## ACHIEVEMENTS OF DEPARTMENTS

### Department of B.EL.ED.

The result of B El Ed had been very encouraging this year, students passed with flying colors. Shilpa and Deepali of final year secured 2nd and 4th positions in the University. In third year Ishita and Manisha secured 2nd and 3rd positions in University. Second year student Meenakshi stood first in the University, first year student Pooja Siwatch came 2nd in University of Delhi.

Ms Ishita chugh ,a fourth year student was selected for all rounder trophy for this year. Vaishali Tomar memorial scholarship will be awarded to Ms Ishita from third year, Ms Meenakshi from second year and Ms Pooja Siwatch from first year. Fourth year students completed their internship successfully. Apart from studies they participated in various co curricular activities in college and out side college. Anu ,fourth year student, was selected for paper reading in National seminar in the Department of Education University of Delhi . Yamini from fourth year performed Bharatnatyam at Tanjavur . Fourth year students went to Rohini court to observe the proceedings of court live.

Third year students had workshops in theatre in education with Dr Akhilesh and Manish Saini. They had three weeks of block teaching in M C Primary schools . They went for innovative school visit to Samavesh, in Panna in Madhya Pradesh to see and learn innovative techniques of teaching learning process. Geography option students visited Bajitpur Thakran to study geographical features of the area. Apart from studies students took active part in co curricular activities. Meenakshi won first prize, Saumya won second and Parul Khatri won third prizes in poster making competition on global warming organised by Eco society , Dimple and Kirti also participated in this event . In cartoon making competition organised by NCC Parul Khatri won first prize and Rakhi won second prize, Sonia, Mehak, Anita and Kirti participated in this event. Debating society organised debate on unity in diversity wherein Ritu and Urvashi won first prize, Priyanka (19) and Bhawna won second and Divya third prize. Parul, Sapna and Anjali (45) also participated. NCC organised debate on corruption where second prize was won by Ritu and Divya and third prize by Dimple and Reshma. In poster making on corruption and it's vigilance by NCC Meenshi won first and Saumya won third prizes. Anjali, Ritu, Dimple, Sweta(13) ,Himanshi , Renu, Mehak,

Saumya, Divya and Suruchi participated in a skit on education for all organised by NCC. Saumya and Meenakshi won second and third prizes for poster on differently abled children done by Social Work department. In Republic day Meenakshi, Rakhi, Kajal and Radhika won second prize for group singing . In Utsav, winter festival of the college in the event dance competition (group) Nupur, Riya and Prachi won second prize.

For second year students self development workshops were conducted by Dr Pearl Drego and Dr Smita Gupta where they learnt about themselves their weaknesses and strengths. Story telling workshops were conducted by Ms Jyotsna from Kathamanch and faculty members. Students were told about various techniques of telling a story and how to use it as a tool while teaching in class. Students participated in debate, poster making and slogan writing competition and won first and third prizes. These students visited National museum. They visited slums as a part of core social science component and worked on a project based on these visits. Students attended and participated in sessions and discussions on gender and sexuality. Students participated in various activities and competitions in IPcollege, SPM college, Gargi college, Miranda House, Swami Shradhanand college, College of Arts and Commerce, Ramjas college etc.

## **DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE**

The Department of Commerce, Aditi Mahavidyalaya established in year 1994 offers two of the premium courses of University of Delhi viz. B.Com (Honors) and B.Com (Programme). The Department creates a stimulating environment for the academic growth of its students.

**Some of the important events of Department are as under :**

### **1. Workshop on Tally-ERP 9.0**

Computers have become an important part of accounting because it makes accounting processes faster and more accurate. The accounting software allows businesses to access financial information and generate reports immediately. Tally is one such powerful accounting software that provides a solution to all the problems a real business has to encounter. Single software takes care of all tasks required for enterprise management. In India, and all over the world, 90% of Business Enterprises uses Tally and hence, a working knowledge of Tally is in great demand. Keeping the same thing as a vision, a workshop was organized by the Department of Commerce on "Tally ERP" on 19th August, 2016. The workshop was coordinated by Dr. Bhawna Rajput and conducted by an expert Speaker Dr. Hem Chand Jain. Dr. Jain is known as an accomplished speaker, educationist and a passionate teacher with more than 20 years of teaching experience. There were approx. 160 number of students present in the workshop. The first session of the workshop focused on theoretical accounting concept used in the software. The second session was the hands-on session that made students learn about use Tally software for the record keeping, preparation of bank reconciliation statements and financial statements of business concern.

### **2. Workshop on E-Filing of Income Tax Returns**

The Governments around the world are increasing the use of information and communication technologies to improve the delivery of public services and the dissemination of public administration information to the public. E-filing is one of the most important and advanced E-government services of India. It provides convenience to taxpayers for tax assessments and payment. E-filing also offers flexibility of time and reduces calculation error on the tax return form to the taxpayers. However, Tax filers who are not technologically savvy may find e-tax filing somewhat confusing and cumbersome. The workshop on E-filing of tax return was conducted by Dept. of Commerce on 26th August, 2016 in the College Hall. The workshop was coordinated by Dr. Bhawna Rajput and the technical sessions were conducted by an expert Speaker Dr. Hem Chand Jain. The basic objective of this workshop was to create a better understanding of e-filing procedure in an effective manner. The first session of the workshop focused on creating the awareness of the requirements for filing tax returns and briefing the participants with four important types of tax returns. The second session provides a practical training on the On-line filing of Returns and Incomes and creates an understanding of different utilities for return preparation on e-filing portal of Govt. of India. Around 170 participants attended the workshop.

The workshops on Tally ERP and E-filing were very informative, interactive and knowledgeable. The handouts of the two workshops were also distributed to the students.

#### **4. Industrial Visit to Yakult Danone India Private Limited**

The students of Department of Commerce have made a visit to Yakult Danone India Private Limited- One of the leading MNC in Probiotic drinks on 17 February 2017. Seventy one students of Final Year went to the Industrial plant and got insight of the working of fully automatic production system and its working environment.

The students accompanied by esteemed faculty members of commerce were given a warm welcome by Mr Aadish (PR executive) at the Yakult plant located at Sonapat, Haryana, who introduced the students to the development process of the product and brand through an informational presentation. All were given a sample of the probiotic drink before being taken around the factory. The students were explained about each step of the process that the product passes through before actually reaching the market. Students were amazed by the level of mechanization that was involved in production, the hygiene and safety standards being followed, and were astounded to learn that such a big corporate was successfully managed by only 33 employees including the board. The students put queries related to management, CSR initiatives, and competitive advantage of Yakult, all of which were promptly catered to by the competent officials.

The visit was an enriching experience for the students as they learnt how culmination of discipline with focus and correct application of knowledge could turn an ordinary idea into a great commercial venture. They also learned that best of brands are built in spite of limitations of resources with dedication, perseverance and patience. Towards the end of the visit, the team relished scrumptious local food of the region before finally heading towards the college.

#### **5. Commerce Fest, 2017**

Department of Commerce organized its two-days Annual Commerce Fest Vanijayam 2017. The first day Commerce Fest was marked by five intra college competitions which were both fun and tested the commercial dexterity of students. E- Poster and Ad Mad Show tested the creative skills of students, Salesman of the Year and B- Plan judged their marketing and business skills, whereas Brand Tambola was based on the judgment of mental and commercial alertness of students. Students from various departments of college enthusiastically participated in all the events with the winners bagging attractive cash prizes as rewards.

The second day of the Commerce Fest was organized on 28th February, 2017 on “Investing in Stock Markets in India: Opportunities & Challenges” to enrich and empower the students with academic and technical excellence. The Hon’ble chief guest Prof.(Dr.) Kavita Sharma, Head of Department of Commerce, Delhi University inaugurated the session with the Keynote Speaker CA (Dr) P.C Tulsian. Prof. Kavita Sharma congratulated the department on successful conduct of festival. She was touched by warm welcome given by the college. Dr. P.C Tulsian, Associate professor and Officiating Principal, Ramjas College, Delhi University. Principal Dr. Mamta Sharma in her welcome address dealt upon the need to organize a seminar on stock market so as to create an understanding to investing so as to make financial planning better. Dr. Bhawna Rajput, TIC of the department in her opening remarks reiterated that Vanijayam 2017 would provide an intellectual forum for exchange of knowledge and information in relation to latest developments in the stock market investments in India. Dr. Tulsian discussed various topics from academic point of view as well importance of investing for their financial wellness in future. He discussed various dimensions of stock markets such as mechanism of stock trading the art of investing with practical examples and kept the students engrossed. Dr. Tulsian presented the theme of the Vanijayam 2017 in a lucid manner for the understanding of the audience.

The technical session on Stock Trading Mechanism was addressed by Mr. Ravi Jaiswal, AM, SEBI and Mr. Naveen Singh, AM, NSE. The event was attended by around 200 attendees. The focus of technical session was to create an understanding of precautionary steps required while investing in choosing the right intermediary and products to invest in. The information on investor grievance redressal mechanisms to resolve complaints at an early stage was also provided. Both the speakers emphasized on the need for adequate control measures

in an organization to prevent/curb possible avenues for insider trading.

Queries raised by the participants were also responded by the speakers.

Prizes and Certificates were then distributed to the winners of Vanijayam 2017 competitions by the guest speakers. Vanijayam 2017 ended with a cultural event of JAM SESSION, an informal musical event, for commerce departments students.

## DEPARTMENT OF GEOGRAPHY

The under-graduate community in the Department of Geography continued to be thriving, highly diverse and active during the academic session 2016 – 2017.

In the reporting period, a one day Workshop on “**Skill Enhancement**” was held on 01st September, 2016. On this occasion, two eminent personalities - Dr. M. Mohapatra, Scientist – G ( Services and Head) , Regional Specialised Meteorological Centre, India Meteorological Department and Mr. Arindam Gupta, Lt. Col. Dy. Supty. , Surveyor for Director presented their talks on ‘Global Environmental issues’ and ‘ Redefining the role of Cartography’ topics respectively. Also in the second half, a couple of Alumnae, faring well at their career front were invited for mentoring and motivating the existing batch of students.

The Department of Geography organised a field excursion for 35 students of B.A (Hons) geography and 10 students of B.El.Ed along with three teachers to Madhya Pradesh from 20<sup>th</sup> September to 29<sup>th</sup> September 2016.

The students under the supervision of Dr. Punyatpyapatra, Ms. Sneh Gangwar and Mr. Gaurav Sikka explored organic farming practices in biofarm clusters of Madhya Pradesh.

Our cosmopolitan group of students very enthusiastically attended a Webinar and round table Discussion on ‘**Remodeling Global Cooperation to Address Global Challenges**’ at TERI University, Delhi on 25th Jan, 2017 with our faculty Ms. Sneh Gangwar.

The department hosted its Annual extravaganza – GEO – FEST with the theme ‘**EMBRACE DESI**’ to revive Organic Farming on 07th Feb., 2017. Mr. Pramod Pandey, Director, Agriculture Research & Rural development Society, Delhi gave a thought provoking talk on ‘ Organic Agriculture changing contemporary outlook’. Also there was a practical demonstration on – ‘ Soil & water testing ‘ followed by an interactive session. The program also incorporated various inter- college competitions like quiz, theme based skits, Suduku, treasure hunt, photography and other surprise events.

The department in collaboration with the **Art of Living** organized a five day “**Yes Plus**” course from 8th Feb – 12th Feb, 2017 for students for a new transformation with better concentration, improved relationship, elimination of stress, confidence building, increased efficiency and much more. It was indeed an unforgettable learning experience for all those who marked their presence there.

In the constant effort towards updating and upgrading students knowledge and skills, a one day visit to the **Survey of India Department** was organized on 28th Feb., 2017 , on the occasion of National Science Day where through demonstrations, exhibitions and talks various aspects concerning Cartography were highlighted. Our students along with our faculty Ms. Mamta Arora were immensely delighted to be a part of the event.

The importance of educational trips with its enormous contribution to the intellectual as well as social liabilities of the learners was witnessed when a group of about 50 students assisted by three teachers were taken to Sikkim and surrounding areas from 03rd March to 11th March, 2017 for the **field work** concerning Organic farming. The students under the supervision of Dr. Punyatoya Patra, T.I.C., Ms. Sneh Gangwar, Mr. Gaurav Sikka investigated the study area concerning their objectives . Since these studies forms a part of the students’s

curriculum, it gave a better insight into the topic for research.

A state level Seminar on the theme **‘Askot Arakot Adhiyan : A historical geography of Himalayan Community’** organized by department of Geography, Kamla Nehru College, University of Delhi on 3rd March, 2017 was attended by two of our faculty – Dr. Roshani Devi and Ms. Shikha Yadav along with 6 students.

A special lecture on the theme **‘Scope of Geographic information system’** was organized on 9th March, 2017 for our students by the faculties of Shanti India Geo- Services, Noida.

A workshop cum awareness program on **‘Remote Sensing and GIS Technology’** in association with the Institute of Photogrammetry and Geo-informatics, New Delhi was conducted in our department on 10th March, 2017.

## हिन्दी और हिन्दी पत्रकारिता एवं जनसंचार

विभाग ने इस वर्ष ‘मीडिया के बदलते सरोकार, नई संभावनाओं की तलाश’ (21 अक्टूबर 2016) विषय पर राष्ट्रीय मीडिया कार्यशाला का आयोजित किया गया। सुश्री शीतल राजपूत, श्री राजीव रंजन नाग, श्री राजकुमार भारद्वाज, श्री मुकेश भारद्वाज, श्री अनुराग पुनेठा, श्री राजा रमण जी जैसे वरिष्ठ मीडियाकर्मियों ने मीडिया कार्यशाला व्याख्यान दिए और छात्राओं मीडिया विषयक के प्रश्नों का उत्तर दिया। डॉ. मधु लोमेश, असिस्टेंट प्रोफेसर के निर्देशन में हिंदी पत्रकारिता और जनसंचार की छात्राओं ने अदिति समाचार के नाम से न्यूजलैटर का प्रकाशन किया है। छात्रों की इस पहल का उद्देश्य रिपोर्टिंग, एडिटिंग और सैद्धांतिक आयामों का व्यवहारिक धरातल पर उपयोग करना है। राष्ट्रीय मीडिया कार्यशाला के अवसर पर अदिति समाचार के अंकों का लोकार्पण किया गया।

डॉ. तृप्ता, विभाग प्रभारी, असिस्टेंट प्रोफेसर, हिंदी विभाग के नेतृत्व में हिंदी पत्रकारिता एवं जनसंचार के प्रथम और द्वितीय वर्ष के 45 छात्राओं को माउंट आबू-उदयपुर, राजस्थान (13-19 फरवरी, 2017) ले जाया गया। छात्राओं ने माउंट आबू में विश्वप्रसिद्ध दिलवाड़े के जैन मंदिर, नक्की झील, अचलगढ़ महादेव मंदिर, गुरुशिखर जैसे दर्शनीय स्थलों का भ्रमण किया। झीलों के शहर उदयपुर में छात्रों ने महाराणा प्रताप का स्मारक और संग्रहालय, सिटी पैलेस, वीर भवन, सहेलियों की बाड़ी इत्यादि रमणीय स्थलों में जाकर वहां के इतिहास संस्कृति और विरासत के बारे में जानकारी प्राप्त की। छात्राओं ने शैक्षणिक भ्रमण की रिपोर्ट भी तैयार की।

डॉ. नीलम राठी, एसोसिएट प्रोफेसर की पुस्तक तकनीकी माध्यमों द्वारा हिन्दी साहित्य शिक्षण-स्वराज प्रकाशन का विश्व पुस्तक मेले में लोकार्पण किया गया। डॉ. राठी ने राष्ट्रीय प्रच्य भाषा सभ्यता एवम सभ्यता संस्थान-इनाल्को, पेरिस और विदेश मंत्रालय, भारत सरकार के संयुक्त तत्वाधान में पेरिस में आयोजित अंतर्राष्ट्रीय हिंदी संगोष्ठी में शोधपत्र वाचन किया। डॉ. संध्या वात्स्यायन एसोसिएट प्रोफेसर ने दिल्ली विश्वविद्यालय की वृहत शोध परियोजना के अंतर्गत ‘Development of an educational program to enhance food label understanding among early adolescents Periurban Delhi’ (SANCTIONED AMOUNT RS. 4 LAKH) विषय पर इनोवेशन प्रोजेक्ट में सफलतापूर्वक शोधकार्य और पुस्तकाकार रूप में प्रकाशित किया। डॉ. तृप्ता शर्मा एवं डॉ. मधु लोमेश ने सत्यवती महाविद्यालय में आयोजित मीडिया की भाषा विषयक राष्ट्रीय संगोष्ठी में शोध पत्र वाचन किया। डॉ. विधि शर्मा, असिस्टेंट प्रोफेसर और डॉ. मधु लोमेश ने गैर-सरकारी संस्था ‘वी केयर फाउंडेशन’ के सहयोग से दो दिवसीय अंतर्राष्ट्रीय फिल्म समारोह (17-18 अप्रैल) का आयोजन किया जिसमें विशेष रूप से सक्षम व्यक्तियों के भावआनों और उनके प्रति समाज के नजरिये पर आधारित विभिन्न लघुफिल्मों और वृत्तचित्रों को छात्राओं को दिखाया गया। छात्राओं को उक्त फिल्मों फिल्म की गुणवत्ता, अंतर्वस्तु, समस्या का प्रस्तुतीकरण इत्यादि बिन्दुओं के आधार पर रेटिंग भी की। विभाग की नाट्य समिति प्रत्येक वर्ष पाठ और प्रदर्शन की पूरी प्रक्रिया में छात्राओं की भागीदारी सुनिश्चित करते हुए साहित्याधारित नाटक का मंचन करती है। इस वर्ष भी डॉ. आशा, असिस्टेंट प्रोफेसर के मार्ग दर्शन में छात्राओं ने वृन्दावन लाल वर्मा की कृति पर आधारित ‘झाँसी की रानी’ का श्रीराम सेंटर, मंडी हाउस, दिल्ली में मंचन किया।

## **DEPARTMENT OF SOCIAL WORK**

**The orientation program** earmarks the beginning of every academic session in the Department of Social Work. A four days orientation programme was organized from 20-07-2016 to 23-07-2016. The Department has invited Resource Persons from various Institutions to orient the students of B.A.(H) Social Work. The orientation programme provided opportunity to the students to experience an interface with the theoretical knowledge and practice based aspects of social work from the external resource persons. The orientation programme comprised of sessions like "Role of social worker in reducing gender disparities in society" by Dr. Neena Panday, Associate Professor, Department of Social Work, University of Delhi; "Human Resource and Personnel Management in Social Work Profession" by Mr. Gaurav Rana, Assistant Professor, Shri Ram College of Commerce, University of Delhi; "Human trafficking" by Mr. Subir Roy, SHAKTIVAHINI; "Art of Living" by Miss. Kopal, Jawaharlal Nehru University; "Dynamics of current population change and its challenges in social work profession" by Mr. Mukund Upadhyaya, JNU; "Communication as a tool in social work profession" by Ms. Shalini Panday, Department of Social Work, University of Delhi; "Reproductive and Sexual Health of Women" by Dr. Vijay Prabha; "CSR in the attainment of sustainable development goals" by Ms. Pooja Rani, Smile Foundation; "Career aspects in social work" by Mr. Asutosh Ranjan; "Reproductive health issues, National Rural Health Mission by Ms. Taruna and her team. Other sessions on Introduction to Professional Social work, Report Writing Skills, Observation Skills, Field work practice were taken by the in house faculty members of Department of Social Work. On 22-07-2016 students were taken to SOS village (Children's Home) for observational visit. All sessions were indeed informative, interactive and provided a great learning experience to the students of B.A. (H) Social Work.

**Excursion** is a part of orientation programme. It provides an opportunity to the students for personality development. The objective of excursion is healthy interaction among teachers, freshers and senior students. It also helps the students in developing qualities of organization, resourcefulness, self-confidence, initiative taking and leadership. On 7th September, 2016 the whole department went on excursion to Lodhi Garden, New Delhi. The students had organized many activities which helped in healthy interaction among all the students and also sharpen their skills in team spirit, interpersonal communication, and program planning and organising.

**The educational trip** is a part of curriculum which is organized every year for B.A. (H) Social Work, third

year students. In this academic session, it was organized from October 17-20th, 2016 to JAGORI Rural Charitable Trust at Dharamshala, Himachal Pradesh. It is a pioneer voluntary organization that engaged with the community, addresses all forms of discrimination based on gender, class, caste, religion, disability and all other forms of social exclusion. They seek to protect the individual and collective dignity of the most marginalized. Also focuses on rural community development especially for voices of Women (micro credit, Gender and equity & life free from violence, promotes women rights in rural India etc.).

## **ACHIEVEMENTS OF COMMITTEES, SOCIETIES AND CLUBS**

### **Placement Cell**

In academic year 2016-17, under convenership of Dr Hema Gupta, the cell scaled new heights with final year students from all departments of college registering with the CPC, and opting for inter disciplinary vocations. To increase self confidence of students, the cell had organised a seminar on public speaking and effective communication skills by inviting Dr Pooja (Associate Professor, English Department, Aditi Mahavidyalaya, DU) and Mr Amit Karnani (Times Foundation) as keynote speakers. To improve oratory skills, a 'Personality Development and Group Discussion' session was organised on special request of students who had appeared for interviews and faced the problem of orientation in GD rounds. The cell had invited Mr Nikhil Kamra (GD Expert, Times Foundation) and Mr Sanatan Tiwari (Assistant Professor, Commerce Department, Aditi Mahavidyalaya) to share valuable insights on how to crack the GD round successfully. The experts arranged mock GD rounds on latest topics of commercial relevance for students to provide them hands on experience of the same. The ITS, Ghaziabad had organised a short selection quiz for students for the grand inter college 'Young Talent Quiz' competition to be held at Ghaziabad, inviting top 10 performers for higher inter college rounds at their campus. One of our participants reached the final round competing with quiz masters of other colleges after successfully clearing four previous rounds. The cell had organised a 2.5 hour online examination of students of final year of social work department as the first selection round of placement by the Tata Power Ltd. Seven students were able to clear the first round, after which four of our students (Rupal, Pallavi Sagar, Sakshi and Ritika Gola) were successfully placed as Junior Trainees in the organization, with selection of one more student (Aakanksha) kept on hold. All four selected candidates shall be joining the company on completion of final year examination. This year cell has been successful in placing and exposing students to interviews conducted by numerous prestigious companies like Wipro, Vivo, Naviga8, Vistara, BT Global services, Forex Pvt Ltd., Step by Step School, DPS Mohan Nagar, Head Start Education, Azim Premji Foundation, MBD Group, Amazon, Vigour Mobile India Pvt Ltd., Pride Plaza group of hotels etc. , with job profiles ranging from academics, marketing, finance, CSR, accounting, content writing to hospitality. The number of students appearing for the selection interviews and student selection rate has increased considerably in the current year due to dedicated efforts of our volunteers, all of whom have been awarded with certificates for their sincerity and hard work.

### **Skill Development Cell**

Skill Development Cell has played a pivotal role in industrial grooming of girls so that they can be assured of a secure future, as can be witnessed from placement assistance that has been granted to three of our students who completed their graduation and Mutual Fund Agent (MFA) course in August 2016. The cell essays role of a mentor which nurtures latent potential of students and empowers them to live up to their professional dreams, as we are proud of another student who cleared MFA course and is working in insurance sector (part time) with the LIC of India, along with pursuing regular college degree. The skill development cell has successfully completed its 1st batch of 43 students who have been trained for 100 hours in 'Mutual Fund Agent' course, launched as per MOU signed between University of Delhi and National Skill Development Corporation, under PMKVY . The scheme is an initiative of 'Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship' to provide skill oriented training to students. We take pleasure to convey that Aditi Mahavidyalaya is one of the first three colleges of University of Delhi which started the Mutual Fund Agent course for professional empowerment of girls in year 2015-16. To provide exposure to real time work environment and instill confidence in students, they were made to visit the manager (bank/ finance) of various private and public sector banks such as the ICICI Bank, PNB, SBI etc. to seek information related to mutual funds and exam was conducted by CII as an external examiner in month of August 2016.

### **25th January 2017 -**

The current year witnessed convocation ceremony of the MFA batch with certificates distributed by honorable MLA (Bawana) Shri Udit Raj. Under the same MOU we had initiated three such courses in 2016-17 also namely,

1. Mutual Fund Agent (Banking, Financial Services, Insurance Sector)
2. Associate Customer Care (Non Voice) (IT Sector)
3. Travel Consultant (Travel and Tourism) which unfortunately could not be started due to lack of minimum student registrations required to make a batch.

### **30th March 2017 -**

The committee in collaboration with IT committee of college had organized a one day seminar on 'Online preparation for bank PO exams' with Dr Naina Hasija (Associate Prof. , Commerce, Kalindi College, DU) and Ms Upasna Agarwal (President, Medhavi Sindhu Srijan Organization) as keynote speakers. The event presented students of final year with a great opportunity as top 30 performers in a selection exam would get access to free coaching for preparation of the bank PO exam. The event was greatly welcomed by students of in final year of college aspiring to make a career in banking sector, who gathered in huge numbers to take benefit of the same.

### **7th April 2017 -**

To enhance skill set of students, cell had organized a special lecture on 'Massive Open and Online Courses(MOOC's)' in collaboration with the IT committee of college, by inviting eminent speaker Dr Gurpreet Singh Tuteja (Dean, Student Welfare, University of Delhi) to educate about various courses provided under the umbrella of MOOC's. The seminar exposed all faculty members and students to new vistas of academics through which working professionals and students can upgrade their knowledge by enrolling in numerous online short term and long term programs.

To develop digital literacy among students and encourage them to test their digital skills, the skill development cell in collaboration with IT committee of college conducted an online digital exam of 30 minutes as a part of 'ICDL Digital India Challenge - 2017'. On successful completion of the first round, winners shall be competing against other nationwide winners in the second round (semi finals). The finalists shall get an opportunity to fly to Singapore to compete with Asian semi finalists, and the final winner shall be offered International Student Exchange Program at ICDL's cost.

## **Admission Grievance Committee**

In year 2013-14, according to University directives College constituted its first ever committee to look into the grievances related to subject combinations and cut offs and other related issues... This year (16-17) in the convenorship of Dr.Archana Sawshalya, college received a grievance in third cut off list where the category certificate (SC) was mentioning incorrect (spelling error) name of the parent. A clarification was sought from the university and accordingly, the student was given admission in B.A.Programme

## **Students Grievance Redressal Mechanism**

As per the directives of U G C, college constituted Students Grievance Redressal Mechanism in the college to deal with the grievances of students, relating to any kind of harassments, failure in providing quality education, and failure in discharging professional responsibilities.
