BEST PRACTICE - I

Title: Good Health For All: Sustainable Development Goal 2 to achieve food security and improved nutrition and to Ensure healthy lives and promote well-being for all.

Objectives of the Practice:

- Primary goal of practice is to promote awareness about healthy diet and innovative practices.
- To develop sensitization amongst students and staff about the cultural diversity in foods of India
- To develop a sense of mutual participation and cooperation through participation in various competitive events in other universities.

THE CONTEXT

Through the following best practices, the college promoted innovative ways to develop awareness about cultural food mobilization practices and healthy life for all age groups. The students participated in various programmes and activities that could make learning about healthy practices accessible for all even within their own homes. Poor Physical health of Children and increasing number of risk factors was a major concern in our country and through the following best practices, the college contributed a lot in developing consciousness about significance of nutrition and infant feeding practices in early childhood health care. - 2. Students participated in the Intra-college recipe contest held on September 8, 2017, during National Nutrition Week and won the First prize for oats Pasta in the recipe contest 'the best nutritious snack.'
- 3. Students attended the Seminar on "change the future migration: Invest in food security and rural development" organized by AFST (I) (Association of Food Scientist and Technologist Delhi Chapter) on the World Food Day on October 16, 2017.
- 4. Students actively participated in the recipe contest and won the Second prize for Rice bran biscuits in the recipe contest 'Value from Waste' on October 16, 2017.
- 5. To develop entrepreneurial skills among students, the FT students organized a Food Stall of nutritious oats idli, Nutri momos, and homemade chocolates at Diwali Mela organized by the social work department of Aditi Mahavidyalaya on October 13, 2017.
- 6. Food Technology students visited the Industrial unit of Delhi flour mill on October 24, 2017.
- 7. Students organized a Food Stall of North east cuisine (thupka andmomos) in North east festival under the aegis of cultural committee of Aditi Mahavidyalaya on November 10, 2017.

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BEST PRACTICE - II

Title: Promoting Diversity and Inclusion: In accordance with Sustainable Development Goal 8 - Promote sustained, inclusive and sustainable economic growth, full and productive employment and decent work for all.

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Objectives of the Practice:

- Firstly, it was to ensure a dialogue about social concerns, vulnerabilities and understanding the ways to combat social inequalities.
- Secondly, it was intended to promote and make students aware about local actions that can help all of us in achieving the goal of being socially responsible.
- Thirdly, to promote inclusive practices that can promote social development-oriented policies that support inclusive activities, decent job creation, entrepreneurship, creativity and innovation.

THE CONTEXT

Along with developing innovation in educational practices, the college focussed on imparting knowledge about socio-economic development practices In order to make students understand the ways to achieve productive employment opportunities through socially equal and responsible knowledge systems. It was also focussed on developing an orientation about eradication of gender discrimination, human trafficking, elimination of child labour, achieving social justice and development of marginalised sections of our society. The challenge that the college faced in this context was lack of inclusive infrastructure and it was very hard to bring the resource persons in the events described below:

• The major themes undertaken during programme were - "Social Work with Tribal Communities" by Dr. Budhaditya Das (Assistant Professor, Ambedkar University), "Social work with Persons with Disabilities" by Mr. Pawan, Assistant Professor, Disability Studies at GTB College, "Issues and Interventions to protect children" by Mr. Shubham, Social Work Practitioner, Child Welfare Committee), "Social Work in Corporate Sector" by Dr. Seema Sharma (Assistant Professor, Department of Social Work, University of Delhi), "Marginalization and Social Justice" by Dr. Shashi Dev (Assistant Professor, Department of Social Work, University of Delhi), "Psychological grounding in Social Work" by Dr. Meena Sawaria (Educational Psychologist and Research Fellow at Ambedkar University), "Social Work in Legal Sector" by Dr. Vijay Pandey (Social Work Practitioner), "Child Welfare and Social Work practice" by Dr. Abhishweta Jha (Associate Fellow, Ambedkar University) and "Social Work with Minorities" by Dr. Preeti Jha (Associate Fellow, Ambedkar University). The specific objective of this programme was to facilitate the transition of knowledge and practical aspect of Professional Social Work - values, ethics and goals to the future as well as current batches in the department.

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- Students of social work, along with faculty members, attended and participated in various sports, academic and cultural events of SEHER-2017, Youth Festival on October 4-7, 2017, at the Department of Social Work, Jamia Millia Islamia, New Delhi
- The theme for this event was 'Social Justice and Sustainable Development Gender, Health and Education' and the chief guest was Shri T.D Dhariyal, Delhi State Commissioner for Persons with Disabilities. Prof. Ushvinder Kaur Popli, Head, Department of Social Work, Jamia Millia Islamia, graced the occasion with her presence as Guest of Honor.
- Pearl Memorial Poster Making competition was organized on January 30, 2018 in the fond memory of our late student Pearl Gupta. The theme was 'Ek Bharat Shreshth Bharat.' In this event, 26 students from various courses participated by submitting their thoughts in the form of poster.

BEST PRACTICES - I

Title: Education for Environment Conservation and Commitment to Nation's Development: Sustainable Development Goal 4 to Ensure inclusive and equitable quality education and promote lifelong learning opportunities for all.

Objectives of the Practice:

- To develop a sense of national integrity amongst all students through educational practices.
- To inculcate the collective and individual responsibility amongst all to protect India's natural resources.
- To promote lifelong learning practices taught by our social reformers like Mahatma Gandhi for cultural enrichment focused on developing glory about the nation's cultural heritage.

THE CONTEXT

In the following best practices, the college aimed to enhance cultural understanding about indigenous methods of learning for making better human life possible for all. The process was to impart knowledge which was already experimented by our great social thinkers like Mahatma Gandhi whose vision became a way of life in environmental movements in India. The contemporary environmental concerns like E-waste and its management is a crucial challenge that the college decided to work upon by finding a way to connect the knowledge systems of modern e-waste management organization and educational practices. However, there was a challenge of resource mobilization that we all faced during practices of excursion, study tour and conferences in imparting following need based knowledge:

PRACTICE

Eco-Club in collaboration with the Gandhi Study Circle of Aditi Mahavidyalaya
organized a two-day National Conference on 'Gandhian Vision and Environment', held
during 6th-7th March, 2019 at Gandhi Bhawan, University of Delhi. The conference
provided a platform to our students to interact with eminent scholars from different
disciplines of environmental studies, history, political science, commerce etc. It also

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conducted a visit to the Yamuna Biodiversity Park on 28th March, 2019 to make the students aware about the principles of ecology.

- Rapid growth of technology and technical innovations have undoubtedly transformed human lives but at the same time also degraded their health and coping mechanisms by leaving huge E-waste dumps in our country. With this issue as our core concern, Dr. Mamta Sharma, Principal, Aditi Mahavidyalaya organized the first National Conference on E-Waste Management and Swachh Bharat Mission sponsored by University Grants Commission on 10th April, 2019 at Department of Environmental Studies, University of Delhi. The event facilitated opportunities for networking, collaboration and exchange of ideas with renowned experts in e-waste management and recycling, research and development and aimed towards sustainability of environment and common resources. Around 200 eminent speakers from Ministries under G.O.l., leading academic scientists, researchers and scholars in the domain of interest from around the country came together to share their expert knowledge, information and best practices, and build a strong vision for the future.
- At the invitation of Spic Macay, the Cultural Committee sent seven students and teachers to participate in the grandArdh Kumbh2019 -'the world's largest congregation of religious pilgrims" —to Prayagraj, Uttar Pradesh. The aim was to understand and attempt to study a number of events, processes, phenomena and traditions. A cultural exchange programme between Directorate of Primary Education (Samagra Siksha Abhiyan, H.R.D.D.,Sikkim) and Aditi Mahavidyalaya, University of Delhi was organised under Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat initiative. A team of students and teachers went to Sikkim and got an opportunity to take a closer look at Sikkim's rich culture and ecology.
- Extensive Lecture Series Committee organized two workshops for the students. The
 workshop on "Young Adulthood: Handling Relationships in Society" offered valuable
 insight to the students about the day to day challenges faced by them with regard to
 their handling of relationships in society. Another workshop was on Goods and
 Services Tax (GST), its benefits and role in abolishing corruption.
- The Placement Cell organised its maiden in-campus job and internship fair Endeavor 2019, wherein corporates like the Sharekhan, Best R.P.O., Eckovation and many more conducted their recruitment drive. The cell acts as an interface between students and recruiters, through a constant sharing of job opportunities with them through social media channels like e- notifications, facebook page etc. thereby ensuring timely dissemination of pertinent job information, and motivating students to apply for the recruitment procedure.

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- Students' Union Advisory Committee organised its first ever academic fest "Quest", apart from its annual cultural fest "Utsav" which is held each year. It started with a seminar on "Purvottar Bharat me Hindi ki Dasha aur Disha", where students got an opportunity to know about the status of Hindi language in the North- Eastern states of India and were also got the opportunity of listening to the views of Prof. Chandan Kumar from the University of Delhi and other speakers from the University of Mizoram, Mizoram.
- As part of the Library Week "One nation reading together" event was organised in collaboration with the Library Committee, where the principal, teachers and students read books, novels, newspapers together at one place and at the same time. Student Union cultural fest "Utsav "was held in the month of February. It was a five-day mega event. Cultural evening had power packed performance by "The Astitva Band" and Hasya kavi Sammelan where famous poets like Mr. Chirag Jain, Mr. Arun Jemini, Mr. Nikunj Sharma, Mr. Gajendra Priyanshu and Mr. Mahendra Sharma made the audience laugh to their humour, and satire. These cultural evenings were held in collaboration with the Hindi Academy and Ministry of Art & culture, Govt. of N.C. T. of Delhi and funded by the M.L.A. Bawana cultural fund.
- NCC is a Tri-services organization, comprising the Army, Navy and Air Force, whose aim is to develop qualities of character, courage, discipline, leadership, spirit of adventure, sportsmanship and ideal of selfless services among the youth and to provide leadership in all walks of his life including in armed forces and always be available for the services of the nation. The final event N.C.C. Fest- SHAKTI- 2019 was organized on 28th March, 2019. The Chief Guest of the Fest was retired Lieutenant Mr. Krishan Kumar. The N.S.S. volunteers organized a donation camp for Kerala Relief Fund in Aug. 2018. They organized a road safety and traffic rules training session to spread awareness about the misuse of traffic rules which result in severe accidents. NSS also organized a workshop on "Creativity and Innovation for Inclusion of the Differently Abled'.
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Best Practices II

Objectives of the Practice:

- To open new knowledge horizons and opportunities for strengthened society amongst all the students.
- To develop collaboration with organizations in order to provide accessible quality of education and to meet new skill demands.
- To utilize existing learning systems as per contemporary need to change, to sync with the newly transformed world with technological changes and global needs.

THE CONTEXT

Through these best practices, all the departments of college were engaged in making Education accessible as a basic human right and elementary to human dignity. It was aimed towards imparting the education that is essential for building the knowledge base our students need to tackle critical challenges like environmental protection and global warming. It helped our youth to prepare for employment in high-skill jobs and livelihood. Moreover, the following best practice ensured that innovative and creative education must be a foundation for peaceful societies and effective institutions. The challenges that college faced in this process was lack of proper infrastructure, insufficient resources and conventional structures.

Best Practice:

- Department of Education and "Vigyan Sanjeevani" Science Society of Aditi Mahavidyalaya conducted three days' workshop on science interface in everyday life towards women education and empowerment with B.EL.Ed. students.
- The Department of Education organized Workshops for Performing and Fine Arts were organized by Mr. Manish Saini. The objective was to provide an opportunity to discover inherent links between dramatics and education. Students learnt Craft participatory work under the guidance of Ms. Harpreet. The objective was to generate creativity among the students and for them to experience the learning process as a whole.
- The Department of Education invited Dr. Pearl Drego from TACET academy and Mr. Gourav facilitated self- development workshops.

- Department of Education organised Workshops for Story Telling and Children's Literature were conducted by the resource person Ms. Jyotsana, and the Talent Hunt Group (Ms Isha Bhargawa and Mr.Irshad Aalam Khubi).
- Department of Education organized a special Physical Education workshop was organized on 6 February, 2019 by Mr. Muskesh Kholi (founder of PECINDIA).
- Department of Education organized Workshops for Drama and Music Theatre in Education were organized by Mr. T Himmat Singh Negi.
- Department of Education organized a Workshop on low cost aids in primary mathematics conducted by resource persons from Jodogyan Shiksha on 8-9 October 2018. The workshop was a learning experience for students wherein they interacted with the resource person to know more regarding innovative practices/ways to deal topics such as 'number systems', 'fractions' and 'measurements.
- Department of Education organized Workshop cum Interactive session on Stories as stimulating agent in understanding mathematical concepts was conducted by Mr. Vijay Kumar (Katha Manch) along with Mr. Viren and Mr. Mukesh Digani (Umang school, Gannur Haryana) on 1-2 April 2019. The objective of the workshop was to orient the students how to use stories as a pedagogical tool in teaching mathematics.
- Department of Education organized a one-day workshop on Engaging Learners:
 Activity based approach was conducted on 8 October, 2018 by Mr. Ghanshyam Das and
 Ms. Devansh. Activity based learning helps the learner to make linkages between
 multiple sub concepts.
- Department of Education organized a two days' workshop on STEM Education was conducted by Mr. Prakash Sahoo on 16-17 October,2018. Workshop on Innovative Teaching practices in Mathematics was conducted by Resource persons from Jodogyan Shiksha on 14-15 January,2019. The topic circled around alternate ways to transact primary mathematical concepts in schools.
- Department of Education organized a Workshop on Performance Making in School Curriculum: Activity Based Learning on 16 March, 2019 was facilitated by Mr. Himmat Singh Negi from T.I.E. The whole experience of the workshop made the students more aware and sensitive towards various issues.
- Department of Education organized a visit to the Ambedkar University, Delhi on 28 March, 2019. All the students and teachers (Dr. Manisha Wadhwa and Dr. Nidhi Goel) attended a workshop and visited heritage site (exhibition) on oral history conducted by CCK (Centre for Community Knowledge) in Ambedkar University, Delhi and gained insights into how they can share the ideas of oral history in a meaningful way with school students.
- Department of Education organized Students attended a presentation by Shivlal Sawliney Scholars, Department of Sociology (University of Delhi) on fieldwork in

- Department of Education attended a panel discussion on 29 September, 2018 organized by Asmi, B.EI.Ed. Association Gargi College (University of Delhi) on the theme "EWS Children in Private Schools: Promises, Failures and Possibilities."
- Aditians participated in the event One Nation Reading Together on 14 November 2018, organized by the Library Committee, Aditi Mahavidyalaya (University of Delhi) and enthusiastically initiated the campaign "gift a book".
- Department of Commerce organized The Democrats- it was the inaugural event of Annual Commerce Festival of 2019 'Vanijyam' held on 20th Feb 2019. The participants disguised themselves as various Members of Parliament and began the session with the question hour in which questions related to current topics like food processing, national language 'Hindi' etc. were put up by the opposition and promptly answered by the ruling cabinet. The act was a beautiful replica of actual Parliament in motion which instilled virtues of confidence and expression among students.
- Department of Commerce organized Business Suits- This event was the dramatization of Annual General Meeting of a virtually created organization (Apna Pvt Ltd.). Students acted as members of the different departments of this company (such as Finance/Marketing/Purchase/CSR). There was a discussion between stakeholders and department heads about the various issues the company is facing and they also came up with the solutions by the end of this event. By this act, students got exposure about the corporate environment which they would be experiencing in their future.
- The Department of Commerce organized Start-up Fiesta Students set up their attractive stalls and sold various products and food items. Some stalls had exciting games such as: Coin in a bucket, Glass pyramid, Guess the movie, Light the Candle, etc. The idea behind this event was to inculcate the feeling of competence and business intent with a focus on profit motive.
- The Department of Commerce organized a Business Plan Students prepared Business Plans and presented it through PowerPoint presentations. This event helped participants to improve their knowledge on creating business plans, intended to prepare them for future endeavours and enhanced their presentation skills. The participants were given honest feedback about their areas of improvement.
- The Department of Commerce organized Art Mania -In this event, students showcased their skills by turning the waste material into useful products that can be further best utilized. They collected the waste material from home, gardens, roads like used bottles, waves, dumped papers, wood, etc., and got the ideas from social networking sites,

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- friends/family for making a useful item from such waste material. They were highly motivated and enthusiastic towards the event.
- In course of the year, a one-day local trip to "The National Museum' near Rail Bhawan, New Delhi and adjoining places was organized on 30th October 2018 where a group of B.A.(Prog) Ill year students with Geography Discipline was assisted by few of our faculties. It not only refreshed the students physically and mentally, but also infused a sense of improved learning.

BEST PRACTICES - I

Title: Developing good Quality life for all through effective collaborations: Sustainable Development Goal 15 and 17 to achieve better health and well-being, educational development and sustaining all life forms with training partners.

Objectives of the Practice:

- The Primary goal of practice is to promote all-round holistic growth of students to develop them into leaders and visionaries of tomorrow.
- To develop sensitization amongst students and staff about the cultural diversity in various remotely situated states of India.
- To collaborate and develop programmes specifically for effective resource and knowledge mobilisation for improving the quality of life of students.

The Context

As the college is located on the rural outskirts, hence it has a lack of accessibility. So, it was really challenging to develop a network of collaborations and practitioners who can update the ongoing developments in policies and strategies for healthy life and well-being, educational opportunities and developing associations for rural camps and outdoor exposure. To meet the above-mentioned goals, students were provided with the following opportunities.

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The Practices

- 1) Cultural Exchange Programme with Sikkim: A cultural exchange programme between Directorate of Primary Education (Samagra Siksha Abhiyan, H.R.D.D., Sikkim) and Aditi Mahavidyalaya, University of Delhi was organised under EK BHARAT SHRESHTA BHARAT initiative. A team of 21 students and 5 teachers started their journey to this 100% organic and divine place and deboarded at New Jalpaiguri. This trip helped them develop cultural awareness about the social and biological diversity and values in the state of Sikkim.
- 2) Empanelment of Food Technology: Aditi Mahavidyalaya partners with FSSAI as training partner. A training and certification course on food safety awareness 'Basic Manufacturing' was organised by the Food Technology Department. Where 40 students were trained as Food Safety Supervisor.
- 3) Field Visits and Educational Trips:32 students visitedVidya Bhawan Society, Udaipur from 29th November, 2019 to 3rd December, 2019 to understand the innovative practices in school education, where students observed the schools in varied socio-cultural context.
- 4) Department of Geography organised a long excursion for 56 B.A. Hons Geography and B.El.Ed. students to Kerala. The main aim of the field work was to develop experience of field research, data collection, using of field instruments and conducting survey and observation. Students investigated the area, local community as well as tourists related to their specific objectives related to disaster management and medical tourism.
- 5) The rural camp was organised by Social work department at Social Centre for Rural Initiative and Advancement (SCRIA), Khori, Haryana. In this period students learned about gender equality, community management and self-sufficiency through economic independence.
- 6) Department of Food Technology organised an Industrial visit to Parle-G on 31st August, 2019.
- 7) To instill marketing strategies, C.S.R. initiative of the brand and cost-benefit analysis, an an industrial visit to Mother Dairy Plant, Delhi was organised. The purpose was to expose students to get into the insight of supply-chain management and working processes of one of the largest dairy cooperatives of India,
- 8) Department of Food Technology and NHE has organised training for students on Food Safety Supervisor and Certification in collaboration with FSSAI, New Delhi.

EVIDENCE OF SUCCESS

These programs helped to develop cultural awareness and to create a holistic learning environment for its students and bridge the gap between rural and urban areas. Our students developed strong resilience and adaptability to assertively respond to climate-related hazards and natural disasters occurring around them at local and national levels. This awareness has

Due to our efforts to make them aware about their responsibility towards nature through educational programs, rallies and campaigns we were successful in developing behavioral change and strengthen institutional capacity to work towards mitigation, risk reduction and developing sensitization about environmental friendly actions.

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BEST PRACTICES - II

Title: Ensuring Awareness oriented Education and Proactive behaviour for sustainability: In accordance with sustainable development goal 4, 5 and 9

The Objectives:

- To facilitate the educational programs that can develop eco-awareness and volunteer spirit amongst students to promote sustainable development.
- To undertake skill enhancement initiatives that disseminate the innovative knowledge, motivation and capabilities in the students for being a catalyst in socio-economic change.
- To promote inclusiveness and barrier free educational environment for all.

The Context

In order to develop awareness- oriented education, it was really challenging for the college to gather all technological, infrastructural and social support systems. This was the stage where our practices not only had students and our social reformers like Mahatma Gandhi's role as stakeholders but also the communities and entrepreneurs who were working in the fields and corporations.

The Practice:

THE PRACTICE

At Aditi Mahavidyalaya, the focus on women empowerment leads to engagement of students, both within and outside the classroom to develop scholarly inquiry which enables them to transform their knowledge into action. In order to achieve this mission, the following efforts have been made:

- 1. Post conference gender sensitization programs based on learnings BBBP 'by exploring possibilities through innovative teaching technique *Beti Bachao Beti Padhao* perspective for all disciplines.
- 2. Installation of sanitary pads dispenser in campus: It is a laudable attempt to promote women hygiene. Aditi is the first Rural College to procure the dispensing machine sponsored by ONGC in collaboration with CSR research foundation.

The significant aim of this awareness session was to prepare the Volunteers "How we can make aware the donors to donate their plasma after recovery from Covid-19". This Panel discussion helped our volunteers to strengthen their perspectives on "how the volunteers can help to reach the essential resources to help the vulnerable people in this widespread of Covid-19 or how can volunteerism be the foremost human service in combating this pandemic?". This panel was successful in providing the information on the creation of multi-layered and multi-level intervention for our campaign. This two hour panel discussion was really educational, engaging and fulfilling because of the enlightened presence of panelists.
- Formation of Informative Kits for Public health communication about Awareness and Education to combat against COVID-19: We also focused on Information Education & Communication because it is an integral and important component of our programme to promote our services to the vulnerable people and families. Through this campaign, we were able to verify around 105 leads, referred around 8 leads and were able to fulfill needs of around 10 people on a daily basis by providing linkages for oxygen, beds and blood donation. It has attained greater importance in our AntiCovid Helpline awareness and development of the knowledge base. By using this approach, we made posters, wrote poems & made awareness videos.
