Water Scarcity and Sustainability: A Jal Shakti Abhiyan Perspective

A UGC funded National Conference on "Water Scarcity and Sustainability: A Jal Shakti Abhiyan Perspective" was organized by Aditi Mahavidyalaya, University of Delhi through online platform on 9th March, 2021. A pre-conference activity was organized on 8th March 2021. Prof Pankaj Arora, Director ILL, University of Delhi inaugurated the Preconference events for students and inspired students on foundations of research at undergraduate level. There was an overwhelming response from students about participation in the events planned for students. 329 total registrations for 4 competition- Paper reading, slogan writing, poster making and online quiz. Students were allowed to participate only two competitions through Google classroom. There were independent team of judges for each competition. The conference had very productive learning sessions. It was privilege to start with an illuminating inaugural session with our honourable guests, Mr. U. P. Singh, currently, Secretary, Ministry of Textiles (former, Secretary, Ministry of Jal Shakti), Professor RadheyShyam Sharma, Department of Environmental Studies, University of Delhi and Dr. Shard Chander, Scientist, Space Application Centre, ISRO.

Our Chief Guest, Mr. U.P. Singh, strongly proposed that India is not a water scarce country but a water surplus country and we have lot of scope for restoring water through the traditional water-conservation system and by developing modern techniques for water management. The Guest of Honour, Professor RadheyShyam Sharma gave a very positive motivation by highlighting natural solutions for water security through different approaches and specifically through ecological entrepreneurship. The Keynote speaker Dr. Shard Chander delivered a very valuable talk on the techniques and challenges of assessment of water on earth through remote sensing. His talk gave a specific insight into the issues of water-quality and unequal distribution of water on Earth. In his talk on Water watch from sky shared techniques of remote water sensing and images of Water from Sky.

The inaugural session was followed by a Panel discussion on the theme entitled, Traditional and Modern Water Wisdom: Conservation, Treatment and Governance. There were three panelist in the discussion, Professor Mamta Sharma, Principal, Aditi Mahavidyalaya, Dr. Sandeep Shukla, Scientist, Environmental Pollution Analysis Lab and Dr.AkanshaBhawsar, Scientist, Division of Basic Sciences, ICMR. The panelist took up the brainstorming ideas to address the traditional and modern methods of water conservation and solutions to remove water contamination. The entire discussion strongly indicated towards need for effective policies to protect water in its purest form. The interactive panel discussion gave students an opportunity to interact with experts and learned many facets of the

water scarcity and sustainability in India. Soon after the Panel discussion, there were very vibrant two parallel Paper presentation sessions. It was privilege to have session I chaired by Dr. Daljit Singh from Department of Geography, Swami Shradhanand College, University of Delhi and session II chaired by Dr. Kalyani from Department of Education, Lady Sri Ram College for Women, University of Delhi. The sessions had paper presentations from the scholars of different disciplines which actually emerged as a common learning platform for different disciplines across the boundaries of science, social science, commerce and languages. There were 37 paper presentation by research scholars, faculty from various universities and freelance environmentalists across different states of India.

The main highlighting learning outcome of both the Paper presentation sessions were;

1. Research findings in some papers effectively sensitised on the issues of contamination of water due to many reasons which has direct impact on drinking and sanitation.
2. Some of the papers focussed on the development of the techniques of assessment of water-scarcity in any region.
3. Fundamental need was highlighted to restore and regenerate the wetlands.
4. Few papers focussed on the integrated water-management system through waste-water treatment, rain-water harvesting and restoration of old diminishing water-bodies especially the village ponds.

Some innovative remedial measures have also been suggested to ensure conservation and purification of existing fresh water on earth. In the valedictory session Prof Chirashreeghosh from dept of environmental studies, University of Delhi discussed research conducted on ground water in Delhi and showed how real time data can influence policy change, thus, emphasizing need for research. Prof Vandana Saxena from dept of education, University of Delhi focussed on community sensitisation and role of academic institution on in bringing awareness about environmental issues. The entire Conference proceeding underlines the fact that everything on earth has direct or indirect relation with water. Infact, the rain which is the main source of water on earth has direct relation with sun as sun makes the water cycle to work. Thus, to protect water, it is essential to protect nature.

कॉन्फ्रेंस में विभिन्न विषय विशेषज्ञों द्वारा पंच प्रस्तुतिकरण किया गया जिसमें मुख्य रूप से महिला सर्वाधिकरण, वर्चुअल और ऑनलाइन माध्यम के कारण होने वाली स्वास्थ्य संबंधी समस्याओं, डिजिटल साहित्य में दिव्यांगों की परिस्थिति, स्ट्रेस मैनेजमेंट आदि विषयों पर सम्बोधन व विस्तार से चर्चा हुई। कॉन्फ्रेंस में बहुत से सकारात्मक पक्ष निकल कर सामने आए जो निश्चित रूप से बेहतर समाज और बेहतर भविष्य के लिए कारण सिद्ध होंगे। नई शिक्षा नीति प्राप्ति प्रणाली है कि कोई व्यक्ति,

National Conference titled 'Unfolding the Potentials of Women and Girls including Children: Enhancing the Benefits Exponentially for One and All- Sabka Saath Sabka Vikas

UGC funded National Conference titled 'Unfolding the Potentials of Women and Girls including Children: Enhancing the Benefits Exponentially for One and All- Sabka Saath Sabka Vikas Perspective' was organised by Aditi Mahavidyalaya on 27.03.2021. Hon Vijay Samplaji, Chairman, National Commission for Scheduled Castes was the Chief Guest of the conference. Prof Anupa Siddhu, Head of Department of Home Science and Director Lady Irwin College was the Guest of Honour for the programme. Prof Geeta Singh, Director CPDHE, University of Delhi who was also the Guest of Honour for the programme. Prof Anil Aneja from Department of English who is also Nodal Officer for Persons with disability and President All India Confederation of the Blind delivered the Key Note Address in the conference.

The purpose of the conference was to bring together though online, the researchers, academicians, practitioners scholars, interested in pondering and sharing their knowledge and experiences not only related to the issues and concerns of women, girls and children but also of the best practices that have worked to make their lives brighter. The abstracts for the conference ranged from entrepreneurship, health, life in difficult circumstances, spirituality, challenges and potentials of differently abled people, gender disparities, empowering third gender, technology and women, media, self care, National Education Policy, 2020 and women etc. We received more than 80 papers from people all over the nation. To evaluate each paper, an Abstract Review Committee was formed and each abstract was subjected to rigorous scrutiny. On the basis of the remarks of the Abstract Review Committee, the papers were selected for oral/poster presentation.

A Pre- Conference Digital Survey was conducted to help in knowing the attitudes, beliefs and practices, knowledge etc about the theme and sub-theme related to the Pre- Conference Workshop for undergraduate students was held on 19.03.21. The participation of the students was overwhelming. They participated in Research Paper Reading Activity, Poster Making Activity and in quiz which has questions related to conference theme and sub themes. The aim of the Pre Conference Workshop was to help them to develop an aptitude for research and participation in academic activities. Pre- Conference Digital Survey was conducted to help in knowing the attitudes, beliefs and practices, knowledge etc about the theme and sub-theme related to the conference. The Conference Team also organised a panel discussion on the theme 'Unfolding of potentials of women and girls including children through NEP, 2020. The eminent scholars shared their views on different aspects of the theme of the panel discussion. There were invited lectures during the valedictory session. Due to the impact of Covid -19, we handled the entire event digitally.

The conference deliberations enabled all to develop greater understanding of gender equality, inclusion and issues related to women, girls and children and what best context specific practices can be adopted to unfold their potentials and how NEP, 2020 would help us in designing the journey and destinations of the the people and the nation. Public participation for everyone's empowerment is the need of the hour - Sabka Saath Sabka Vikas Perspective. The presence and active participation of the participants made the conference informative, insightful and thought provoking.

Department of Education/ BEIEd

1) Department of BEIEd has partnered with **RELO (Regional English Language Office)** of the **US Embassy, New Delhi, US Department of State** for the course focuses on **Content and Language Integrated Learning (CLIL)** designed for pre-service teachers in Elementary Education (Grades 1-8) to address some of the goals in the new National Education Policy. 10-week intensive course sponsored by the U.S. government was delivered online for three hours a week, for a total of 30 hours. The course was primarily asynchronous, with optional synchronous elements under the moderation of a highly-qualified Virtual English Language Fellows (VELFs) from US. More than 100 students of II, III and IV years enrolled and completed the course successfully and rewarded with the certificate of achievement and participation. Now more than 50 students of I year have enrolled for second iteration.

2) Department organised a **dialogue with practitioner series 2020-21** (6 dialogues) on **Teaching Learning in Pandemic Times** for IV- and III-year students where the school practitioners were invited to hold an interactive session with the students to share their teaching learning and pedagogical initiatives in pandemic times. Our own alumni who are working in the field from past many years were the resource persons. Students were able to understand the practices and challenges of both the public and private sectors in India and school experiences from London.

3) Department organised an intra college competitive event on **Teachers' Day**. Themes of the various events were related to **teaching learning in Corona times**. Near about 100 students from various departments participated in the event.

4) Department organised the **virtual visit of Nature Schools of Odisha** for the III-year students. Purpose of this visit and interaction with teachers and experts was to understand the alternatives in education. That was an exciting journey to the rural schools in natural environments and how nature is used as a resource to enhance the teaching learning process. In continuation to that an interactive session was organised with **Mirambika School, Delhi** to understand their vision of education and learner.

5) Department in the collaboration with **science society** and **Eco Club** of the college organised **virtual visit to Bio Diversity park** in the month of December, for all the years. It gave them opportunity to clear their doubts and share the observations with nature education officer. Students were part of various other events organised by the committees and societies of the college and participated in the events of other colleges and secured positions in competitions.

6) a. Vigyan Sanjeevani Science Society, Department of Education celebrated the **National Science Day**. Invited speakers deliberated upon the theme **"Vision of Science in NEP2020"**. BEIEd students attended the event and participated in Poster Making competition on **"Scientific Innovation for Future /Science in Our Lives"**.

b. Science Society organised a **webinar on Inquiry in Science Classroom**. Speakers presented their views in the area of **inquiry in Science Classroom, Science classroom as a gendered space and Assessing Scientific Inquiry**.

7) B.EI.Ed. IV year Pedagogy of Mathematics students successfully completed **National Level E Quiz** on the occasion of **"National Mathematics Day"** organised by Swami Swatantranand Memorial College, Gurdaspur, Punjab, India.

8) B.El.Ed. IV year Pedagogy of Mathematics students successfully completed three days national level **online workshop** on 'Teaching Learning Resources in classroom: A Practice to encourage Active Participation and Holistic Learning', organized by **Dr. H.R. Gajwani College of Education, Adipur** on the Birth Anniversary of former President & Bharat Ratna Dr. A.P.J. Abdul Kalam.

9) B.El.Ed. IV year Pedagogy of Mathematics students attended **national level E-Webinar** on 'Mathematics Education in India: Retrospect and Prospect' organized by Department of Education, Mizoram University, Aizawl

10) B.El.Ed. IV year Pedagogy of Mathematics students attended **webinars on mathematics education organized by Azim Premji University**.

Department of Commerce

The Department of Commerce, Aditi Mahavidyalaya established in year 1994 offers two of the premium courses of University of Delhi viz. B.Com (Hons) and B.Com (Prog). The Department aims to strengthen latent potential of students so as to increase their employability, empower them with financial security and prepare them for professional success. The department released its annual Newsletter- "**Com-Bytes**" on 10th April, 2021.

Webinar on "Stock Market ": Department of commerce in association with Placement cell and Extensive lecture series Committee of Aditi Mahavidyalaya organized a webinar on "Stock Market" on 09 October, 2020 via Google meet platform at 11 a.m. It was coordinated by Dr. Mamta Sharma (Principal) Aditi Mahavidyalaya, Dr. Nitu Rana Dabas (TIC - Department of commerce and Convenor, Placement Cell) and Dr. Pooja Khanna (Convenor, Extensive Lecture Series). Mr. Anil Bhadauria (Senior regional Head-T.I.M.E.), MBA in Marketing and Finance) was the resource person who also has experience of more than 12 years in mentoring students for aptitude. The webinar was an effort to guide the students to gain knowledge and expertise in the field of stock Market. The speaker explained about the terms like money markets, capital markets. He briefed about the procedures to invest in stock market, rise and fall in the prices of NIFTY and SENSEX, distribution of company's earnings through dividends to common stakeholders with the help of recent examples like merger of Vodafone and Idea. This session emphasized on benefits of investing in stock market over depositing money in bank. It was an interactive

session with participation of more than 120 students of B.com and B.com Hons. A vote of thanks was extended by Dr. Nitu Rana at the end of session.

Orientation programme: Department of Commerce, Aditi Mahavidyalaya organized fresher's Orientation programme on 18th November, 2020 via Google meet platform at 10 a.m. The programme started with warm welcome of all the fresher's followed by the introduction of our respected principal Dr. Mamta Sharma, TIC- Dr. Nitu Rana Dabas and all the commerce department faculties and administration of our college. Dr. Mamta Sharma (Principal) addressed newly joined students. In her address to the students, she threw light on how the coming three years will play the most important part in building their future. Dr. Nitu Rana oriented the students about the importance of higher education and highlighted on the opportunities to be socially integrated into the college culture. Further, Dr. Parulgoel, faculty in commerce department oriented the students about the college. Followed next was a brief on the career opportunities one can have in commerce field such as CA, CS, Banking and Insurance, Corporate law and many more with real life examples of our ex students who are now successfully employed in reputed organizations. They were also introduced about the industrial visits our department organizes for every third year batch in order to provide corporate exposure to them. Sh. Ashutosh Aggarwal, Section officer (Administration.) also briefed the students about the concerned persons to contact for any administration work. Ms. Lado, dealing assistant of Commerce department was also introduced to the students.

Apart from academic front, they were also made familiar about the other activities of department such as fresher's party, workshops, seminars, newsletter, commerce fest and finally farewell to keep the students entertain along with academics. The programme came to an end with an active interaction of our TIC- Dr. Nitu Rana Dabas and other faculties with the new students. Around 100 students participated in orientation program.

E- Freshers Party: A virtual Freshers party for the Batch 2020 was organized by the department on January 12, 2021 via google meet. It was organized by final year students in coordination with TIC, Dr. Nitu Dabas. The event started with a welcome speech by respected principal, Prof. Mamta Sharma. In this contest 34 students participated in the 1st round which was based on "Retro Theme". 12 participants were qualified for the 2nd round which was "Talent Round" and finally 6 students were selected for the 3rd round "Beauty with Brain". All the faculties of department asked questions from the participants in the third round and based on performance in all the three rounds, results were declared Ms. Kashish from B.com Hons. , won the title of Ms. Freshers while Ms. Tanya from B.com was 1st runner up. Different titles like Ms. Nightingale, Ms.senorita, Ms. Dancing diva were given to students . Around 80 students attended the program.

Industrial Visit: Every year department organizes industrial visit for final year students but due to pandemic, this year the visit was conducted virtually to Yakult Danone India Pvt. Ltd. on 05th February, 2020 via MS teams software. The program began with warm welcome of all the students, faculty members and team of Yakult. Mr. Ajay Dahiya and Mr. Aadish, Executive, in Public relations department, Yakult Danone India pvt. Ltd. introduced the students to the development process of the product and brand through an informational presentation. They presented various videos, images and slides that gave an insight to the working of fully automatic production system and about its working environment. Detailed explanation about each and every step of the process that the product passes through before actually reaching the market was given to students. Around 117 students joined the program. Students queries were resolved by the team of Yakult at the end of session.

Workshop on “How to do well in group Discussion”: Placement Cell of Aditi Mahavidyalaya in association with Department of Commerce organised a workshop on “How to do well in group discussions” on 13th April, 2021. It was coordinated by Prof. Mamta Sharma (Principal) Aditi Mahavidyalaya, Dr.NituDabas (Convener, Placement Cell), Dr. Rajeev Kaur (Co-convener, Placement Cell), and Members of the Placement Cell. The resource person was Ms. Tarannum Naseem Raza, faculty from TIME Education with work experience of over 20 years in the development and education sector in well known organisation, and is also a professional career counsellor. It was an effort to guide final year students to gain knowledge about how to do well in group discussions. Around 80 students participated in the workshop. The programme was organized exclusively for the First Year BA (H) Geography students by the faculty of Department of Geography in which more than 60 students participated. The program provided an opportunity especially to the budding geographers, where the diverse and multiple dimensions of the subject were briefed to them.

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The Eighth issue of the Departmental Magazine 'Dharitri' was released on 10th April 2021 by the Honorable Vice-Chancellor, University of Delhi. Human Development and Family Welfare (HDFE)

The forte of this course was that there was no course fees, keeping in mind the financial constraints during the Co-vid period. An effort was to keep the students engaged and compensate for their field work exposure in the area of disability which was difficult to be completed during restrictive or lockdown period prevailing due to the pandemic. Fifteen sessions for more than thirty hours were held by resource persons from varied backgrounds such as rehabilitation professionals, medical experts, academicians, parents, research scholars and all those actively involved with these concerns. The different lectures covered topics ranging from understanding the diverse needs of children with disabilities, reimagining disability, educational provisions, capacity building, understanding lived experiences and role of family and community in bringing about a change. The resource persons brought to the sessions their varied and in depth experience and expertise. The popularity of the course could be judged by student attendance that reached 100 in most sessions on the virtual platform of google meet. The deliberations benefitted the students; improving their knowledge base besides sensitizing them on the deep seeded issues as could be interpreted from the feedback forms generated for each session. The course was culminated by an objective test of all the participants and valedictory. The results were shared with the participants and a short video based on the various sessions was previewed. The faculty from other colleges and students provided feedback on the course and a vote of thanks was extended. E certificates were provided to participants with stipulated attendance and test performance. An e-newsletter was prepared for the same.

Second day of the webinar series was followed by a detailed interactive workshop on - "Creating your Career". Scientific research is a critical tool for successfully navigating our complex world. A webinar on **Research Methodology** on **3rd February, 2021** was conducted by the department. The resource person for the webinar was **Dr. Poonam Phogat**. Topics like - Introduction to Research, Format of research, different types of Research – Quantitative, Qualitative and Mixed Method and statistical analysis of data were covered.

Emotional Intelligence being an important factor in our lives, the values and benefits of developing EQ are extensive and in many areas massively under-utilized. To gain insights into the area and to hear about it from an expert the association & department of psychology organized a one-day Interactive Webinar on **Emotional Intelligence Edge** on **26th February, 2021**. **Dr. Dalip Singh** (PhD IAS and State Commissioner of Haryana) was the resource person for the Interactive webinar. The workshop covered various scientific understanding of emotions and its importance in our daily lives. Furthermore training effectiveness of the students was individually measured through an "EQ Test" developed by Dr Dalip Singh.

Later a two days Webinar on "**Psychology in Action**" dated **25th – 26th March, 2021** was conducted by the psychology department. On the first day of the event a session on "Stress Management" was taken by **Prof. N.K. Chadha**. Furthermore the second session for the day was about "Expressive Therapy" by **Dr. Renu Kishore**. On the second day of the webinar series three sessions on - "Cognitive Behavioral Therapy", "Psychology in Organizations" and "Healthy Relationships" was conducted by **Dr. Nimisha Kumar, Dr. Vandana Gambhir and Dr. Urvashi**, respectively.

Following that a Series of Lectures on "**Work Psychology**" were organized from **28th March, 2021 to 30th March, 2021**. Department of Social Work

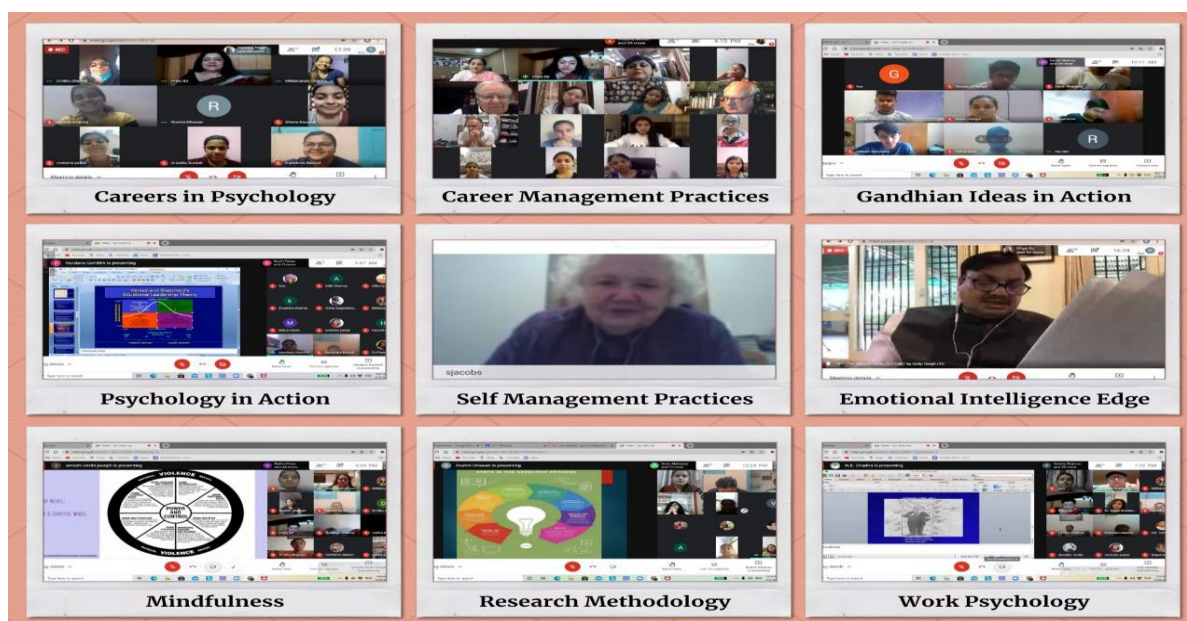

NAAC Committee

NAAC accreditation has a unique process with a Self-study Report (SSR) that drills down to achieve institutional excellence. NAAC gives an opportunity for institutions to square out its efficiency, realize its highlights and challenges and work on improvement plans for the betterment. NAAC work was done under the supervision of Prof. Mamta Sharma (Principal, Aditi Mahavidyalaya), Dr. Ritu Sharma (Convener, NAAC Committee), Dr. Neerja Deswal (Co-convener, NAAC committee) and other team members of NAAC committee of the college. Our College applied for NAAC in March 2020 for the first cycle of NAAC accreditation process and submitted NAAC for 5 academic years from 2014 till 2019. The registration fee was also paid. Following this, data was submitted under both Quantitative and Qualitative metrics along with the relevant documents. The online SSR form was filled and all necessary files were uploaded under each criteria of NAAC. Regular meeting throughout the year were conducted as and when required with our mentor college named "Kirori Mal College (KMC)" through "UGC-Paramarsh" consisting various faculty members of the college. The team from IQAC-KMC visited our College and noted the strengths and weaknesses of the infrastructure and then there was a presentation of all the 7 Criteria as per NAAC guidelines. After submission some changes in different criteria's were being asked by respective NAAC authority in December 2020 through email, for which a request through email was sent to re-open the NAAC portal to the Director, NAAC. The portal reopens in the first week of January, 2021 and the required changes were made in the said criteria's and NAAC was again resubmitted. College need not to submit the hard copies of the SSR at this stage. Post SSR submission, all the data/information submitted will be validated through the Data Validation and Verification (DVV) process. This verification will be done using an online mechanism, which will generate a pre-qualifier score for the college.

The resource persons took us to all trails of the park – including rose conservatory, succulent species conservatory, sterculia dominated forest, medicinal plants conservatory, butterfly conservatory, corridor forest, orchid conservatory, fern conservatory and many others. It shared many interesting videos about porcupine, peacocks, snakes, kingfishers, jackals, painted grasshopper, house sparrows and many other insects and birds. The video on life cycle of butterfly was amazing which shows how larva was turned into a caterpillar and how pupa is formed. No words are enough to describe the metamorphosis of pupa into a beautiful butterfly. The virtual visit ended with an interesting and amazing film on the Aravalli Biodiversity park which has captured very unique moments and details about various species.

who were battling COVID-19. In the very initial phase, our volunteers shared their vision of their objective behind joining Jeevan Rakshika. One of them shared that - '*I lost my family member, it broke my family and its survivors. I don't want anyone to go through what I had witnessed. Through Jeevan Rakshika, I just want to help people and save their families*'. It was dedication and passion of such student volunteers that helped Jeevan Rakshika to reach out to people beyond Delhi also. Our salute to our following dedicated volunteers who worked relentlessly to reach people:

Our Key Efforts:

1. By collaborating with organisations like Project StepOne and IndiaCares Foundation, Prof. (Dr) Mamta Sharma (Principal) and Dr Mali Devi Sawariya participated in the Plasma Donation Drive by the college under Delhi University. From this inspiration, on 1st May 2021, we launched our first 'plasma donation drive' initiative for our college under Jeevan Rakshika. Then we organised a webinar organised by Jeevan Rakshika: Anti-Covid Helpline of Aditi Mahavidyalaya, University of Delhi on "CREATING HUMAN SUPPORT SYSTEM TO COMBAT PANDEMIC- PLASMA DONATION AWARENESS" took place on Saturday, 15th May, 2021. The significant aim of this awareness session was to prepare the Volunteers "How we can make aware the donors to donate their plasma after recovery from Covid-19". In this webinar our resource person was Ms. Sabita Chanda from India Cares Foundation who put forth her insight and experiences on how to convince donors and for rapport, how to eliminate the misconceptions & myths related to plasma donation & also educate the volunteers about Plasma Donation process. Through this drive we were able to provide plasma to the six needy patients in hospitals till 18th May 2021. In order to make our reach wider to the needy sections of society, we created social media platforms like Twitter so that we can reach to services available and the needs of the people.
2. Further, in collaboration with IQAC, we organised a panel discussion with Ms Karishma, Ms Erika Anand and Sh. Mustafa Raahi (Our Rights and Social Society) on "THE ESSENCE OF VOLUNTEERING IN PANDEMIC – BUILDING HUMAN INFRASTRUCTURE" 20th May, 2021 at IPM. Over 80 people attended our webinar. In this Panel Discussion our participants were Ms Sarita (Inception of Life), Ms Kirti Kaushik (Dreamland) also participated to ensure collaborative efforts. This Panel discussion helped our volunteers to strengthen their perspectives on "how the volunteers can help to reach the essential resources to help the vulnerable people in this widespread of Covid-19 or how can volunteerism be the foremost human service in combating this pandemic?". This panel was successful in providing the information on the creation of multi-layered and multi-level intervention for our campaign. This two hour panel discussion was really educative, engaging and fulfilling because of enlightened presence of panellists.

3. **Formation of Informative Kits for Public health communication about Awareness and Education to combat against COVID-19 :**

We also focused on Information Education & Communication because it is an integral and important component of our programme to promote our services to the vulnerable people and families.

Through this campaign, we were able to verify around 105 leads, referred around 8 leads and were able to fulfil needs of around 10 people on daily basis by providing linkages for oxygen, beds and blood donation. It has attained greater importance in our Anti-Covid Helpline awareness and development of the knowledge base. By using this approach, we made posters, wrote poems & made awareness videos.

4. **Community Outreach through Partner Organisations:**

Community outreach in Jeevan Rakshika is about giving, contributing, and helping those who cannot help themselves. Community outreach also allows us to influence younger generations of our volunteers to give back to the community to be a helping hand in these bad times. In this three organisations Ms Sarita from *Inception of Life*, Ms Kirti Kaushik from *Dreamland* & Sh. Mustafa Raahi *Our Rights & Social Society* became our backbone in helping communities living in slums around Bawana, we helped them

in coordinating online for resources and they assisted us in contributing Ration kits & Sanitary Napkins to someone who is in need. Here are few glimpses of our Ex-students as volunteers from partner organisations making it possible:
