# DU to collaborate, share expertise with remote colleges, boost research

**New Delhi:** A college in the border area of Arunachal Pradesh's Bomdila, another in Ladakh and an institute catering to the tribal population of Madhya Pradesh — Vidya Vistar (V2S) will now connect all of them, and many more, with Delhi University.

Under the scheme, proposed by acting vice-chancellor P C Joshi and launched this year, DU colleges will collaborate with those in backward areas across the country to share their academic expertise and conduct joint research. Many DU colleges have already chalked out plans to share their lectures, laboratories and libraries, and will also conduct student exchange programmes and push for mutual research. DU colleges can choose their own partner institutes under V2S.

"My vision for Delhi University", Joshi told TOI, "is to open its door for others. We have started V2S, which will open up DU to colleges of remote areas. Already Bhaskaracharya College of Applied Sciences has collaborated with a college in Bomdila in Arunachal Pradesh and Aurobindo College is collaborating with a college in Ladakh".

DU colleges will only have to choose a partner from a remote area and two institutes

should be able to work together for research, Joshi pointed out during an exclusive interview.

Balaram Pani, principal of Bhaskaracharya College of Applied Sciences, told TOI that the Bomdila college was chosen to "provide free education and expertise to the students of that region". Pani added, "Our faculty members can teach them through online mode. We will also allow their faculty members to come here and use our laboratory for their research." Provisions will also be made for visits of students from the Arunachal college.

Hansraj College has chosen two colleges — Government College of Chamba, Hi-

machal Pradesh and Government Degree College of Drass, Ladakh. Principal Rama Sharma said, "It is our duty to give back to the society. There are times when these colleges are not even aware of government policies. With collaboration, we can help upgrade these colleges." Hansraj is keen on collaborating with many more colleges, she added.

Many DU colleges are also looking at utilising these remote locations for research and giving exposure to their students. Vipin Kumar Aggarwal, principal of Aurobindo College that is partnering with Government College of Kargil, said they would send students

to Kargil "so that they can understand the culture there". The college will conduct its laboratory experiments, classes and seminars, he added.

Aditi Mahavidyalaya is collaborating with Government College of Barwani district, Madhya Pradesh, "which caters to the tribal population of the region", said principal Mangta Sharma. The college will share its library resources and also wants to conduct joint research programmes, bring out publications, and take up community development initiatives, she added.

Kirori Mal College is hoping to collaborate with a college from Odisha's Cuttack and another from Manipur.

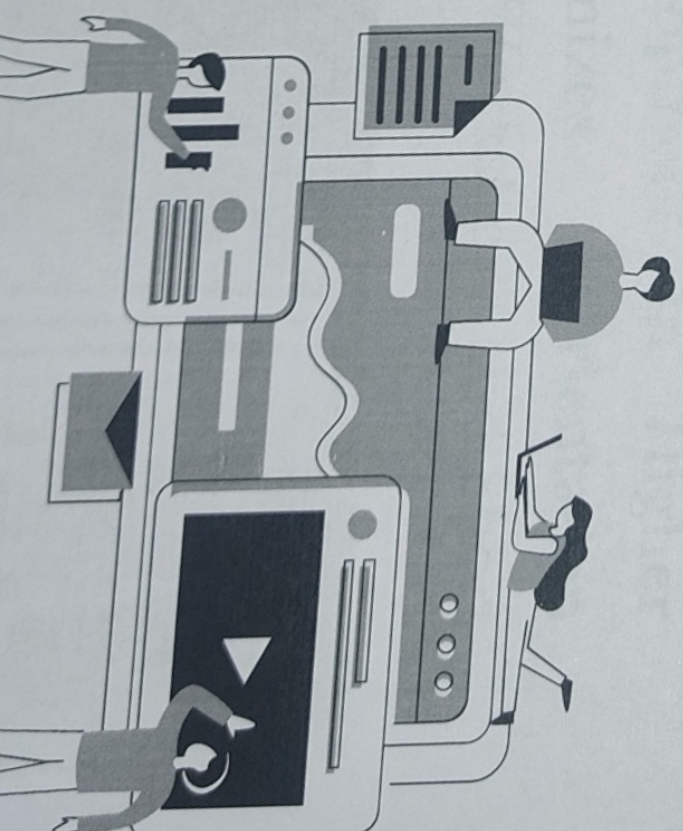


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## COOPERATION FOR CAPACITY BUILDING OF FACULTY

Augmenting the capacity of faculty members is one of the primary steps for enhancing academic capital of an educational institution.

## FACILITIES FOR CAPACITY BUILDING OF FACULTY

- Institute of Life Long Learning (ILLL) organizes various training programmes for teachers and staff such as Workshop on MOOC, use of ICT, Capacity building for various Disciplines, etc.
- Centre for Professional Development in Higher Education (CPDHE) organizes Orientation Programmes, Refresher Courses, Workshops and Short Term Courses.

## FACILITIES FOR CAPACITY BUILDING OF FACULTY

- Departments also organize Faculty Development Programme (FDP), specific to their discipline. For instance, FDP on 'Teaching Law for Social Justice' was conducted by Faculty of Law in March 2019.
- Colleges such as, SGTB Khalsa College, Ramanujan College, & Hansraj College have been operating Teaching Learning Centres (TLC) under the aegis of the Pandit Madan Mohan Malviya National Mission on Teachers and Teaching, MHRD. The Centres aim at facilitating teaching learning process to the teachers across the country, especially those located in the remote areas of the country.



## ONLINE TEACHING LEARNING

Opportunity to share with the students of each others' institutions the academic expertise and intellectually stimulating lectures/talks/seminars/workshops/conferences/webinars.

## ONLINE TEACHING I LEARNING

Teaching learning platforms have undergone a sea change after lockdown necessitated by the pandemic. Classes and examinations have been conducted online. This experience of online teaching learning along with the already existing appropriate infrastructure encourages to use online platform as a means to engage with the students of fellow partner institutions.

- ILL had been set up in 2007 with an aim to remove the traditional barriers of seeking knowledge, such as - space, time and resource constrains.
- Colleges of the University also have adequate infrastructure for such online engagement with partner institutions.



## ONLINE TEACHING LEARNING

The University has been using online facilities for the purpose of imparting education, knowledge and dissemination of information.

- The institute of Life Long Learning (ILLL), an active partner of National Mission on Education through Information and Communication and Technology, has developed e-content for 06 disciplines viz. Mathematics, Botany, Commerce, Economics, History and Zoology. These are available on the Virtual Learning Environment and Sakshat Portal.
- Virtual Learning Environment (VLE) is a unique and innovative initiative to provide a host of collaborative tools based on Web 2.0 to fulfil the needs of the teaching and learning community.
- The Campus of Open Learning has been conducting courses that are run through e-learning mode.
- The pandemic led online classes have also generated recorded lectures which may be shared easily.



## JOINT RESEARCH & PUBLICATION

"Publish or Perish" continues to be the mantra in terms of the professional growth of faculty members as well as ranking of an academic institution in the international and national ranking systems.

It may be relevant to mention that the h-index of the University touched 210, which is one of the highest among Indian universities. In addition to the University funded projects, there are several projects sponsored by different funding agencies which are taken up by the faculty members.

The proposed V2 Scheme provides opportunity to collaborate for joint research between faculty members of the partner institutions or along with the scholars or students of the partner institutions.

- Drawing up a detailed proposal for partnership under V2 Scheme with the identified College/Dept. stating clearly the following:
  1. Aims and objectives of the partnership.
  2. Identified areas of cooperation
  3. Resources which the College/Dept. is willing to share with the partner institution.
  4. Identify ways to provide exposure to the students of partner College or Dept. in academics, sports, cultural activities etc.

Some factors for identifying -

- Inaccessibility
- Location in border areas
- High tribal population
- Urbanization less than 10%



5. Ongoing or future projects in which the faculty/students of the partner institution may be associated.

6. Financial or other available resources which may be used for implementing the Scheme.

7. Availability of conducting online teaching learning or webinars etc.

8. Expected outcome of the partnership.

- Submitting the proposal to the University for approval to avoid duplicacy.
- Signing of MoU with the partner institution.

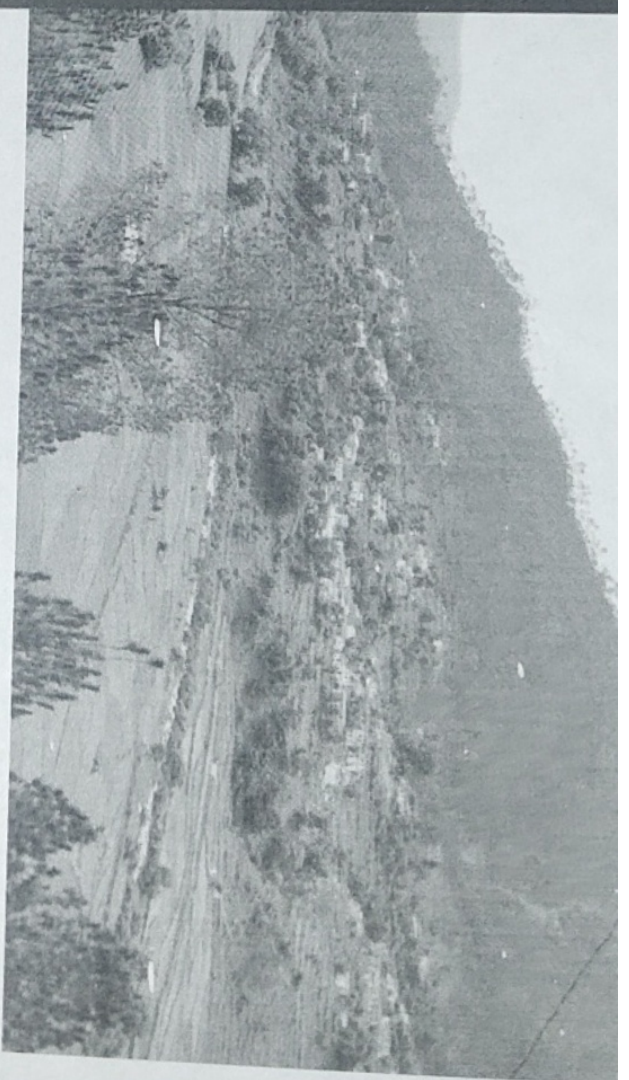



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

**Memorandum of Understanding under the Vidya Vistar Scheme**

**Affiliated to Shaheed Nandkumar Patel Vishwavidyalaya, Raigarh, Chhattisgarh**

This Tripartite Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) is entered under the Vidya Vistar Scheme (hereinafter referred to as V2Scheme), an initiative of the University of Delhi to establish academic linkages between its Colleges and Departments with the corresponding Institute in remote areas of the country.

**Among**

**The University of Delhi** a University enacted under the Act of Parliament (*Act No VIII of 1922*), having its office at **Vice Regal Lodge, North Campus, Delhi-110007**, and represented by its REGISTRAR, of the First Party.

**Aditi Mahavidyalaya**, University of Delhi, having its registered office at **Delhi-Auchandi Road, Bawana, Delhi - 110039**, represented by **Prof. Mamta Sharma**, Principal, Aditi Mahavidyalaya, of the Second Party.

**and**



Kirodimal Govt. Arts & Science College, Affiliated to Shaheed Nandkumar Patel Vishwavidyalaya, Raigarh, Chhattisgarh having its registered office at Chakradhar Nagar, District - Raigarh, Chhattisgarh, Pin - 496001, represented by Dr. Anjani Kumar Tiwari, Principal, Kirodimal Govt. Arts & Science College, of the Third Party.

The Second and Third parties shall be jointly referred to as 'Partner institutes' and all the three parties shall be jointly referred to as 'Parties'.

Recognizing the India's dream to be a global superpower in the coming decades depends primarily on enhancing the skills of its human resources to meet global demands and increasing innovations and start-ups to fuel the economy. The roles that the universities, colleges and other educational institutions have to play is crucial in this context

Realising that alone, each Party will require investment of considerable amount of its resources for the developmental activities. However, being a developing country, it would be in the best interest to maximise the utilization of existing resources available with the Universities/ academic institutions by sharing the same, through academic collaboration and cooperation amongst them, for augmenting the human resources.

Therefore, the Parties witnesseth as under, which defines the framework for the cooperation of the Partner institutes in the following sections -

1. The Parties are agreeing to partner under V2Scheme for the purpose of enhancing the mutual growth and development of each other.
2. The academic bonding is based on the principle of mutual respect, cooperation and sharing between the two parties as equal partners.

3. The Second Party shall extend its academic resources and facilities available for the V2Scheme to the Third Party with an aim to be catalyst for the faster growth of the latter. The Third Party shall share its academic resources with the Second Party to the extent possible, on a collaborative basis in the fields of academics, education and research.
4. The areas of cooperation between the two Partner institutes shall include the following:
  - 4.1. Organize online/ offline lectures, workshops, trainings, meetings and other such programmes aimed at capacity building of the faculty members, students and staff of both the Partner institutes. To the extent possible, visits of faculties will be facilitated for this purpose.
  - 4.2. The teachers and researchers of the both the Partner institutes may be engaged in Joint research activities and be co-investigators in the research programmes submitted to funding agencies.
  - 4.3. Joint research publication by teachers/ researchers of the Partner institutes shall be encouraged.
  - 4.4. Library resources may be shared for providing support in capacity building of the faculty and for improvement of their teaching and research skills.
  - 4.5. To forge mutually beneficial linkages with its partners through various platforms so as to initiate and assist innovation activities and boost start-ups.
  - 4.6. To cultivate the feeling of brotherhood among youths of the two institutes through sports and extracurricular activities.



5. Intellectual Property Rights:

Ownership of any intellectual property (including but not limited to confidential information, know-how, patents, copyrights, design rights, rights relating to computer software, and any other industrial or intellectual property rights) developed jointly during the course of this MOU shall be vested in Partner institutes to this MoU. The Partner institutes shall have the joint right to determine the commercial exploitation and disposition of such intellectual property, and Partner Institutes shall make joint applications for the registration of the same. Before any registration or commercialization of any intellectual property takes place, the Partner institutes agree to reach a separate agreement covering issues such as exploitation rights and revenue sharing. Any publication regarding such intellectual property shall only be possible with the prior written consent of Partner institutes, such consent not to be unreasonably withheld. University of Delhi shall be free to use perpetually the results arising out of the collaborating activities for its own internal teaching, research, educational, clinical and publication purposes without the payment of royalties or other fees to the other parties.

6. The University of Delhi shall facilitate in the process of establishing partnership under this Scheme. It shall oversee the general implementation of the V2Scheme.
7. The Second Party shall submit a report to the University of Delhi within seven days of completion of any activity taken up under V2Scheme.
8. The MoU will come into force from the date of putting the last signature on this MoU.
9. The MoU shall be for a duration of two years.
10. The Parties may renew the MoU for a further period of the same duration with mutual consent of the Parties. The process for renewal may be initiated three



months prior to the expiry of the term of the MoU by any of the two Partner institutes.

11. The MoU may be terminated prior to the completion of the term by any Party to the MoU by giving one-month prior written notice to the other two Parties. Once terminated, neither parties will be responsible for any losses, financial nor otherwise, may which the other institute suffer.
12. However, any ongoing project, course, joint research or publication which have been initiated by the Partner institutes prior to the date of termination shall be continued as if no termination has taken place.
13. The MoU is intended to be an expression of general understanding and intention of the Parties. The Parties shall make earnest effort to carry out the tasks undertaken in this MoU. However, it shall not be an agreement enforceable in a court of law. Nothing in this Memorandum shall be construed as creating any legal relationship between the institutes. This Memorandum is a statement of intent to foster genuine and mutually beneficial collaboration.
14. Any disagreement/ differences/ dispute between the Partner institutes shall be resolved through mutual discussion between them. In case any dispute remains unresolved, the decision of the Vice-Chancellor of the University of Delhi shall be final and binding on both the Partner institutes.
15. In case of any force majeure, such as flood, earthquake, epidemic, etc. the Partner institutes shall be excused from performing obligations which are directly impacted by any act of force majeure.
16. This MoU constitutes the complete agreement between the Parties with respect to the collaboration under V2Scheme. The terms of this MoU may be amended by mutual consent of the Parties in writing. 5 participating faculties, staff and students



involved in any activities under this Memorandum must adhere to the laws of the country and Rules and Regulations of the institutions.

17. This MoU shall be executed in triplicate with each Party keeping an original.
