The govt. has announced the capacity expansion plan where the B.A. Prog. seats have been increased from 549 to 580; B.A.Hons. (Geo.) from 32 to 60; B.A.(Hons.) Hindi Patrakarita avam Jansanchar from 46 to 70; B.A.(Hons.) Social Work from 45 to 60; B.Com.(Hons) from 55 to 130 and in B.El.Ed. from 54 to 60. The new courses for evening classes are B.A.(Hons.) English, B.A.(Hons.) Psychology, B.Com. (Hons.), Biochemistry, B.A. (Hons.) Economics, B.A. (Hons.) Pol Science, B.A. (Hons.) Mass Communication & B.Sc. Physical Science /computer science/chemistry. With the introduction of such courses the college would see a surge in academic and intellectual transactions. Besides these academic advancements the college is also doing well at sports. For instance, Ms. Preeti from B.A. (Hons.)Political Science III year has done exceptionally well and selected in Judo Team for participation in Junior Common Wealth games. My heartiest congratulations to her. The college infrastructure is also improving fast as we received a grant of Rs.55 lakhs from the V.C. fund for the renovation of college hall and setting up of a journalism studio. The then Hon'ble Vice Chancellor Shri Dinesh Singh had visited the college on October 1,2015 to commence the Vaishali Tomar Memorial scholarship. I am also delighted to share that the college has initiated the process of the installation of two industrial grade Reverse Osmosis water filtration plants. Very soon the college will also have developed an Aditi App at the Playstore available on all the operating systems. Not going into full details here I would also like to share the happy development that this academic year saw a great boost in the students' and faculties' participation in innovation projects and research. Three U.G.C.sponsored Major Projects namely AM 301, AM 302, AM 303 have been undertaken by us this year.

DEPARTMENT-WISE ACCOMPLISHMENTS DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION

The Department of Education has twelve full-time and two guest faculty members, two laboratory assistants and 186 students in B.El.Ed. Programme and 50 students in B.A.(Prog.) II, Education Programme. The academic session 2015-2016 was full of activities, workshops and achievements.

The session began with Orientation Programme conducted for the first two days of the academic session introducing newcomers to the four-year integrated professional course in teacher education. Students were oriented about theory and practicum courses, rules and regulations of the college, internal assessment—its importance, criteria and basis and annual examination.

The Honorable Vice Chancellor Prof. Dinesh Singh disbursed a sum of Rs.10000/approximately as part of Vaishali Tomar memorial scholarship on October 1, 2015 constituted in the memory of our late ex-student Vaishali Tomar. Toppers from B.El.Ed. first, second and third years would be benefitted for college fee and grant for books. The students staged a play on examination related stress faced by students and its resolution which was attended by the college Governing body chairperson and other members.

Theatre workshops were organised throughout the year for the B.El.Ed. first year students by Mr Manish Saini. These workshops provided an opportunity to discover the links between education and theatre. Students learnt techniques of theatre for enhancing teaching – learning in a school classroom.

RESEARCH GRANTS-PROJECT HIGHLIGHTS

• A research project entitled "Development of an Educational Program to enhance Food Label Understanding among Early Adolescents: Peri-Urban Delhi" was taken up by a study team comprising of Dr. Upasna Seth (Associate Professor, Department of Home Science - Food Technology), Dr. Sandhya Vatsayayana (Associate Professor, Department of Hindi), Dr. Manju Goel (Assistant Professor Department of Social work) and Ms. Sneh Gangwar (Assistant Professor, Department of Geography) and 10 undergraduate students. It is a peri-urban government school based educational intervention study, designed to assess the knowledge of early adolescents regarding Nutrition Fact Label (NFL) and to educate them about NFL through an Education

- Programme to promote lifelong food selection skills and healthy eating habits. During its first and second phase, the eating habits, nutrition status and existing knowledge on NFL of children in early adolescence was assessed and the team developed a nutrition education programme (module) on NFL. The developed educational programme is based on Bandura's Social Cognitive Theory comprising of components such as curiosity, knowledge imparting, retention and reinforcement of the gained knowledge through interactive workshops and presentations. The developed programme is currently being used to improve knowledge related to NFL (as part of the third phase). In the fourth phase of the study, the effectiveness of the interventional programme in improving the knowledge, attitude and understanding regarding NFL among early adolescents shall be assessed. We wish the team all the best in improving the knowledge relating to nutrition facts on food labels among the consumers.
 - The innovation project AM303 titled as Psychological, Commercial, and Legal Fight of Aged Consumers: A Self-Help Group Technique has been taken up in the college whose Principal Investigators are Dr. Mamta Sharma (Principal Aditi Mahavidyalaya), Dr Ritu Sharma (Assistant Professor, Department of Psychology), Dr. Divya Sharma (Assistant Professor, Department of Commerce), Dr Sunita Dahiya (Assistant Professor, Department of Commerce) and students named Himani, Chetna, Debakshi, Nidhi Mishra, Chandrika, Pooja, Diksha, Sheetal, Shivangi, Nidhi Dabas. This project is a medium to bring about awareness of the wrong consumer practices such as the generation of black money on a day to day basis. We organised workshops for skill and knowledge development of students and older people at various places. The workshops were conducted by international and national experts in the psychological, commercial and legal aspects of consumer behaviour. Prof Sue. C. Jacobs (Professor, Oklahoma States University, U.S.A.) conducted the workshop on psychological aspects of consumer behaviour. Advocate Ankita Chaudhary (Lawyer ,Supreme Court of India) and Advocate Ashoka Jain (High Court) conducted the workshop for legal aspects of consumers behaviour and talked about the procedures of filing complaints in consumer forum, consumer rights and responsibility of consumers. Dr. Rekha Dayal (Associate Professor, Department of Commerce, Jesus and Mary college) and Dr. Abha Mathur (Department of Commerce, Satyawati College) shared some skills and knowledge of the commercial aspects affecting consumer behaviour. These workshops served as intermediaries to bridge the gap between the knowledge and skills among the young and older participants. Besides, many competitions such as t-shirt painting, collage-making, debate, poster-making have been organised at inter-college level in which students participated with great enthusiasm. Relevant data has been gathered for development of plans and formulation of policies.
