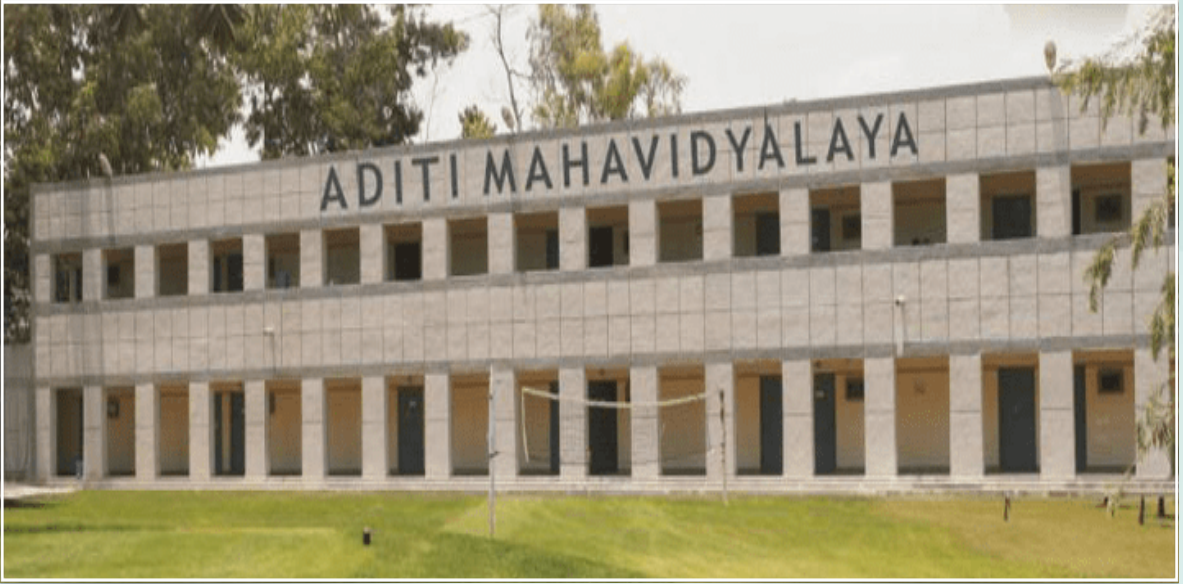

### **Minutes of the Meeting**

A detailed discussion took place on the implementation of the above and the below decisions were taken:

1. Prof. Poonam Verma (Principal, SSCBS) welcomed all attendees and invited Prof. K. Ratnabali (Dean, Academic Affairs) to give the opening remarks.
2. Aim and Objectives of creation of cluster colleges was discussed in brief.
3. All the member colleges of the cluster were requested to open their resources and infrastructure to each other for optimum utilisation.
4. Teachers teaching new courses were advised to take FDPs designed specifically for AEC, SEC & VAC courses at GAD-TLC at SGTB Khalsa College to boost their knowledge.
5. Attendees flagged a concern related to the qualifications the teachers teaching these courses. It was suggested that:
  1. Preference would be given to trained teachers and then they may be offered to passionate teachers.
  2. NCC, Sports or such specific courses should have discipline specific teachers.
  3. Inter-disciplinary courses can be more flexible in terms of teachers teaching these papers.
  4. Non disciplinary courses can be taught by any interested teacher.
6. In cases where only a few students of a college opt for AEC, SEC & VAC courses being run in other colleges, hybrid classes may be taken.
7. Role of Hub and co-hub colleges:
  1. They will act as liaison between the cluster colleges and the university and are responsible for communicating amongst each other and serve as a spokesperson for all cluster college related issues with the university.
  2. They will also act as a coordinator with all cluster colleges, helping to streamline matters.
8. Specific operational challenges:
  1. Attendance of students moving to non-home colleges can be shared on a regular frequency to maintain records and transparency. Hub and co-hub colleges have to play the role of coordinator
  2. It is also suggested that each college should offer maximum choices (keeping institution level resource constraints in mind) under SEC All colleges should offer all 22



languages (under AEC) to their students. University will provide support in cases where no teacher-language combinations are available in any cluster college.

3. Optimum number of students should be there before a paper is offered in the college.
4. No GE, AEC, SEC & VAC papers should be offered if they are linked to/ covered under the core papers in the course in which these papers are being offered.

9. Registration Process:

1. List of papers being offered by a college to be divided under:
  - i. Offered by the college
  - ii. Desired by the students but not offered
  - iii. Preferences may be taken from the students semester wise
2. Timelines for submission of the above data should be adhered to.
3. Complete database should be maintained by the college.
4. A web portal may be developed to share data in a transparent manner keeping papers on offer and extra space in terms of seats and teachers; then the students can bid for particular papers of their choice.

10. Operational set-up:

1. Specific slots should be allocated for AEC, SEC & VAC classes as below to enable the intra-cluster movement of the students:
  - i. Monday - slot is 1330-1730 - SEC
  - ii. Wednesday - slot is 1430-1730 - VAC
  - iii. Friday - slot is 1500-1700 - AEC language
2. All normal college TT should end 30 minutes to 1 hour before the fixed slot timings
3. This intra-cluster movement of students will be allowed only for cases where either particular papers are not being run in the home college or the home college exhausts the number of seats but there are more students who want to opt for that paper so only the additional students are allowed to be shifted.
4. Number of classes per AEC, SEC or VAC course:
  1. SEC - 3/4 periods per week depending on paper chosen (5-6 preferences may be taken from the students so that we can choose to meet up these choices in Sem 1 and subsequent semesters)
  2. AEC - 2 periods (for languages) / 3 periods (Environment) per week (Inter-cluster movement should be avoided for Environment AEC paper)
  3. VAC - 2/3 periods per week depending on paper chosen

The meeting ended with a vote of thanks to all present.
