Library Committee Report (2022-23)

The biggest challenge after covid was to increase the number of visitors to the library and to promote the reading skills of the students. After much discussion and deliberation, the library committee members decided to begin research. The library has initiated a research project "Reading (e)-choices of library users in the covid 19 lockdown and post-covid: A gender impact assessment" as part of the undergraduate research program (2022) developed by the college research cell. The aim is to find gaps in reading habits and choices due to the pandemic and how the library can support readers to develop their skills.

During the last year, the library has carried out a number of initiatives and activities in this regard. The library has created **reading circles** where students discuss their reading with other interested readers. It contains all kinds of readings. The aim is to help them create a forum for reading, thinking and discussion.

The college library organised the **Graduate Research Seminar GRADS2023** at the library fest on April 26,2023. 30 research papers Including papers from other universities, were received from different colleges and departments at Delhi University, which was a resounding response. Graduate and postgraduate students read papers on a range of topics, including tourism, women and violence, women and personal hygiene, acceptance of third gender, classroom teaching and learning, curriculum and texts, adolescent issues, mental health, entrepreneurial mindsets, and privileges etc.

The data gathered from the fields was presented in the majority of the papers. Over 100 attendees, 39 presenters (including group paper presentations), and 7 faculty mentors were present at the seminar. In order to facilitate a dialogue, each group had a teacher mentor/s. This seminar was an opportunity for graduate students to present their research and use the space for critical and reflective discussion of their research with other researchers and mentors. Alumna Ms. Rakhi was the guest of the event. She is currently working on her master's dissertation on resilience and compassion and got a fellowship to work with Red Door (a mental health organisation), University of Cambridge.
