Having spent over two decades working in the domain of Life with blindness George has diverse experience having worked as a trainer/motivational speaker, a promoter of cricket for the blind and a disability Activist/Communicator.

Our special guest, Preeti Monga is Director of Silver Linings, an organization which offers a host of services to corporations and the citizen at large. Preeti is the first visually impaired Aerobic instructor in the country and also is an outstanding motivational speaker, trainer and marketing professional. Regular sessions are arranged for locating development of students under EOC for sensitizing them on various issues to treat everyone equally.

Dramatic Society

The society presented Abhijyan Shakuntal, sanskrit play written by the great Kalidas, in Sri Ram Centre, Mandi House. The play directed by Ram Ji Bali, the famous director. The students of the college have acted appreciably in the play. The play depicted all time great relevant appeal as well as contemporary gender discourse. On the occasion of Indepence day,' Riyasaton Ka Vilaya' a play depicting issue of honor killing was presented in the college. Also society been instrumental to present the play 'Ek Sabhyta Prem Ke Virudh' based on the right to choose of one's life and challenging the Khaap Panchayats dictatorship and cruelty. The society also presented a street play 'Ek Kadam Hamara' in the Antardhwani which evokes issues of education and professional aspiration of rural girls.

Website Committee

The website committee has been working through the year. The timetable of all the teachers is uploaded on the college website. The prospectus of the previous year had been updated in the beginning of the academic session 2014-2015. All news items are updated every day as per requirement on the college website. Aditi bagged a Special Recommendation Prize at Antardhwani 2015. Information about the same is also there on the college website. The college boasts of complete wi-fi. It is a user-friendly/ net friendly college where each student has her own login name and password. The same goes for all teaching non-teaching staff. Information about RTI, college roster and the previous year's Annual Report is also there on the website. Any student/ person seeking information about the college can find the same on the website.

Fee Concession Committee

In the academic year 2014-2015, the Fee Concession Committee gave full tuition fee concession to 40 students in the present academic year.

Grievance Redressal Committee

The committee oversaw the admission process for the academic year. Also the committee looked into the matters of student union elections for the redressal of complaints arising therein.

Research Committee

The research committee provided feedback to the research projects, which are to be submitted to other funding bodies like University Grants Commission. The purpose is to ensure that research projects are according to the guidelines of the funding agency and are relevant.

RESEARCH GRANTS-PROJECT HIGHLIGHTS

- 1.) Innovation Project AM- 202, titled 'Nutritional and psychosocial well being of rural elderly people in Delhi' undertaken by team of four faculty members, a mentor for the project and students learning research pedagogy in the field. The project outcomes elucidate society position and status of the elderly people in changing scenario.
- 2.) The Delhi University funded project titled "Locating Women in the Context of Partition: An Account of Lived Experiences and Unheard Voices." It is a joint project of three teachers and ten students. An article titled "Unveiling the Layers: A Journey into the Covertures of Women Partition Survivors" has been accepted by Delhi University to be published in the maiden Delhi University Journal. The e-journal will be available for readers in the next three months in 2015.
- 3.) GFATM (Global Fund for AIDS Tuberculosis and Malaria) Round-7 Saksham has organized one Refresher Training for Delhi States AIDS Control Society's' (DSACS) Counselors on Advance Manual. The project is also providing ongoing counseling supervision to the (Integrated Counseling and Testing Center) ICTC counselors. In extension phase, the supportive supervision is also provided for (Anti Retroviral Therapy) ART and (Sexually transmitted Infection) STI counselors. A total of 32 supervisors are providing supervision to 125 ICTC Counselors, 32 STI and 19 ART counselors in 93 ICTC Centers, 22 STI centers and 9 ART centers of Delhi respectively.

National Service Scheme

During the Academic session 2014-2015, the major themes of national service scheme activities were themed on subjects Women safety and Cleanliness. An orientation program conducted to make familiar students about the NSS activities. NSS volunteers of the college participated in organizing the Student Union Election. The distribution of unused stationary and books to the slum and construction site children were some activities which imbibes the NSS core values. The Volunteers also initiated cleanliness drive using various IEC (Information Education and Communication) tools in the campus. Swachta Bharat Abhiyan was organized by the committee on October 2nd, 2014 to create awareness and sensitize students towards cleanliness. The event witnessed high participation in poster making, debate and street play competition on the theme "Gandhi Ji's Swatch Bharat". NSS volunteers participated in Paper Reading competition about "Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel" on the occasion of National Unity Day celebration (31st October, 2014). Also volunteers participated in "Run for Unity" at India Gate organized by University of Delhi. Two NSS volunteers got opportunity to participate in "19th National Youth Festival -2015, Suvichar & Youth Convention" on the theme "Clean, Green & Progressive India" from 8th January, 2015

to 12th January, 2015 at Guwahati, organized by the Union Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports in collaboration with the Assam Directorate of Sports and Youth Welfare. Committee organised a Self Defense Training from 14th February, 2015 to 28th February, 2015, where in 48 students got training on defense techniques. The UNESCO organized session on Talking Across Generation (TAG), 2015 (The War In Our Minds: Can Education Wage Peace?) on 16th February, 2015 participated by NSS volunteers.

National Cadet Corps

In the present academic year 55 NCC cadets are enrolled and total strength of the NCC cadets is 112. Total 27 cadets qualified 'C' certificate exam, 3 cadets qualified for 'B' certificate. During the activities 7 cadets participated in Thal-Sena Camp and 8 cadets participated in Combined Annual Training Camp. 10 cadets selected and participated in Prime Minister Rally 2015 and one Cadet selected for Parasailing in Prime Minister Rally from our college. Its an enormous achievement that 42 cadets participated in Parade for Antardhvn and 15 cadets worked as volunteer for maintaining discipline during Antardhwani. NCC unit of Aditi Mahvidayalay has organized NCC Festival and Rank Ceremony on 20th March 2015. N.C.C. cadets always played role of 'volunteers' in each cultural activity in the college. N.C.C. cadets participated in Annual Festival of College by performing 'Guard of Honour', Piloting and Parade. Cadets also actively participated in 'Swachta Abhiyan' and 'Ekta Diwas' Rally and parade conducted by the college.
