail, a heritage site under heritage walk programme. A three hours workshop on stress management, communication skills and career guidance was organized for fourth year students. Ms. Ruchika Arya conducted these workshops with the objectives of stress management, coping mechanism and positive thinking for effective personal/professional development. On the occasion of annual sports day February 6, 2018, students of fourth year participated in tug-of-war event and secured 1st position. The team consisted of Renu, Divya, Saumya, Himanshi, Ritu, Reshma, Sulbha, Ritu Chaudhary, Anjali Sharma, Radhika and Deepika. Saumya got 3rd position in shot put event as well. Fourth year pedagogy of natural science students attended a workshop for teachers of middle and high school on the theme 'Density and Flotation.' On the eve of Gandhi Jayanti, Saumya secured 1st position in poster-making competition. Neha and Rakhi also actively participated in Hindi Nibandh and Hindi Bhashan Pratiyogita organized in our college. Neha and Rakhi participated in a skit on the theme 'north east.' Sulbha participated in debate competition in our college. Radhika and Kajal participated in talent hunt quiz.

As an integral part of the course, third year students are required to visit a center following innovative/alternate practices in elementary education. For this purpose third year students visited Mirambika-Free Progress School at Aurobindo Ashram, Delhi from February 16-18, 2018. Students participated in various interactive sessions with resource persons and gained insight about various alternate educational practices in the field of school education. Third year students were also placed in different MCP schools in the month of November for school observations so that they can actually observe and reflect on classroom teaching practices. Students visited Lady Shri Ram College to attend its annual academic meet Sehar on February 15, 2018. The theme for the same was 'Taking science beyond the classroom.' Students also attended an international seminar on 'Education for sustainable development: Negotiating the curriculum' organized by Faculty of Education, University of Delhi on January 30, 2018. Students participated and won prizes in mathematical event MATRIX 2.0 organized by CIC, University of Delhi on October 30, 2017. The event included many mathematical activities, both competitive and non-competitive. Students had workshops in Theatre in Education with Dr. Akhilesh Yadav. Jodogyan conducted one-day workshop for third year students to explain workable solutions to mathematical problems in classroom practices. The students also learned to design and make low cost teaching material in the workshop.

Dr. Pearl Drego from TACET academy facilitated self-development workshop of the second year students. Self-development workshop cultivates positive attitude and sensitivity towards each other. Story telling workshops were conducted by Ms. Jyotsana and faculty members. Students make story folders and display their work in the form of bulletin boards. Students participated in various activities at college level. Pallavi Singh secured 2nd position in poster making competition. On annual sports day, second year students along with fourth year students participated in tug-of-war event and secured 1st position. A skit was also performed by Snigdha, Deepanshi, Sonali, Meghna, Neha, Pallavi, Yashika, Komal, Simran, Anuradha, Ashima, Priyanka and Narmada on the occasion of National Education Day celebrated on November 11, 2017. Students also participated in photography and film review competitions organized by Film Society of our college. Second year students also participated in intra-college Kho-Kho competition on February 22, 2018 and marked their presence.

Theatre workshops were organized for B.El.Ed. first year students by Mr. Manish Saini. Students participated in craft workshop under the supervision and guidance of Ms. Harpreet. These workshops helped student to develop skills for the uses of craft in education. Students completed their school contact programme and used the skills of theatre and craft to engage with small groups of children in primary schools. They conducted meaningful group and individual activities with children in schools. Students participated in debate, poster making, slogan writing and photography competitions and won first, second and third prizes. These students also participated in annual academic meet at Lady Shri Ram College, University of Delhi.

They visited slums as a part of core social science component and worked on a project based on these visits. Students visited National Museum also.

## **DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE**

The Department of Commerce offers two of the premium courses of University of Delhi viz. B.Com (Honours) and B.Com (Programme). The Department creates a stimulating environment for the academic growth of its students. The Department aims to strengthen latent potential of students so as to increase their employability, empower them with financial security and prepare them for professional success. The department also aims to enrich students with technical soft skills relevant for the curriculum. The certified workshops on latest professional software such as Tally, Excel, e-filing etc. are conducted regularly by experts in the field, providing the students hands on experience on the same.

### **Orientation Program:**

The Department of Commerce organized Orientation program on July 20, 2017 for the fresher batch of 2017 in Undergraduate Programme of the Department. A brief presentation about departmental infrastructure, laboratories facilities, courses taught and activities of different clubs was provided. The departmental faculty team and supporting staff of the college were also introduced. There were about 150 students present during the orientation programme.

### **Workshop on “Introduction to Stock Market”**

The Department had organized a one-hour workshop on “Introduction to Stock Market” for students of finance, in final year of college on August 22, 2017. Eminent speaker and finance expert from Bajaj Capital – Mr. Kushal Bhateja chaired the session by explaining about fundamentals of stock market, citing real life examples of pioneers who have made it big in the industry.

### **Workshop on Tally 9**

To impart knowledge about “Tally ERP 9” to students, a workshop was organized by the Department of Commerce on September 19, 2017. Dr. Hem Chand Jain, Vice Principal of DDU College, Delhi University & Chairman, Indian Accounting Association, was the expert speaker. He shared his knowledge about Tally ERP. Around 120 students participated in the workshop and gained knowledge about this software.

## **Participation of Commerce Department in Annual Sports Day**

Aditi Mahavidyalaya celebrated its annual sports day on February 6, 2018. It was a day filled with fervour and excitement experienced by one and all amidst thrills, shrills and cheers. The chief guest of the day was Mr. Jagseer Singh. 12 teachers participated in Shot put in which all the 1st, 2nd and 3rd prizes were won by commerce department teachers Dr. Nitu Dabas, Ms. Lovely and Dr. Sunita Dahiya respectively. Also, in Javelin throw, Commerce department Teacher-In Charge-Dr. Nitu Dabas won 1st prize. The B.Com (Hons) -1st year students Tulsi, Megha, Renu and Nishu stood first in Chess.

## **Industrial Visit to NSIC Okhla**

The students of Department of Commerce made a visit on February 9, 2018 to NSIC Incubation Center-Okhla. NSIC provides necessary facilities for the prospective entrepreneurs and start-up companies to learn about product manufacturing processes coupled with technology development, business development etc. under one roof. Approximately 60 students of Final Year went to the Incubation Center of NSIC and got insight into the various manufacturing processes which is the basis to start a small scale business.

## **Vaniyam 2017-18**

### **Public Speaking: Tips and Techniques**

In the Commerce fest Vaniyam 2018, a special lecture on “Public Speaking: Tips & Techniques” was delivered by Mr. Ravi Manoram, TIMES group on February 21, 2018. The lecture was aimed at removing the fear of public speaking from students and how they can become good and confident speakers. After the lecture, there was an interactive session with students in which they raised their concerns and queries about public speaking, which were effectively addressed by the speaker.

### **Business Quiz**

The event of Business quiz was organized on the first day of commerce fest Vaniyam 2018 on February 20, 2018. The event commenced with registration at 9:00 AM. In all there were four rounds in the Business Quiz. There were 26 teams of 2 participants each.

### **Human Ludo**

On February 20, 2018 Department of Commerce organized “Human Ludo” in college sports ground as the theme for the day was “Sports for all.” 12 teams of 5 students each participated in it.

### **Kho – Kho**

On February 20,2018, Department of Commerce organized “KHO-KHO” for the commerce department students. Total 4 teams participated in the Kho-Kho.

### **Practical Application of G.S.T. & Budget**

On February 20,2018, the Department of commerce organized lecture on “Practical application of goods and service tax & budget.” Dr. S.B. Rathor, (Associate Professor in Shyam Lal College) was the resource person for this event. Dr. Rathor explained the legal provisions of GST & propagating concept of “one nation-one tax.” Dr. Rathor also told about changes in income tax slabs and provision and PAN number, TAN number etc. This lecture enriched the knowledge of students and the faculty members.

Ms. Vanijayam Contest was conducted for the students of commerce. It involved ramp walk contest and talent hunt. Various titles were given to the students of first year and final year.

In the Art Galleria Event, the theme was “Best out of Waste” where the students were given 60 minutes time to prepare an eco-friendly product using only waste materials. Around 19 teams participated, where some participated as individuals and some in teams of 2 or 3.

The event of Business START-UP was organized on the third day of commerce fest Vanijyam 2018 on February 22, 2018. There were 9 teams of 4 participants each.

### **Career counselling session by Ex Student of Commerce Department - Ms Manisha (Branch Manager, SBI)**

Department of commerce organized a special session on February 22, 2018 on career counselling by Ms. Manisha, Branch Manager of SBI. She gave abundant information to the students about the opportunities in banking sector. She discussed how students need to prepare and groom themselves for the entrance examination and interviews in the banking sectors.

## DEPARTMENT OF GEOGRAPHY

A training program on “Q-GIS” was held on every Saturday in the month of February, 2018. In this program, 25 students selected from B.A. (Hons) Sem. VI participated. The training programme was conducted by Associate Prof. Daljeet Singh, Swami Shradhanand College, University of Delhi and his team, who motivated the existing batch of students.

The department hosted its Annual extravaganza—GEO–FEST with the theme “Sustainable Tourism for Development” on February 9, 2018. Prof. Kaushal Kumar Sharma (CSR/SSS/JNU) gave a thought-provoking talk on 'Village Tourism in India.' The program also incorporated various inter-college competitions like quiz, geographical antakshari, treasure hunt, face painting, oh my globe and other surprise events.

The department, in collaboration with the Art of Living, organized a five day “Youth Empowerment and Skill” workshop from March 3-7, 2018 for students as well as various other departmental faculties for a new transformation with better concentration, improved relationship, elimination of stress, confidence building, increased efficiency and much more. On the valedictory function Prof. Inder Mohan Kapahy (member- UGC and Professor School of Applied Sciences) from Maharaj Agrasen University, Himachal Pradesh had graced the occasion. He awarded certificates to the participants and blessed them.

The department, in collaboration with Institute of Photogrammetry and Geo Informatics (IPGI), would conduct a 5-day training program on Arc GIS from March 21 to 24, 2018 in which 25 students will participate.

The importance of educational trips with its enormous contribution to the intellectual as well as social liabilities of the learners was witnessed when a group of 34 students, assisted by three teachers, was taken to Nepal from March 7-14, 2018 for the field work concerning issues related to Tourism Industry in Nepal. The students investigated the study area concerning their objectives. Since these studies form a part of the students' curriculum, it gave a better insight into the topic for research.

In the course of the year, we have endeavoured to maintain wide ranging analytical and practical skills among our students. Our aim to continue to impart quality based education, also focusing upon diverse requirements of the students, will upgrade their intellectual calibers further assisting them for future careers.

## **DEPARTMENT OF SOCIAL WORK**

The academic session 2017-18 began with the three days Orientation Programme from July 20-22, 2017 with an objective of creating an orientation and conceptual clarity regarding the goals of professional course for all the students of B.A (H) Social Work. There was participation and guidance by distinguished resource persons from various sites of social work practice with marginalized groups in order to enhance the knowledge base as well as insight of students about the course. The major themes undertaken during programme were – “Social Work with Tribal Communities” by Dr. Budhaditya Das (Assistant Professor, Ambedkar University), “Social work with Persons with Disabilities” by Mr. Pawan, Assistant Professor, Disability Studies at GTB College, “Issues and Interventions to protect children” by Mr. Shubham, Social Work Practitioner, Child Welfare Committee), “Social Work in Corporate Sector” by Dr. Seema Sharma (Assistant Professor, Department of Social Work, University of Delhi), “Marginalization and Social Justice” by Dr. Shashi Dev (Assistant Professor, Department of Social Work, University of Delhi), “Psychological grounding in Social Work” by Dr. Meena Sawaria (Educational Psychologist and Research Fellow at Ambedkar University), “Social Work in Legal Sector” by Dr. Vijay Pandey (Social Work Practitioner), “Child Welfare and Social Work practice” by Dr. Abhishweta Jha (Associate Fellow, Ambedkar University) and “Social Work with Minorities” by Dr. Preeti Jha (Associate Fellow, Ambedkar University). The specific objective of this programme was to facilitate the transition of knowledge and practical aspect of Professional Social Work – values, ethics and goals to the future as well as current batches in the department.

Students of social work, along with faculty members, attended and participated in various sports, academic and cultural events of SEHER-2017, Youth Festival on October 4-7, 2017, at the Department of Social Work, Jamia Millia Islamia, New Delhi.

Third **NGO Meet** was organized on October 12, 2018 with the sole aim to create the best platform for social work students and practitioners to come together for a collaboration and dialogue with government and non-government organizations to provide effective service delivery mechanisms in social sector. Focused on 'Field work' as the significant component of Social Work, around 150 representatives from various organizations participated in this event. It provided the students with a well-balanced and systematic knowledge to develop critical and innovative thinking processes. The theme for this event was – 'Social Justice and Sustainable Development – Gender, Health and Education' and the chief guest was Shri T.D Dhariyal, Delhi State Commissioner for Persons with Disabilities. Prof. Ushvinder Kaur Popli, Head, Department of Social Work, Jamia Millia Islamia, graced the occasion with her presence as Guest of Honor. This event aimed to inculcate the skills and values of social work profession amongst students by establishing links through various corporate, government and non-government organizations by opening the space of dialogue for social justice in academia.

**Diwali Mela** was organized on October 13, 2018 as an initiative in the form of a socio-cultural programme to provide an opportunity to students to reflect and work upon their organizing, documenting, fund-raising and communication skills required in planning and implementation of cultural events. The theme of Diwali Mela this year was based on the significance of freedom of speech and expression in the democracy through famous poetic notes of revolutionary writer Faiz Ahmed Faiz's 'BolKe Lab Azaad Hain Tere'. Three distinguished speakers from academia and field – Prof. Manoj Jha, Dr. Ravikant and Dr. Anil Chamadia shared their insights on the significance of the freedom of speech and expression, the idea of second chance and also the importance of defending it in the contemporary times. This occasion also had cultural performances by the students as well as representatives from various organizations – folk dance, folk songs, solo dance and group dance competitions. Moreover, there were around ten organizations which also participated by putting their stalls of handicraft items in the college premises.

Nine students and three faculty members attended **Dr. S. Selvam Memorial Debate competition** on October 25, 2017 at Department of Social Work, University of Delhi. In this academic session 2017-2018, it was organized by Development Action Awareness Nationwide (D.A.A.N), Udaipur, Rajasthan from January 7-12, 2018. It is a pioneer voluntary organization that engages with the community, addresses issues related to gender, sexual reproductive health, differences in the body which come with the age and other social issues like caste and religion. They also work for overall capacity-building of youth and promote education and awareness among the youth and other community members.

The Department also organizes career guidance session for the IIIrd Year students every year. In this session we invited Ms. Elika Anand, Ms. Kanishka from the Department of Social Work, University of Delhi and Ms. S. Eeshwara from Tata Institute of Social Sciences, Mumbai as resource persons for guiding the students for their higher studies.

**Pearl Memorial Poster Making competition** was organized on January 30, 2018 in the fond memory of our late student Pearl Gupta. The theme was 'Ek Bharat Shreshth Bharat.' In this event, 26 students from various courses participated by submitting their thoughts in the form of poster. The objective of excursion is to enhance the interpersonal and intra-personal communication and breaking the communication barriers amongst all three batches of the course and the faculty members. It also helps the students in developing qualities of organization, resourcefulness, self-confidence, initiative taking and leadership.

Fourteen students of social work, along with faculty members, attended and participated in National Seminar on “Empowering Elderly in Vulnerable Constituencies: Role of State and Civil Society” at Department of Social Work, University of Delhi, in collaboration with National Institute of Social Defense (Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment) from February 17-18, 2018. Ms. Bhawna, Ms. Mona, Ms. Rishu and Ms. Priya, students of social work first year, secured first position in poster exhibition competition on the same topic.

The socio-economic diversity of our country is the essence and core of its cultural education and with the aim to promote its multicultural identity, Aditi Mahavidyalaya, in collaboration with Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan, M.H.R.D., Govt. of Sikkim, Shri Narayan Sanskritik Chetna Nyas and Shri Chitragupta Trust, organized a Cultural Exchange Programme to Sikkim titled as 'Collaborative Learning from Shared Heritage: Road to Sikkim' from January 22- 25, 2018. The students got to visit various cultural sites like Palzor stadium, Tashi View Point, Changu Lake, Baba Harbajan sahibji's temple place as the last army station before Nathula Pass the boarder

with China, Small scale Cottage Industry of Government of Sikkim etc. which opened those forms of learning processes through which students can encounter, learn and constructively deal with needs of cultural diversity of our country.

All the National festivals such as Independence day, Republic day, Gandhi Jayanti were celebrated with great enthusiasm with the students and faculty.

The Medical Committee had organized a seminar on health and hygiene awareness on September 26, 2017 by inviting Dr. Sunil Thakur, C.M.O., W.U.S. University of Delhi and renowned gynecologist from B.L.K. Super Specialty Hospital, Dr. Shweta Gupta. Dr. Thakur oriented students about prevention and cure of various vector borne diseases like dengue, malaria and chikungunya, stressing the fact that maintenance of community hygiene goes a long way in preventing the onslaught of such communicable diseases. Dr. Shweta emphasized the importance of maintaining personal hygiene among girls and took the session a step further, by counseling them about their individual gynecological queries and problems.

### Workshop on 'Yoga and Natural Therapies; Holistic Approach for Health & Well Being'

The medical committee of the college organized a workshop on 'Yoga and Natural Therapies; Holistic Approach for Health & Well Being' for students and staff members on February 23, 2018 in the college premises. The workshop was coordinated by Mr. Kamal Anand, Acupressure Therapist & Yoga Instructor, Yogacharya Shri Arjun Singh and Dr. Iram Irfan Ali, Psychological Counselor & Acupressure Therapist. Around 250 attendees benefitted by the yoga and natural therapies sessions as a means to achieve better health, peace, tranquility, positive thinking, inner strength and a steady mind. ## **PLACEMENT CELL**
