BEST PRACTICES

The Primary goal of practice is to promote all-round holistic growth of students to develop them into leaders and visionaries of tomorrow. To meet the above mentioned goals, students were provided with the following opportunities.

- 1) Cultural Exchange Programme with Sikkim: A cultural exchange programme between Directorate of Primary Education (Samagra Siksha Abhiyan, H.R.D.D., Sikkim) and Aditi Mahavidyalaya, University of Delhi was organised under EK BHARAT SHRESHTA BHARAT initiative. A team of 21 students and 5 teachers started their journey to this 100% organic and divine place and deboarded at New Jalpaiguri. We first stopped at and explored Jorethang and more of west Sikkim later.
- **2) Empanelment of Food Technology:** Aditi Mahavidyalaya with FSSAI as training partner. A training and certification course on food safety awareness 'Basic Manufacturing' organised by Food Technology Department. Where 4D students were trained as Food Safety Supervisor.

3) Field Visits and Educational Trips:

- i. 32 visited to Vidya Bhawan Society, Udaipur from 29th November, 2019 to 3rd December, 2019 to understand the innovative practices in school education, where students observed the schools in varied socio-cultural context.
- ii. Department of Geography organised a long excursion for 56 B.A. Hons Geography and B.El. Ed. Students to Kerala. The main aim of the field work is to develop experience of field research, data collection, using of field instruments and conducting survey and observation. Students investigated the area, local community as well as tourists concerning to their specific objectives related to disaster management and medical tourism.
- iii. The rural camp was organised by Social work department at Social Centre for Rural Initiative and Advancement (SCRIA), Khori, Haryana. In this period students learned about the gender equality, community management and self livelihood.
- iv. Department of Food Technology has organised a Industrial visit to Parle-G on 31st August, 2019.

CONFERENCES AND SEMINAR

1. UGC SPONSORED NATIONAL CONFERENCE ON "REVAMPING HIGHER EDUCATION FOR GIRLS IN INDIA BY EXPLORING POSSIBILITIES THROUGH TRADITIONAL AND INNOVATIVE TEACHING TECHNIQUES-BETI BACHAO BETI PADHAO PERSPECTIVE" – 2019

The Government initiative to increase the number of Institutions of higher education for giving opportunity to more and more marginalized sections of society is indeed an important opportunity for such instititutions to reach out to women belonging to different socio-economic strata of society for imparting higher education which ensures better employment possibilities. To strengthen the Government's endeavour to provide access to higher education clubbed with skill enhancement educational programmes to every women, Aditi Mahavidyalaya (University of Delhi) in collaboration with CPDHE(University of Delhi) took a very promising initiative by organizing an UGC Sponsored National Conference on 'Revamping Higher Education for Girls in India by Exploring Possibilities through Traditional Innovative Teaching Techniques- Beti Bachao Beti Padhao Perspective' on 28th August, 2019 at CPDHE(University of Delhi). The Conference offered an important forum for academicians, higher authorities of Government, NGOs and research scholars from across the country to exchange their research and experiences that empowers women for high performance in professional and domestic sphere. The Conference was participated by more than 200 delegates from all over the country. The organizing committee of the conference was comprised of Prof. Mamta Sharma, Principal &Conference Convenor, Dr. Bhawna Rajput, Co-Convenor & Conference Organizing Secretary, Dr. Nalini Singh, Co-ordinator and members Dr. Santosh Kumar Yadav, Dr. Baldev Gulati, Dr. Manish Vats, Dr. Sunita Dahiya, Dr. Neetu Malik, Ms. Sneh Gangawar, Dr. Parul Chopra and Dr. Ritu Khatri.

 Session I (Inaugural Session): The inaugural session was graced by the presence of Dr. Nita Choudhury, IAS, Rtd. Secretary, Member, Central Administrative Tribunal, New Delhi, Prof. Geeta Singh. Director, CPDHE(University of Delhi), Prof. Pamela Singla, Department of Social Work, University of Delhi, Dr. Sunil Thakur, CMD, WUS, University of Delhi, Prof. Mamta Sharma, Principal, Aditi Mahavidyalaya and Dr. Bhawna Rajput, Conference Organizing Secretary. The conference began with the welcome address by Prof. Mamta Sharma. Dr. Sharma made the audience aware about the series of initiative launched by Aditi Mahavidyalaya to create sensitization towards the holistic development of women as she nurtures child, nature, culture and family as creator, generator and transformer of life. In the opening remarks for the conference, Dr. Bhawna Rajput highlighted the need for an inclusive approach of innovative teaching techniques and better gender norms in the society for the greater access of women to the higher education. The Chief Guest of the inaugural session, Dr. Nita Chaudhury in her Keynote address applauded the efforts of Aditi Mahavidyalaya as role model for providing technical skill to the marginalised women. She advocated the need for extending help to the villages by the educational institutions for the development of employment opportunities within a village like vegetable and home made food items production and marketing. The Guest of Honour, Prof. Geeta Singh delivered a very inspiring speech, in which she described women as an embodiment of divine power of mother goddess who possess untapped potentials in all the fields of knowledge and skill. Another Guest of Honour, Prof. Pamela Singla, laid emphasis on the need to look around good practices which protect and educate women in true sense.

Session II (Technical Session): The session II based on the theme, 'Higher Education for Girls in India: Policies and Practices' proved to be an effective panel discussion amongst academicians and Executives of NGOs who have extensively worked towards bringing quality skill based education for girls in India. The session was chaired by Prof. Namita Ranganathan, Head and Dean, Department of Education, University of Delhi. Prof. Ranganathan focussed on the issues of bringing higher education for women through innovative teaching practices and how education can change the women's role in the society. Mr. Ashok Kumar, Executive Director of Dr. A.V. Baliga Memorial Trust gave a talk on the theme entitled 'Educating to Empower Women for Developmental Revolution'. Mr. Kumar's main thrust was on the issue of protection of women through education of women. Ms. Reena Banerjee, Secretary, Nav Srishti, talked about her experiences with a presentation entitled 'Education and Women Empowerment'. Ms.

Banerjee highlighted over the efforts of the NGD, Nav Shristi towards educating girls from more than 2 decades and how the girls have been empowered by skill based training programmes. Ms. Sushma Kakroo, Sr. Counsellor, SOS Children's Villages of India in her presentation entitled 'Women's Empowerment: Education as a tool for achieving equality' discussed the issues of gender inequality which can only be solved by empowering women through education.

- Session III (Research Paper and e-Poster Presentations): After the fruitful discourse on the
 policies and practices related to women education by technical experts, 43 presentations of
 research papers and e-posters were made by the scholars of different disciplines. The session
 was Chaired by Prof. Neera Narang, Department of Education, University of Delhi and CoChaired by Dr. Sanjoy Roy, Associate Professor, Department of Social Work, University of Delhi.
- Session IV (Valedictory Session): The Valedictory session was presided by Ms. Pinki, Additional Session Judge, Tis Hazari Court, Delhi. In her Valedictory speech, Ms. Pinki stated that the time for girls matching men step for step is now over. It's time, girls should move ahead and show the way to the world. She also advocated for the need to give right education to women and men so that the norms of gender equality can be maintained in the society. In this session, Delhi Police representatives Ms. Deepika and Mr. Anupam Bhushan were invited to make the audience aware about the Himmat Mobile Phone App which can be effectively used by the women for their safety. The valedictory session was also blessed with the words of wisdom by Mr. Jal Singh Rana, former Chairperson, Aditi Mahavidyalaya and Dr. Gajendra Singh, Associate Professor, Department of African Studies, University of Delhi. The Conference achieved a significant success by bringing together research findings, experiences and vision of the experts of different fields to sensitize the issue of providing higher education to women of different sections of society through traditional and innovative teaching practices and thereby enhancing their role in the nation building.

DEPARTMENTAL ACTIVITIES

DEPARTMENT OF B.EL.ED

Yet another eventful year for the department of Education (B.El.Ed). The first and the second positions of the university were bagged by the 4th year B.El.Ed. department students, Ms. Pooja Siwach and Ms. Shikha Sehrawat. The fourth year students began their school internship program in August 2019 and completed their middle school internship in December 2019. Different workshops were conducted by many experts from different fields. For the first year students, the craft and theatre workshops were held and the students gained experience and learned new ways of transacting with in the group. Ms. Harpreet and Mr. Manish were the resource persons for these workshops. The students also completed their school contact program successfully where theatre activities were performed on the last day of their visit. The B.El.Ed. 2^{nd} year students completed their story telling sessions with experts from different organizations like "Talent hunt" and guests like Dr. Prachi from Gargi College (D.U) was also invited over to deliver special lectures on story telling. For self-development workshops, Dr. Pearl Drego from Tacet Academy and Mr. Gaurav Prakash conducted the self development sessions for the students and students benefited a great deal from these sessions. The 3rd year students completed their innovative school visit in the month of January 2020 from 14th to 17th, whereby they visited Mirambika Free Progress School, Sri Aurobindo Ashram, New Delhi, for their observations. The 3rd year theatre workshops were conducted by Mr. Himmat Singh Negi a renowned theatre personality. The third year successfully completed its block teaching module in the month of November, 2019.

The B.El.Ed. 2nd year students participated in events organized by the students in the Gargi College Annual B.El.Ed. Department fest titled, "Being a teacher: to know and to be," which was held on 26 Sep 2019 on their campus.

The Department of Education (B.El.Ed.), celebrated the National Education Day on the 11th of November 2019. The staff and students of the department participated in the programme with much zeal and enthusiasm. The principal of the college Prof. Mamta Sharma presided over the program and congratulated the faculty and students for their wonderful performances. She addressed the students and told them about the importance

of this day and why it was celebrated. Also, she discussed the importance of knowledge and requested the faculty members to initiate an "Education Conclave" in the college in order to discuss the new education policy and its relevance.

The students from different years of B.El.Ed performed beautifully. There was a yoga performance by Ms. Sonam Ekka, from the B.El.Ed. 1st year followed by the Kathak dance by Ms. Khushbu of 4th year B.El.Ed. There was a play enacted by the B.El.Ed. 2ndyear students "Ladki Padh Kar Kya Karegi." It highlighted the importance of education of girls. Ms Vidhi from 2nd year B.El.Ed. recited a poem on education written and composed by her. There were group and solo dance performances by students.

Science Society and Department of Education organized 4 days Seminar cum workshop for B.El.Ed students from Jan 7 to Jan 10, 2020 on the Theme – Women, Science and Teacher Education. The programme began with a keynote address on the theme by Prof Anita Rampal (Former Head and Dean, Faculty of Education, University of Delhi, Delhi). She highlighted the role of women scientists in contribution towards scientific knowledge and research by using examples of Marie Curie and Rosalind Franklin. In her address she drew examples from indigenous knowledge by mentioning that scientific knowledge is not limited to institutes. It is there in our daily life practices by using how traditional knowledge of cure of chicken pox was there even before Edward Jenner discovered it.

The panel discussion with panelist Prof Gurjeet Kaur (Jamia Millia Islamia) and Dr Kalyani Akalamkam (Lady Shri Ram College for Women, University of Delhi) was organized on Jan 8th, 2020. Both the panelists built the perspectives on why there are fewer women scientists and how women find science alienated. They shared data and examples of women discrimination in Higher Education in Science. Further, they discussed how teachers and pre service teachers bring change in their pedagogic strategies to bridge the gap between science and women. On that day another special lecture of Prof Vandana Saxena (Department of Education, CIE, University of Delhi, Delhi) was organized. Her talk focused on gender representations in textbooks and pedagogy-based research evidence to bring gender equity in Science Education.

Ms Nisha Sharma, (an Alumna of the college) TGT Science with Directorate of Education, Delhi conducted a Lecture cum Demonstration with students on Jan 9th, 2020. She demonstrated classroom

activities for number of scientific concepts like acid – base indicators, magnets and magnetic lines of forces, light – reflection and refraction.

Three workshops on the topics from Physics (Static Charge, Current flow and Electricity), Chemistry (Matter – Solid, liquid and Gas; Electrolysis and electricity conduction in salts) and Biology (Digestion, Nutrition and Respiration) were organized on 7, 9 and 10th Jan, 2020. The resource persons for the workshops were Ms Anshumala Gupta, Mr Vikas Saini and Mr Hitesh Khatwani from the Joy of Learning Foundation. During these workshops students had hands on experience of number of activities in science. In the event poster-making competition and quiz competition on the theme of the seminar were organized by the student body of Science Society (Ms Ojsvi, Ms Muskaan and Ms Priya from B.El.Ed. IVth year). For the Poster Making Competition students were given an hour to make poster on A3-size paper. The winners of the competition were:

Dr Subhash Chander from Department of Education (CIE), University of Delhi, Delhi delivered the valedictory address for the seminar. He raised few concerns for pre-service teachers (B.El.Ed. students) like removing 'fear of science' and encouraging the skill of 'asking questions' among children at primary and elementary school levels. He appreciated the efforts of students and teachers of the department for organizing mega event on the theme.

On the 21st January 2020, a workshop for the 3rd year students was organized on "Stories as stimulating agents in understanding Mathematical concepts" by Katha Manch, with the aim to teach students as to how stories could be used as pedagogical tools.

On the 30^{th} of January 2020, the Geography option students from B.El.Ed. 2^{nd} year went for their field survey to Rithala Sewage Treatment Plant, Rohini, Delhi.

DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE

Department of Commerce started its new session 2019-2020 by welcoming the new batch of students of B.Com & B.Com (Hons.) on 20th July, 2019 in its Orientation program where all the new students were briefed about the college and career options in the commerce field.

- Recent Trends in Advertising: With a view to provide information regarding the recent changes in advertising, department organized a workshop on "Recent Trends in Advertising" on 22nd August 2019. Resource person, Dr Ruchi Gupta, Assistant Professor, Shaheed Bhagat Singh College, University of Delhi talked about about digital advertising, native advertising, breaking stereotypes and old age taboos in today's advertising era, usage of advergames by brands, customer engagement and story telling concept in the advertising. The session was made interesting by showing advertisements through the videos and PowerPoint presentation.
- Handling Interviews: The Department of Commerce in collaboration with extensive lecture series
 committee organized an interactive session on "Handling Interviews" on O4th September, 2019. The
 session offered valuable insight to the students about the challenges faced by them with regard to
 interviews. Resource person- Dr. Tasneem Shahnaaz, Associate Professor, Department of English, Sri
 Auribindo College, University of Delhi discussed at length about different types of interviews that
 students can come across in future.
- Special Lectures Series: The extensive lecture series committee in association with Department of Commerce and Department of English organized three interactive sessions on 17th September, 2019. First session- "Out of Office: Too stressed to work" offered valuable insight to the students about the problems and stress they may face at work level. The resource person Dr. Vandana Gambhir Chopra, Assistant professor in Psychology in Keshav Mahavidyalya, University of Delhi and soft skill behavioral trainer, made session lively and interactive with a lot of group activities conducted during the session. Second session was about "Cyber crime and Social Media" was conducted by Dr. Rajanikant Verma, Associate Professor in department of Commerce, Zakhir Husain college, University of Delhi. He talked at

length about different types of cyber crimes and how individuals are affected by it. Issues like cyber stalking, spoofing, phishing, bank frauds, email related crimes, hacking, viruses, Trojan attacks and many more were discussed. Numerous tips on online safety against cyber crime were discussed. Third session was about "Enhancing Communication skills" and speaker Dr. Archana Kaushik, Associate Professor, Department of Social work, University of Delhi discussed about assertive and unassertive aspects of communication. Real life examples were given to discuss different styles of communication such as direct-indirect communication and mask communication and how they all are interrelated.

- Advertisement: Economic and Social Aspect: Department of Commerce in association with department of Hindi organized a workshop on 19th September, 2019 on Economic and social aspect of Advertisement. In its first session, Resource person, Dr. Gayatri Verma, Associate professor, Department of Commerce, Laxmibai College, University of Delhi discussed about economic aspects of advertisements such as value of products, effects on prices, effect on consumer demands and choices and effects on business cycles were thoroughly discussed. In the second session, Dr. Vaishali Billa, Associate Professor, VIPS, IP University discussed about positive and negative aspects such as deception in advertising, effect on our values system, subliminal advertising and offensiveness of some advertisements.
- Career after Graduation: Department of Commerce in association with Placement Cell of college organised a special lecture on "Career after Graduation" on O5th November, 2019. The resource person was Mr. Nihar, MBA from IIM Rohtak guided students about career opportunities in different fields after graduation. The speaker talked in detail about available career options such as MBA, Bank PO, SSC CGL, UPSC etc
- "VANIJYAM 2020": The department of Commerce conducted a 2 day Annual Commerce Fest "VANIJYAM" on 12th and 13th February, 2020. On the first day, different events like Business Quiz, Human Ludo, Needle-Thread Race and Tug of War were conducted for the students. All the different programs were well managed by the final year students under the guidance of teacher coordinators.

- Buzz Razz- Business Quiz: The Department of Commerce had organized 'Buzz Razz' a Business Quiz as the inaugural event of annual commerce festival 'Vanijyam-2020'. A total of 44 students participated in the quiz in a team of two, which was divided into three levels. DEPARTMENT OF ENGLISH

The Department of English in collaboration with extensive lecture series committee organized an interactive session on "HANDLING INTERVIEWS". The session offered valuable insight to the students about the challenges faced by them with regard to interviews. The resource person Dr.Tasneem Shahnaaz, Associate Professor, Department of English, Sri Auribindo College, University of Delhi talked at length about different types of interviews that students might have to face in future. She also discussed about what preparations one should do while preparing for Interviews and shared some tips on it that can help students to be more confident while facing them. The session was made lively with role play and handouts that kept the audience engaged and interested. The session offered a platform to the students to share their anxieties and concerns about interviews. The Principal Prof. Mamta Sharma also shared her valuable inputs with the students.

On 17th September 2019 the Department of English organized a session on "Enhancing Communication skills" and speaker Dr. Archana Kaushik, Associate Professor, Department of Social work, University of Delhi discussed about assertive and unassertive aspects of communication. She also briefed students on the importance of communication skills not just in outside world but also in family, friends and relatives. Real life

examples were given to discuss different styles of communication such as direct-indirect communication and mask communication and how they all are interrelated. To make communication effective, it must be clear and direct. She concluded the session by focusing on importance of listening skills and the role take place in effective communication.

An interactive session titled "Opening Horizons to the Third Gender" was organized as part of extensive lecture series 2019-20 with a team of experts from NGO-SPACE in association with department of social work on 24th September, 2019. The Principal Inaugurated and welcomed the guests. The session was attended by B.A. (Hons) Social work students (42). Resource person Anjan Joshi (NGO-SPACE) led the team of four members from SPACE. The session began with understanding the concepts of Gender, Gender-identity, Gender Expression, Transgender, Sexual Orientation, LGBTIQA. The session further focused on the labelling, stigma and discrimination of the sexual minority persons. How because they are not understood and accepted, they are rejected by families, friends and the society. This sensitisation session is a way forward so that the majority population is able to be aware of the existences and rights of the sexual minorities. We need to build a society friendly to the LGBTIQA, so that we are able to have an inclusive society. The students questioned the many myths and misconceptions on gender identity and diversities. Students clarified their doubts and showed interest to work for a gender-neutral society. The students of generic elective greatly benefited from this workshop.

DEPARTMENT OF GEOGRAPHY

The new academic session of the Department started with the Orientation Programme organized for the First Year BA (H) Geography students on 20th July 2019 by the faculty of the Department of Geography.

Our students very enthusiastically attended a one-day GIS workshop and Roundtable discussion on GISas a career option for undergraduate students.Ms.Bratati Dey- Head faculty, Geoinformatics, SwastikEdustart-Geospatial training institute, Vikaspuri presided over the workshop on 30th January 2020. On the same day, a group of 8 students with one lecturer went for a local survey to a Sewage Treatment Plant of Rithala, Delhi with an aim to investigate the post-treatment sewage water quality and the impact of sewage

water on our freshwaterbodies like lakes, rivers etc. A questionnaire had been prepared about the importance, technology and future plans of the plant. Mr. Neeraj Kumar, Junior Engineer, explained the different functions of plant and students discussed different aspects of sewage water management with the hosts. Students learned different facets of environmental management.

The department hosted its Annual extravaganza GEO-FEST with the focal theme inspired by SDG- 6 "Clean Water and Sanitation" from 19th to 20th February2020. For day one, the program incorporated various inter-college competitions like Pictionary, Ad-Mad, Explorer, Healthy shots, Lens attack etc. where students participated enthusiastically. On the second day Dr. B.W. Pandey, Associate Professor and Dr. Subash Anand, Associate Professor, Department of Geography, Delhi School of Economics, University of Delhi, gave a thought-provoking talk on "Watershed Management as a Tool for Sustainable Water Resource Conservation and Management" and "Integrated Solid Waste Management for Sustainable Future Earth" respectively.

In the upcoming days, a local trip to 'The Mughal Garden', New Delhi and adjoining places has been planned in the month of March, in association with History discipline, for a group of B.A.(Prog) III year students with Geography and History Disciple. Moreover, a long excursion for B A (Hons) II- and III-year students has also been planned in the upcoming month. The students will investigate the study area concerning their specified objectives, i.e. Tourism and Disaster Management, respectively.

Counseling for emotional and mental well being

- 1. In face of Covid-19 things have come to a halt and there is an increase in anxiety experienced by some students. For those experiencing any emotional distress the college is providing online individual therapy, from the Department of Psychology viz., Dr Priya Bir and Dr Ritu Sharma.
- 2. As a preliminary measure a 24x7 Covid helpline / counseling cell comprising of senior faculty members and trained counselors from the Department of psychology was constituted and the details along with the contact numbers of the concerned teachers was uploaded on the college website. The aim was to make available to the students immediate help to deal and cope with the stress and anxieties associated with the pandemic.
- 3. Well-being sessions were organized by NSS, Medical committee.

- 3. The stakeholders i.e. the teaching non-teaching staff and students have worked in complete coordination to ensure that all the relevant study material was provided by the teachers as PDF files, PPT's, Assignments / quizzes etc.
- 4. The same were efficiently and timely uploaded by the system administrator on the college website and easily accessed by the students.
- 5. It is noteworthy that the teachers abundantly and conveniently used technology by ways of various elearning platforms like good meet, good classroom, zoom apps, (to name a few) to facilitate teaching and learning and assessment of assignment.

- 6. The online e-library resources were made available to the students.
- 7. Student filling in of the examination forms, payment of fees and uploading of internal assessment was seamlessly carried out by perfect coordination amongst all stakeholders.

ACHIEVEMENTS OF COMMITTEES, SOCITIES AND CLUBS

Alumni Committee

Alumni are the most valuable resource of the college to count the direct and indirect contribution to the college and society. The Principal Prof. Mamta Sharma formally welcomed the guests. She also motivated students by her speech. As a mark of respect in support of the Martyrs of Pulwama everyone observed 2 minutes' silence. More than 250alumna participated in this years' Alumni meet. Number of participants was considerably higher in comparison to last two meets.

On this occasion 20 Alumni of this college working in diverse fields (like banking education media etc.) were given 'Alumina Achiever Award" along with memento and certificate. All the participants were presented with souvenirs on this occasion. It was the proud moment for the college to successfully conduct the third alumni meet. Some of the alumni shared their experience as well as interesting moments of campus life with other alumna and registered themselves for Alumni Association. The college feels proud to see their achievements in working as assistant professor, as politician, as teachers in schools, Delhi Police in the corporate sector, as journalist etc. and also pursuing higher studies.

The event was full of cultural programs and interactions between alumna. Alumni also participated in dance and music. For the successful completion of the event Principal, Prof. Mamta Sharma congratulated all the Alumni committee members. The programme ended with vote of thanks and lunch.

Extensive Lecture Series

- The Department of Human Development and Family Empowerment in collaboration with Department of English and Commerce participated in an Extensive Inter Disciplinary Lecture Series held on 4th September 2019. A special lecture on "Laws for Protection of Children's Interest" was conducted by Dr Anubha Rajesh, Professor, Centre for Early Childhood development and Research (CECDR), Jamia Millials lamia. The major thrust was on the analysis of situation of children in India. The purpose was to study the fact that children are not a homogenous group and their different needs need different responses, especially the multi-dimensional vulnerabilities experienced by children in different circumstances. Against this backdrop, the various policies and laws for children were understood as to whether they have been able to bring about a change. What are the challenges in creating an integrated, inclusive and sustainable approach for the overall and harmonious development and protection of children was dwelled upon.
- The extensive lecture series committee in collaboration with Department of English and Department of Commerce organized an interactive session on "HANDLING INTERVIEWS". The session offered valuable insight to the students about the challenges faced by them with regard to interviews. The resource person Dr.Tasneem Shahnaaz, Associate Professor, Department of English, Sri Auribindo College, University of Delhi talked at length about different types of interviews that students can come across in future. She also discussed about what preparations one should do while preparing for Interviews and shared some tips on it that can help students to be more confident while facing them. The session was made lively with role play and handouts that kept the audience engaged and interested. The session offered a platform to the students to share their anxieties and concerns about interviews. The Principal Prof. Mamta Sharma also shared her valuable inputs with the students.

Special Lecture Series: The extensive lecture series committee in association with Department of Commerce and Department of English organized three interactive sessions on 17th September, 2019. The first session on the topic "Out of Office: Too stressed to work" offered valuable insight to the students about the problems and stress they may face at work level. The resource person Dr. Vandana Gambhir Chopra, Assistant professor in Psychology in Keshav Mahavidyalya, University of Delhi and soft skill behavioral trainer, made session lively and interactive with a lot of group activities conducted during the session. It gave the students an opportunity to study latent stress in their life and ways of handling it. She also talked of effective techniques to manage work life balance. The second session was about "Cyber crime and Social Media". The resource person Dr. Rajanikant Verma, Associate Professor in department of Commerce, Zakhir Husain college, University of Delhi, talked at length about different types of cyber crimes-how individuals are affected by it. He talked about issues like cyber stalking, spoofing, phishing, bank frauds, email related crimes, hacking, viruses, Trojan attacks and many more. As social media platforms become more intrinsic to our daily lives, he also discussed how it has become crucial attack vector that individuals and even organizations can no longer ignore. He ended the session by sharing numerous tips on online safety against cyber crime by using strong passwords, keeping software updated, managing social media settings, strengthening private networks and a lot more.

The third session was about "Enhancing Communication skills" and speaker Dr. Archana Kaushik, Associate Professor, Department of Social work, University of Delhi discussed about assertive and unassertive aspects of communication. She also briefed students on the importance of communication skills not just in outside world but also in family, friends and relatives. Real life examples were given to discuss different styles of communication such as direct-indirect communication and mask communication and how they all are interrelated. To make communication effective, it must be clear and direct. She concluded the session by focusing on importance of listening skills which acts as meditation to a greater extent.

 An interactive session was organised, with a team of experts from SPACE on the topic Opening Horizons to the Third Gender. The Principal Inaugurated the session and welcomed the guests. The session was attended by 42 B.A. (Hons) Social work students. Anjan Joshi led the team of four members from SPACE. The session began with understanding the concepts of Gender, Gender-identity, Gender Expression, Transgender, Sexual Orientation, LGBTIQA. The session further focused on the labelling, stigma and discrimination of the sexual minority persons. How because they are not understood and accepted, they are rejected by families, friends and the society. This sensitisation session is a way forward so that the majority population is able to be aware of the existences and rights of the sexual minorities. We need to build a society friendly to the LGBTIQA, so that we are able to have an inclusive society.

The students questioned the many myths and misconceptions on gender identity and diversities. Students clarified their doubts and showed interest to work for a gender-neutral society.

• An interactive session was organised, with an expert from Alzheimer's and Related Disorders Society of India. The Principal Inaugurated and welcomed the guest. The session was attended by 43 B.A. (Hons) Social work students. The session was conducted in three sections. Firstly, the session began with understanding the concepts and nature of NGD, Civil society, Corporate Social Responsibility, Trust and so on. Secondly, the session further highlighted on concept, needs, problems, care and support for Alzheimer patients. Lastly, the session focused on personal experiences after the screening of a short documentary. Students clarified their doubts and showed interest to work in this area.

Medical Committee

The medical committee of the college organized a **Cancer Awareness Camp** on **August 20, 2019** in association with **B. L. K. Super-Speciality Hospital**. Dr. Jai Gopal Sharma gave an insight into the various cancers affecting girls/women. He talked in detail about breast cancer and cervical cancer. He informed all present (students/teaching and non-teaching faculty) about the reasons causing these cancers, how to avoid them, how to maintain personal hygiene, to get regular check-ups and how to go for treatment if one is

detected with any cancer. Dr. Sharma also answered all the queries of students and faculty. It was a very informative session for everyone present.

The medical committee organized a Health Check-Up Camp on September 24, 2019 in association with B. L. K. Super-Speciality Hospital. The check-ups included BP, Sugar, ENT, Dental for all; Mammography for women above 40 years; Pap smear for women above 20 years and PSA test for men above 40 years. A team of competent doctors and technicians conducted these tests. The doctors included Dr. Jai Gopal Sharma (ENT), Dr. Poonam Gambhir (Pap smear) and Dr. SanchitKumar (Dental). Technicians helped with general and Mammography tests. About 150 faculty members (teaching and non-teaching) got various tests done. Mammography van had been called and 25 women were tested for the test. More than 60 women got the Pap smear done and more than 60 men were tested for PSA. Everyone got their Dental andgeneralcheck-ups done. The Health Check-Up Camp was a great success.

The medical committee organized a **Health Check-Up (Test-Treat-Talk T3)**, **Anaemia Camp** on **October 21**, **2019** in association with **Office of Integrated District Health Society-North District**. Everyone was counselled on iron, protein and Vitamin- C rich foods and following a healthy lifestyle. Test for Anaemia was done on a digital haemoglobinometer. Iron and folic acid tablets were disturbed to all. The focussed beneficiaries of the camp were young girls. The camp was appreciated by all who attended it.

National Service Scheme (NSS)

The National Service Scheme (NSS) is an Indian government-sponsored public service program conducted by the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports of the Government of India. Popularly known as NSS, the scheme was launched in Gandhiji's Centenary year in 1969.15 volunteers were per day available for for helping students to take admission systematically.

An orientation program for all the NSS volunteers was organised on 13th of August 2019 with the motive to welcome all the new students of the college and tell them about NSS. Its objective was to motivate them to start taking initiatives for helping people around them. On 21st August 2019, a rally was held at Shahbad dairy to promote Swachh Bharat Abhiyan. 100 volunteers total participated in it. The main objective of

the rally was to motivate students and people around to know about the importance of cleanliness in our daily lives. In addition to this movement, revival of local water bodies (johad) was also taken up on 19th August 2019. Number of volunteers who participated in it was 50. In addition to this on 10th August 2019 a donation drive was taken up by 30 volunteers for mission education NGO. The students were invited to donate anything related to education to help in the education of poor children.

Another event taken up was a a UGC sponsored conference on beti bachao beti padhao scheme on 28 August 2019 where 20 volunteers participated enthusiastically. Moreover every Saturday 10 students from NSS team visit old age homes spend some time with senior citizens to make them feel loved and revive their life with happiness.

The team also organised a workshop on a prevailing disease coronavirus. The main objective was to make people aware about its treatment and prevention. On 29th January,2020, 30 volunteers were enlightened on the issue by the CMO from North MCD about the disease and its symptoms and also the treatment and the methods to cure it. The team has always been enthusiastic to organise competitions to improve and appreciate the artistic skills of students. In the same regard a poster making competition based on swachata pakwada was organised by 10 volunteers on 30th Jan 2020 on the importance of cleanliness in our life.

Keeping in mind the issues of self safety, NSS organised a self defence training program where 30 NSS volunteer and some NCC volunteers participated to learn the techniques of self defence. The training started from 24th February 2020.

Swachh Bharat Abhiyan (SBA): Swachh Bharat Abhiyan conducted rallies within the college, at Shahabad Dairy and places in and around Bawana to disseminate the information about maintaining cleanliness along with NSS and Delhi Public Library. Students generated awareness about importance of cleanliness, urged people to stop open defecation and shun single use plastic items. The students of Aditi Mahavidyalaya also made posters and wrote slogans on 'Importance of cleanliness'

Aditi Mahavidyalaya also celebrated 'Hand Washing Day' along with NSS. The college students were sensitized about importance of hand washing and correct manner of hand washing. They were also told what

other items can be used in place of soap and how hand washing can help in containing the spread of infectious diseases. They were mobilized to use cloth bags made out of worn out clothes.

Aditi Mahavidyalaya celebrated 'Swachhta Pakhwara'. The students took 'Swachhta Pledge'. This was followed by poster competition. Slogan writing and poem composition competition was also organized. The NSS committee of the college also participated in it. Best posters were awarded by the Head of the institution.

The SBA committee along with NSS conducted a sensitization lecture on 'Spread and Prevention of Corona Virus'. The Chief Medical Officer, MCD, Dr NK Indra sensitized the students, faculty and other staff of the college about causes, spread, incubation period, myths and misconceptions and facts about Corona virus. He also threw light on how to prevent oneself from getting the infection. The students and faculty clarified their doubts about it. They attended the lecture with utmost attention. The lecture was in line to keep students updated about the current issues, concerns, prevention and treatment affecting the health of the individuals. The entire team of SBA expresses heartfelt gratitude to the able leadership (Principal, Prof. Mamta Sharma) for motivating one and all to think, organize, and conduct activities concerning the pertinent issues.

Skill Development Committee

The committee organized four months course on 'Document Assistant' for students and non teaching staff under PMKVY. The students were given orientation about the course which was free of cost for all. They were also informed that the placements will be provided to them in the pay range of Rs 15000-20,000/- on the basis of their competencies.

India Inspires Committee

The committee along with Enabling Unit and HDFE discipline organized two days seminar cum workshop on, 'Creating Divyaang Friendly Environment' and 'Concerns and Potentials of Special Children'. Eminent speakers from National Association for Blind, Overseas Deaf Society, Jambia, professionally acclaimed speaker from Air Force School and CEO and Occupational therapist of a rehabilitation centre were invited to deliver the interactive talks so as to sensitize the students about the needs, concerns, potentials and how to develop an optimal environment, teaching —learning experiences and work culture not only to mainstream them but also to optimize their potentials.

Prize Distribution Committee

Under the Convenorship of Dr. Bhawna Rajput, the members of the committee collected the information about the various academic, curricular, co-curricular, sports events, overall academic toppers in various courses, subject toppers etc and compiled the entire data. Requests for releasing work orders for prizes, certificates, mementoes etc were made. The prizes were segregated as per the level of achievement of the concerned individual in the category. The students and alumni were informed, invited and their consent for participation was taken well in advance for the smooth functioning of the much awaited Annual Day Event. Utmost care was taken while distributing the prizes to avoid confusion, chaos and indiscipline by making proper seating and other arrangements. The members of the committee worked day and night with full dedication to make the event exceptional.

Placement Cell

The Placement Cell of the college works constantly throughout the year to provide variety of opportunities to the students. The Placement Cell is growing with the support of the Principal, teachers and the students volunteer to help the students in securing good professional future. Under the guidance of Convener Dr. Nitu Dabas and Co-Convener Dr. Rajeev Kaur, the Placement Cell has been constantly working for the development of professional skills and competence among girls to help them in fulfilling their career goals. The cell organized its first special lecture on "Discover an Entrepreneur in You" by Mr. Ravinder Bhatia (Assistant Professor, Banking and Finance, Asia Pacific Institute of Management, Delhi) in order to provide knowledge and expertise in the area of Entrepreneurship. Mr. Vijay Kaushik from AlFMR Institute Ltd. discussed about the various career opportunities in financial markets and the skills and knowledge required to make responsible financial decisions in the lecture on "Skill Development Programs on Financial Literacy". Various types of financial markets such as equity market, derivatives, bonds, foreign exchange were explained to make the students clear about the fears of investing in stock markets. Faculty from T.I.M.E. Education Mr. Ananda Mohan, shared his expertise on "How to do well in Group Discussions" and made session interactive by organizing a mock group discussion amongst the students and each of the participant was given detailed

feedback in order to improve their skills. With a view to guide students about career opportunities in different fields after graduation, Mr. Nihar, from T.I.M.E. Education delivered a special lecture on "Career after Graduation". He talked in detail about available career options such as MBA, Bank PO, SSC, CGL, UPSC etc. Institute of Technology and Science (ITS), Ghaziabad, conducted the preliminary round of Young Talent Hunt Quiz' inviting top ten performers for inter college rounds at their campus. 'Tata Power DDL Itd.'conducted online examination for final year students of B.A.Prog. at their centreDr. B.P Singh Public Charitable Trust, Pitampura. The Placement Cell organized a recruitment drive namely, 'Campus Placement and Training' conducted by 'TrakInvestGroup' (in association with Policy Bazaar). The training program provides knowledge and skills to become Subject Matter Expert (SME) in insurtech industry. The program is a mix of online and offline module that guides the students about practical and theoretical aspects of insurance and various technologies involved in driving insurtech industry growth. Mr. Arjun Chakraborti, President and CEO TrakInvest group and Ms. Kiranjeet Kaur, Director business development team (TrakInvest) conducted online interviews via Policy Bazaar for final selection. The strength of the students getting registered with the 'Central Placement Cell (CPC)' of University of Delhi was relatively high in the current year. The students also participated in the various recruitment drives organized by the CPC for placements and internships in reputed companies.

Scholarship Committee

Scholarship committee worked hard in bringing awareness of various scholarships among the students of the college and encourage them to apply online on the E portal within the stipulated period to avail the benefit of the scheme. The objective of such schemes, like the Merit cum Mean based scholarship, is to award scholarships to meritorious students belonging to economic weaker section of minority community so as to provide them better opportunities for higher education and enhance their employability. Committee oriented students time to time and persuade them to apply according to the eligibility criteria. The applicants who met or fulfill the eligibility criteria were approved for the same as well.

Student Union Advisory Committee

Student union advisory committee of Aditi Mahavidyalaya organized a workshop on "Life skill, Motivation, Spirituality and Happiness" on 7th February 2020. Workshop was attended by the faculty members and about 150 students. Session was delivered by invited speaker Dr. Deepak Jain, founder of Vijayash organization. Entire workshop engrossed about developing the life skill to balance past present and future, importance of positivity and happiness in one's life. Students actively participated and had healthy interaction by discussing about world famous leaders and great influencers. Session was followed by meditation session of 10 minutes. Students communicated their positive experience and showed interest to have many more sessions like this in future.

Students' Union Advisory Committee organized a trip to Alibaug and Lonavla in Maharashtra for 28 students and 5 teachers from 20th February 2020 to 26th February 2020. This excursion trip aimed to explore rather new and less commercial terrains of Maharashtra and helped them to learn about the cultural and monumental heritage of the state. Trip initially explored 4 different beaches of Alibaug then proceeded for the geographical area of Lonavala. The troupe halted at Pawna Lake to enjoyed a camping night, slept in small tents by the side of the lapping waters, sang songs, played interactive games; enjoyed live cooking, kayaking, pedal boating and trekking into deep jungle and high hills with the camp leader. They looked at Pawna power generation dam, Tung Fort (kathin Top) and next day visited different points at Lonavla including Lion's hill point, Sunil's Wax Museum, Laxminarayan Temple, Ek Veera temple and the highly famous Karla Caves. The hectic day ended with a dip into the resort's grand pool and a visit to the table tennis facility.

Cultural Committee

The Cultural Committee, in its preliminary meeting, decided to allocate Rs.5000/- to college departments and Societies, that do not receive funds from any other sources to conduct events related to students' development and also hold functions and events within the Committee's scope all the year round. The Committee advised that two or several departments could join hands for pooling of funds and for organising inter-disciplinary workshops or events so as to make it more enriching for students.

In keeping with long-standing college tradition, the Cultural Committee, planned the celebration of the country's Independence Day on the 14 August 2019 and decide to call it Green Independence Day. The Chief Guest for the event was Sh. Hans Raj Hans, the MP from North West Delhi. He presented a motivational speech for students and the college staff. He also planted saplings in the memory of the Indian Martyrs. The principal, Prof. Mamta Sharma also addressed the students about the need for following the several government drives sincerely and presented saplings to the guests in keeping with the green theme of the day. The college flag was hoisted and the Music dept. of the college along with a choir of students sang inspirational songs and presented a Nukkad natak / folk drama . The chief guest, the Principal, teaching and non-teaching staff and students were given the tri-colour badges which were enhanced by face-painting by hundreds of girls. On the occasion, the importance of paying appropriate respect to the national symbols was also conveyed to the students. Most especially the maintenance of correct posture and stillness during the national anthem were emphasised upon. The programme ended with a distribution of sweets (two laddoos per person) to around 1200 girls, guests and staff members. From 4th September 2019 to 17th September 2019, the departments of H.D.F.E. and English, with the help of funds from the Cultural Committee conducted Extensive Inter Disciplinary Lecture Series with lectures like "Laws for Protection of Children's Interest", "Handling Interviews", "Out of Office: Too Stressed to Work", " Cyber Crime and Social Media", "Enhancing Communication Skills" and interactive sessions on "Opening Horizons to the Third Gender" with experts from SPACE and with experts from "Alzheimer's and Related Disorders Society of India". The Republic day was celebrated on 25 January 2020 with usual enthusiasm and fervour. After the hoisting of the national flag, the Principal exhorted the students to work for the country and the community. Prof. Mamta Sharma also conducted the oath for electoral commitment as part of the college's Electoral Literacy Drive. The cultural committee convenor and the stage management team especially encouraged the first time voters to exercise this privilege at the first opportunity. Around 800 students and several teaching and non teaching staff members were part of the celebration.

On 24th January 2020, the Committee also extended resources towards "Sensitisation Workshop on Concerns & Potentials of Special Children" held by Enabling Unit of the college the N.S.S. The Principal inaugurated the workshop. Two resource persons from 2 N.G.O. s namely NAB and Noida Deaf Society had arrived to address

students on topics " Challenges faced by Visually Impaired" and Challenged Faced by Deaf People". The emphasis in the first workshop was on the advancement of technology while the latter was on the decoding and encoding of the sign language for the deaf. All the students participants were awarded certificates.In continuation with the idea of enriching students culturally and also academically, the Committee decide to familiarise students with the current culture of constitutional perceptions and understandings. Therefore, a Panel Discussion titled "Students, Media, Democracy& C.A.A." was conducted by the Cultural Committee on 31 January2020 where Dr. Roshan Lal, an eminent thinker and speaker was the chief speaker. Dr Praveen Garg from Deptt of Botany (Swami Shraddhanand College), Dr. Neelam Rathi, Associate Professor, Media Studies, Aditi Mahavidyalaya also made important points in the two hour long panel discussion. In an interactive session that followed, students were encouraged to make observations and raise questions. Three best interjectors were given certificates. As part of the Government of India drive, the Committee motivated the students to learn and find out more about Sikkim, Delhi's paired state in the Ek Bharat Shrestha Bharat drive. Under the Ek Bharat Shrestha Bharat drive, the Committee conducted a quiz on the cultural, demographical and qeographical aspects of Sikkim.

Debating Society

Debating society provides a platform to the students where they can exhibit their oratory skills on various local to global issues. Keeping in view, Debating Society organized a debate competition in Hindi language on 23rd October 2019. The topic of the debate was "Aadhunik Sandarbho mein Nari Swatantrata ki Prasangikta". Around 20 students participated in the competition from various departments such as BA (Programme), BA (H) Geography, B.El.Ed etc. Students performed exceedingly well and such was the finesse in their thought which made us think that the future of India is in bright hands. Three prizes were given to the winners.

NAAC Committee

The tireless hard work of the Principal of Aditi Mahavidyalaya Prof. Mamta Sharma, Convenor Dr Ritu Sharma, Co-Convenor Dr Neerja Nagpal resulted into submission of SSR (Self Study Report) - NAAC in the academic

year 2019-20. The entire team of NAAC committee had efficiently and effectively worked for the accomplishment of the task. The members of NAAC committee Dr Sunita Dahiya, Dr. Parul Chopra, Ms Lovely, Dr Sangeet Kumari, Dr Annie Ray, Dr Santosh Kumar Yadav, Ms Shashi Prabha, Ms Alka, Dr Manju Goel, Dr Jagmohan. Dr Sheetal Sharma, Dr Roshani, Mr Aneesh, Dr Juhi Batnagar, Dr. Harkesh Kumar and Mr Rakesh, devotedly worked throughout the year and resulted in final submission of SSR. Meetings were arranged periodically throughout the years with team members, teachers in charges of various departments, teachers and non-teaching staff for the collection of data. Aditi Mahavidyalaya invited to the Faculty from KMC (Kirori Mal College), the mentor college for NAAC, where the expert team of faculty members provided the direction and guidance for SSR. Data required for SSR under various criteria's was continuously being collected periodically and finally the composite efforts of everyone ended with the submission of SSR.

Gandhi Study Circle

Gandhi study Circle organized a 'Gandhi Peace March' on 1st October 2019 in the college premises. Students and faculty members actively participated in the event. The Gandhi study organized one-week campaign 'Gandhian Week' in remembrance of Mahatma Gandhi from 25th Jan 2020 to 1st Feb 2020. The campaign included active participation of students in various activities such as speech competition, Swachh Bharat Abhiyan, Bhajan Recitation, Book Reading on Gandhi, Debate competition, Group Discussion on Mahatma Gandhi's teachings, Poem competition and Writing Letters to Gandhi competition.

Science Society 'VigyaanSanjivani' 2020

Science Society and Department of Education organised 4 days Seminar cum workshop for B.El.Ed students from Jan 7 to Jan 10, 2020 on the Theme – Women, Science and Teacher Education. The Programme began with a Keynote address on the theme by Prof Anita Rampal (Former Head and Dean, Faculty of Education, University of Delhi, Delhi). She highlighted the role of women scientists in contribution towards scientific knowledge and research by using examples of Marie Curie and Rosalind Franklin. In her address she drew examples from indigenous knowledge by mentioning that scientific knowledge is not limited to institutes. It is

there in our daily life practices by using how traditional knowledge of cure of chicken pox was there even before Edward Jenner discovered it. The panel discussion with panellist Prof Gurjeet Kaur (Jamia Millia Islamia) and Dr Kalyani Akalamkam (Lady Shri Ram College for Women, University of Delhi) was organised on Jan 8th, 2020. Both panellists build the perspectives on why there are fewer women scientists and how women find science alienated. They shared data and examples of women discrimination in Higher Education in Science. Further, they discussed how teachers and pre service teachers bring change in their pedagogic strategies to bridge the gap between science and women. On that day another special lecture of Prof Vandana Saxena (Department of Education, CIE, University of Delhi, Delhi) was organised. Her talk focussed on gender representations in textbooks and pedagogy-based research evidence to bring gender equity in Science Education. Ms Nisha Sharma, (an Alumna of the college) TGT Science with Directorate of Education, Delhi conducted a Lecture cum Demonstration with students on Jan 9th, 2020. She demonstrated classroom activities for number of scientific concepts like acid – base indicators, magnets and magnetic lines of forces, light – reflection and refraction.

Three workshops on the topics from Physics (Static Charge, Current flow and Electricity), Chemistry (Matter – Solid, liquid and Gas; Electrolysis and electricity conduction in salts) and Biology (Digestion, Nutrition and Respiration) were organised on 7, 9 and 10th Jan, 2020. The resource persons for the workshops were Ms Anshumala Gupta, Mr Vikas Saini and Mr Hitesh Khatwani from the Joy of Learning Foundation. During these workshops' students had hands on experience of number of activities in science.

In the event poster making competition and quiz competition on the theme of the seminar were organised by the student body of Science Society (Ms Ojsvi, Ms Muskaan and Ms Priyafrom B.El.Ed. IVth year). For the Poster Making Competition students were given an hour to make poster on A3 size paper. The winners of the competition were:

Dr Subhash Chander from Department of Education (CIE), University of Delhi, Delhi delivered the valedictory address for the seminar. He raisedfew concerns for pre-service teachers (B.El.Ed. Students) like removing 'fear of science' and encouraging the skill of 'asking questions' among children at primary and elementary school level. He appreciated the efforts of students and teachers of the department for organising mega event on the theme.

National Cadet Corps (NCC)

The NCC is the Indian military cadet corps with its headquarters at New Delhi, India. It is provided on voluntary basis in school and colleges. NCC is a Tri-services organization, comprising the Army, Navy and Air Force, engaged in grooming the youth of the country into disciplined and patriotic citizens. The cadets are given basic military training in small arms and parades.

Aditi Mahavidyalya IGNOU Study center 29061

The persistent efforts of the Principal Prof. Mamta Sharma resulted into the inception of IGNOU (Indira Gandhi National Open University) study center from the academic year 2019-20.

The center has been efficiently run by IGNOU Coordinator Dr. Ritu Sharma, Assistant Coordinators Mrs. Neerja Nagpal, Dr. Harkesh Kumar, Dr. Parul Goel, Dr. Dharmender. There are Twenty-Eight faculty members along with non-teaching staff members Mr. Pradeep Sharma (Accounts) and many others ensured the discipline and smooth functioning of the study center.

There are 2280 Students enrolled in five courses BAG (B.A. in General), MHD (Masters in Hindi), PGDT (Post Graduate Diploma in Translation), M.Com (Masters in Commerce) and B.Com (Bachelors in Commerce) are approximately 2200. And 158 more admissions were enrolled in January 2020 session including Masters in Education. The induction programme was organized under the guidance of eminent Professors Dr Amit

Chaturvedi, Dr Rita Chauhan and Prof. D.P. Singh in which more than 600 students participated. Counselling sessions are being organized on Saturday and Sunday with the help of 28 faculty members. In the coming years we are expecting few more practical based short-term courses which will support our students in the form of additional skills.

Research Advisory Committee

The Research Advisory Committee of the College under the convenorship of Dr Bhwna Rajput counsels faculty members for Research regarding research policies, procedures, and initiatives and explores research collaborations with external researchers, including academic institutions, research agencies both domestically and overseas. During 2019-2020 the committee took the following initiatives:

National Conference on **E-Waste Management and Swachh Bharat Mission** sponsored by University Grants Commission was organized on 10th April 2019 by Aditi Mahavidyalya at Department of Environmental Studies at University of Delhi in New Delhi. The event facilitated opportunities for networking, collaboration and exchange of ideas with renowned experts in E-waste Management & Recycling research and development. Eminent speakers from Ministries under GOI, leading academic scientists, researchers and scholars in the domain of interest with around 200 participants from around the country were brought together to share their expert knowledge, information and best practices, and build strong vision for E waste management. There were academic presentations of research papers and E-posters from scholars from interdisciplinary fields. The souvenir of published abstracts of the research papers of the conference was also released.

To strengthen the Government's endeavour to provide access to higher education clubbed with skill enhancement educational programmes to every women, Research advisory committee in collaboration with CPDHE(University of Delhi) took a very promising initiative by organizing an UGC Sponsored National Conference on 'Revamping Higher Education for Girls in India by Exploring Possibilities through Traditional Innovative Teaching Techniques- Beti Bachao Beti Padhao Perspective' on 28th August, 2019 at CPDHE(University of Delhi). The Conference offered an important forum for academicians, higher

authorities of Government, NGOs and research scholars from across the country to exchange their research and experiences that empowers women for high performance in professional and domestic sphere. The Conference was attended by more than 230 delegates from all over the country. There were 43 academic presentations of research papers and e-posters by the scholars of different disciplines.

Statistical Package for Social Sciences (SPSS) is one of the most user friendly statistical software for researchers providing visualization and data analytical tools. Research Advisory Committee of the college organized national webinar entitled "USING SPSS TO UNDERSTAND RESEARCH & DATA ANALYSIS" in collaboration with ICFAI Business School (IBS) Gurgaon on May 24, 2020 on ZOOM. The webinar provided the participants hand on transining session of visualization and data analytical tools of SPSS. Around 300 participants engaged in the educational institutions, corporate world, public sector, research institution and NGOs participated in the webinar.

Research Gallery

Research development has generally been recognized as having an important role in ensuring that teachers are part of a skilled and up-to-date profession. The quality of research work directly translates to the quality of teaching and learning in the college. Aditi Mahavidyalaya provides a research environment that enables students and teachers to engage in research activities and develop highly valued competencies amongst them.

The Research Advisory Committee coordinated the development of a research gallery in the college to showcase and recognize the various innovative, major and minor projects of the teachers and students that represent an interesting combination of research activities and technological innovations.
