DEPARTMENTAL ACCOMPLISHMENTS

Department of Education

- Department organized one day special Art and Craft workshop for first year students on February 10th, 2015 by Puppeteer Dr.Parmod Sharma (National Council for Educational Research and Training) about the Effective use of Art and Craft in Elementary Teaching.
- Another workshop and lecture session on 10th February, 2015 by Prof. Atusushi Takei (Department of Advance Practice in School Education, Shizuoka University, Japan) on the philosophy of 'Ba' (Accidental life) and its educational implications was organized for the students.
- Innovative five days school visit from October 27, 2014 to October 31, 2014 organized for third year students at Bodh Shiksha Smiti, Jaipur, Rajasthan.

- Department also organized a full day special lecture series by two distinguished speakers on 'Emotional Psychology and Stress Management' for II and IV year students on Feb 9, 2015.

Department of Commerce

- Commerce department Fest themed on "Challenges in Commerce in India". The debate competition held on the subject "Corporate Governance Vs Corporate Scams". All the issues related to scams and their tentative solutions through Governance were debated by six teams of second year students. Also PowerPoint presentation competition organized where 8 teams comprising of 16 members participated covering various challenges in wide ranging field of commerce. The e-poster competition held with 9 teams and 17 members. A mock G-20 Summit also held in the series events on the fest. The Participants were India, Argentina, Brazil, France, Indonesia, Germany, Italy, Japan, Mexico, Russia, Saudi Arabia, South Korea, Turkey, U.K and U.S. Role of European Member was executed by the faculty members. The bilateral trade agreements also showcased during the fest. The event concluded with developing a website www.amvg20.wordpress.com of the event by the department.

Department of Economics

- Department of economics has organized a poster making programme on February 18, 2015 on the theme Women Empowerment. The department has organized a quiz competition for the students of department on the theme of General Economics.

Department of Geography

- The department started the new academic session with an orientation program conducted on the very first day for the first year students.
- Thirty seven students of B.A.(Hons) Fifth Semester and B.El.Ed II Year, with three faculty members had a field trip to Shillong, Meghalaya from 26th September to 6th October, 2014. Students conducted a questionnaire and observation based field survey in Shillong, Meyallong, Mawphalang and other surrounding areas in order to explore and analyses the occurrence of spatio-temporal distribution with detailed assessment of impact and responses of various multi disasters in the area.
- The geographical society 'Dharitri' organized annual 'Geo-Fest' on the theme 'Save Yamuna! Save Dilli!!' on February 10th, 2015 motivated with 'Ganga Bachao Abhiyaan' initiated by the honorable Prime Minister of India. The technical session focused on the

analysis of the theme 'Sustainable Development in Watershed – A Case Study from Uttarakhand' by Dr. S.K. Bandooni, Associate Professor, Shaheed Bhagat Singh (Evening) college, University of Delhi. The discussion was followed by another presentation on 'Cleaning Yamuna - A Mission' by Mr. Sunny Verma, Deputy Director, SWECHHA -We for Change Foundation, shared insights from his experiences and live demonstrations on how to clean and save Yamuna that will together save the national capital. Part of the fest, various inter-college competitions were organized for the students. It included, Debate Competition, Photography Competition, Poster-Making, Collage Making, Documentary Film making and Treasure Hunt. Students from various colleges of Delhi University like Dayal Singh College, Shaheed Bhagat Singh College, Shivaji College and Swami Shradhanand College were participated enthusiastically in the competitions and activities of the fest. The relevance of the theme also displayed through the Street Play (NukkadNatak) which also enacted in Antardhvani, the three-day annual cultural fest of University of Delhi, which was largely appreciated.

Department of Hindi Patrikarita Evam Jansanchar

- The department started its academic session with the orientation program for the first year students of BA(H) Hindi. The key speakers for the program were Senior Journalist Anil Chamadiya and young writer Priyadarshan oriented students with various aspects of Journalism and communications.
- On the occasion of the 'Hindi Diwas' competitions like self authored poems, speech, photography and debate organized for students of all departments. For orientation of practical facets of journalism and mass media a special lecture series organized which comprised print media, radio, tele-vision, cyber media experts like Arvind Mohan, Sushant, Dr RK Vyas and Swatantra Misra. The film Suraj Ka SantwanGhoda and Play by Mohan Rakesh 'AadheAdhure' specially showcased for students. College's own news paper "Aditi Akhbar" released by department with the invaluable contribution of faculties and students.

Home Science Department (FYUP remodelled)

- The academic year began with the participation of Home Science students in Nutrition Week held at Institute of Home Economics.
- Department organized a survey activity for students to develop in depth understanding on processed food items available in the market and critically evaluate the labeling measures and process of the food product. The training on food exchange list given scope to learn developing balanced diets for adults, pregnant women, lactating mothers, and elderly.

- The students visited NGO's like Ambedkar NGO, Sewabhartimatrixhaya, Sanjay Gandhi Animal Care Centre, SOS children's village, Iccha and Dr. AV Baliga Memorial Trust for getting acquainted and to develop understanding of goals, target groups and the locale in which the NGOs are working.
- In the association of department of Fabric and Apparel Science, 20 samples of cloths made up from different tie and dye technique, further used to prepare 20 folders. Also the training facilitated students to prepare dupattas using different tie-dye techniques.
- The students also took part in the Radio Jockey hunt contest organized by the Antardhwani team, where Karishma and Bhavya won the contest and received prizes.
- Hands on training facilitated on methods and techniques of developing and evaluation of fruits and vegetable preserved products.
- The products developed by the students were displayed under Aditi Foods brand. Various preserved foods like jams, jelly, preserves, pickles, marmalade and dehydrated vegetables were prepared using scientific methods and standardizing techniques. The preserved foods were attractively packed with colourful and informative labels displaying the entrepreneurial skills of students of food technology department. An innovative new preserved food, Papaya jam was successfully developed by the students and was highly appreciated by various eminent visitors at college's good practices stall. Students made their remarkable presence at *antardhavni* by highly appreciated nutritious recipes like oats nachos with hung curd dip and oats lollipops.
- B.Sc. Home Science students participated in 'Nutrition Week' held at (IHE) Institute of Home Economics by preparing dishes using Quaker oats.
- Through community nutrition education activities students learnt to prepare teaching aids like flash cards, flip chart, posters etc.
- The departmental program enabled students to developed skills in the field of food and nutrition with therapeutic nutrition and public health nutrition by diet planning. B.A.(program) students actively participated in making charts and posters on various nutrition related problems like protein energy malnutrition, vitamin-A deficiency and anaemia.
- Students of sixth semester of the department were placed in different child care centres to conduct developmentally appropriate practices.
- The department also organized workshops on preparation of learning aids for the students. The annual program of the department which is on the theme "Celebrating the Girl Child" would be held in the last week of March.

Department of Psychology

- Department of psychology organized a Workshop on Stress Management for students and faculty. The workshop was conducted by Prof. N. K. Chadha, Department of Psychology, University of Delhi.
- Department organized workshop on 'Qualitative method as a tool of assessment in social sciences' by Dr.RenuNarchal, University of Western Sydney, Australia on 20th August 2014. An interactive session was organized as part of the day which had the students interacting with eminent panelist.
- Students of psychology department got opportunity to participated in the seminar on "Gandhian thoughts: A way of living" and National Conference on Mental health: Current Perspectives, Development and Technological advancements, organized at AIIMS, New Delhi. It is indeed a great achievement for the department that four research papers of students have got selected for presentation in the International conference organized by "Indian Association of Positive Psychology" 27th Feb- 1st March 2015.

Department of Physical Education

- The Department of Physical Education and Sports Sciences had organised workshop on "Brain Storming and Persona Magnification" on January 30, 2015. The Expert panellist was Mr.Ambuj Jain from Rajasthan. The lecture, demonstration and slideshow on Mount Kailash Mansarovar, Mount Everest and Markha Valley themed "Adventure Activities for All" organized with support by U.G.C. The eminent panellists were Prof. K.T.S. Sarao and Dr. H.M. Lumb of University of Delhi.
- Department had organised Annual Sports Function on March 11 and 12, 2015. The various events were organised for students along with teaching and non-teaching staff such as musical chair, tennikoit and tug-of-war. Various spine thrilling adventurous events were also organised including rippling, stair climbing and flying fox.

Department of Social Work

- The orientation program earmarks the beginning of every academic session, commenced with six days (21.7.14 to 26.7.14) orientation program which provided opportunity to come into interface with the theoretical inputs and the practice based aspects of social concerns from the experts. In present academic year 160 social work students were placed at 60 organizations.

- The educational trip for third year organized to Society for Social Uplift Through Rural Action (SUTRA) at Solan district, Himachal Pradesh from October 2-5, 2014. It is a pioneer voluntary organization that works for rural community development (micro credit, Gender and equity & life free from violence, promotes women rights in rural India etc.).
- A hand washing awareness campaign was organized in communities and govt. schools of Delhi with collaboration of World Without Obstacle (WWO) organization.
- Ekta Society, a student body of the Department organized 'Pearl Memorial Event' for all the students in the fond memory of Pearl Gupta. Poster Making Competition on "Women Safety" organized on Pearl Memorial Day i.e. January 20th, 2015 in the premises of Aditi Mahavidyalaya. Students of social work Department also presented a street play on Women Safety to create awareness on the different issues related to women safety.
- A one day "Workshop on Disability" was organized on October 9th, 2014 at Pt. DeenDayal Upadhyaya Institute for Physically Handicapped, a government rehabilitation centre and Department of Disability Affairs under Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment for BA(H) III year students. The resource persons were Mr. Akhilesh Shukla, Assistant Professor (Occupational Therapist), Mrs. Meeta Singhal (Senior Occupational Therapist), Mr. Roshan Lal Meena (Physiotherapist), Mr. Rajnish Sharma, Assistant Professor (P & O) and Mr. Mahesh Sharma (ASSO).
- A series of workshops were organized during the period of 2014-15 to provide better visibility and wider net of information to the prospective candidates for various entrance examinations at post graduate level. The first workshop was organized for Tata Institute of Social Science (TISS) post graduate level entrance examinations and interview preparation on November 14, 2014. The experts and alumni were presented to facilitate the training session emphasizing various useful information pertaining to the entrance examination for better achievements. Entrance preparations for Social Work Department, Delhi University and for Jamia Millia Islamia with the support of eminent academicians of respective institutions are inline in the month of April of the present academic session.

Canteen Committee

- The canteen has been relocated to a more conducive place in the college premise. The previously congested cafeteria is now considerably de-cluttered and renders variety of foods to the students and staffs. The food service emphasized to clean and of quality assurance with adequate hygiene. The sufficient quantity of non-perishable food items is also kept. The college has been declared as coke free zone to maintain healthy life style.

- Gandhi study circle participated in Charkha Activity and also attended the Yoga and Meditation classes by Gandhi Bhawan. On the occasion of 'Gandhi Jayanti' cultural programs organized for the students.
- Also the committee initiated 'SwechhaSwachhta Abhiyan' to keep the campus premises clean and beautiful. Skit 'ApneApne Gandhi' presented by BHJ students and 'Ladki Ki Peeda' by B.El.Ed students of college got high appreciation by University and given letter of appreciation by Gandhi Bhawan.

Student Union Advisory Committee

- The committee has been instrumental of successfully conducting the college and University election on Sep 12th, 2014. To exercise democracy, advisory supported and promoted model practices at campus. It's been a vision lending exercise through committee to promote welfare through the elected members on various activities for the students.
- The organization of fresher's party witnessed success through large number of participation of students from all stream.
- "Utsav"- two day literary and cultural extravaganza held on March 8th and 9th 2015. The event was an experience for student to learning of event management outsourcing. The event also marks achievement by marking enthusiastic participation from north and the south campus colleges of the university.
- The weeklong trip arranged for 140 students to Darjeeling and Nepal given an unforgettable travelogue to the journey chapter.

Medical Committee

- Medical committee organized a Blood Donation Camp on August 12th 2014 in the collaboration of Mission Jan Jagriti Blood Donation Center. An overwhelming and record breaking response was received from the college students.

Placement Committee

- Aditi college placement cell maintained its consanguinity with CPC (Central Placement Cell), who showed immense faith in the students for building future leadership. There was a substantial rise in the number of offers made by each company. The list of final selection enormously increased at various niche profiles like content writer, business analyst, digital marketer, and crowd sourcing were offered in line with the changing trends of job market.
- To empower and for providing employable opportunity, the placement committee organized mock interview and group discussion on every Wednesday on a regular basis. The GD-PI sessions arranged by committee facilitated students to crack some major interviews and GD rounds of the companies at CPC. Around 22 students got placements in companies like Genpact, Exl Service, Litchi Knowledge Centre, Engineering Watch and Tata Power Pvt. Ltd. Computer Committee

- Computer committee organized two days workshop on “MS Power Point 2010” on February 11, and 12 2015 for the students of all streams of the college to enhance their presentation skills using computers. A total 69 students got training through the workshop. Presently college is equipped with three computer labs and 120 computers for students.

Cultural Committee

- The cultural committee ushered in the new academic session with the most awaited event Talent Hunt which offered the students a platform to showcase their talent in the field of dancing, singing, theatre and also provided an outlet to their creativity.
- The Independence and Republic Day celebrations amidst great enthusiasm helped to instil the patriotic fervour in the campus.
- The annual event *Vasantotsav* was a grand success with spell bounding performances by the Ehsaan Bharti Ghungroowale group which left the audience mesmerized.

Environmental Committee

- Department of Environment, NCT of Delhi organized event “Ozone Day celebration” on 16th September 2014. The team from Aditi Mahavidyalaya attended lectures on the same theme and the students participated in the debate.
- The signature campaign has been launched on the eve of *Diwali* in which students and faculty members of the college pledged to safeguard environment by celebrating a “Cracker Free Diwali”.
- Committee organized a workshop on “Waste management through Vermi compost and Mushroom Cultivation” on February 11th, 2015 by Dr. Ashok Kumar, Retired Scientist from Lala Lajpat Rai University of Veterinary and Animal sciences. The event was followed by poster competition on ‘Vermicomposting’.
- The committee organized a lecture on the “Waste Management: Waste to Wealth” by Mr. Paras Gupta, from Kalpvriksha NGO on February 14th, 2015. The project outcomes elucidate society position and status of the elderly people in changing scenario.
- 2.) The Delhi University funded project titled "Locating Women in the Context of Partition: An Account of Lived Experiences and Unheard Voices." It is a joint project of three teachers and ten students. An article titled "Unveiling the Layers: A Journey into the Covertures of Women Partition Survivors" has been accepted by Delhi University to be published in the maiden Delhi University Journal. The e-journal will be available for readers in the next three months in 2015.
- 3.) GFATM (Global Fund for AIDS Tuberculosis and Malaria) Round-7 Saksham has organized one Refresher Training for Delhi States AIDS Control Society’s’ (DSACS) Counsellors on Advance Manual. The project is also providing ongoing counselling supervision to the (Integrated Counselling and Testing Center) ICTC counsellors. In extension phase, the supportive supervision is also provided for (Anti Retroviral Therapy) ART and (Sexually transmitted Infection) STI counsellors. A total of 32 supervisors are providing supervision to 125 ICTC Counsellors, 32 STI and 19 ART counsellors in 93 ICTC Centers, 22 STI centers and 9 ART centers of Delhi respectively.

National Service Scheme

- During the Academic session 2014-2015, the major themes of national service scheme activities were themed on subjects Women safety and Cleanliness.
- An orientation program conducted to make familiar students about the NSS activities. NSS volunteers of the college participated in organizing the Student Union Election.

- The distribution of unused stationary and books to the slum and construction site children were some activities which imbibe the NSS core values.
- The Volunteers also initiated cleanliness drive using various IEC (Information Education and Communication) tools in the campus. Swachta Bharat Abhiyan was organized by the committee on October 2nd, 2014 to create awareness and sensitize students towards cleanliness. The event witnessed high participation in poster making, debate and street play competition on the theme “Gandhi Ji’s Swach Bharat”.
- NSS volunteers participated in Paper Reading competition about “Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel” on the occasion of National Unity Day celebration (31st October, 2014).
- Also volunteers participated in “Run for Unity” at India Gate organized by University of Delhi.
- Two NSS volunteers got opportunity to participate in “19th National Youth Festival -2015, Suvichar & Youth Convention” on the theme “Clean, Green & Progressive India” from 8th January, 2015 to 12th January, 2015 at Guwahati, organized by the Union Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports in collaboration with the Assam Directorate of Sports and Youth Welfare.
- Committee organised a Self Defense Training from 14th February, 2015 to 28th February, 2015, where in 48 students got training on defense techniques.
- The UNESCO organized session on Talking Across Generation (TAG), 2015 (The War In Our Minds: Can Education Wage Peace?) on 16th February, 2015 participated by NSS volunteers.

National Cadet Corps

- In the present academic year 55 NCC cadets are enrolled and total strength of the NCC cadets is 112. Total 27 cadets qualified ‘C’ certificate exam, 3 cadets qualified for ‘B’ certificate. During the activities 7 cadets participated in Thal-Sena Camp and 8 cadets participated in Combined Annual Training Camp. 10 cadets selected and participated in Prime Minister Rally 2015 and one Cadet selected for Parasailing in Prime Minister Rally from our college. It is an enormous achievement that 42 cadets participated in Parade for Antardhwani and 15 cadets worked as volunteer for maintaining discipline during Antardhwani.
- NCC unit of Aditi Mahavidyalaya has organized NCC Festival and Rank Ceremony on 20th March 2015. N.C.C. cadets always played role of ‘volunteers’ in each cultural activity in the college. N.C.C. cadets participated in Annual Festival of College by performing ‘Guard of

Honour', Piloting and Parade. Cadets also actively participated in 'Swachta Abhiyan' and 'Ekta Diwas' Rally and parade conducted by the college.
