

ABOUT DEPARTMENT OF EAST ASIAN STUDIES



Department of East Asian Studies (informally called as DEAS, DU), established in 1964 under the aegis of the University of Delhi, offers various courses related to East Asian studies and East Asian languages. The department was initially established as Center of Chinese studies in the year 1964 with active participation by Late Professor V. P. Dutt, a notable scholar in the domain of Chinese studies in India; in 1969, Japanese studies programs were also added. Since then, the department has grown to accommodate Korean studies programs and presently the only department in any Indian University that conducts researches and offers various programs exclusively related to East Asian studies and languages at one place. Further, the department offers a Masters Program in East Asian Studies, that is also unique in India.

The department of East Asian Studies, under the initiative of Prof V. P. Dutt, was started as the Center of Chinese studies, in the year 1964, with Prof Dutt as the Department Head, with active support from the Government of India. With this department, it became the first center in India to offer courses on East Asian regional studies. In the year 1969, Japanese language and studies programs was started and with this the department was renamed as Department of Chinese and Japanese Studies. The department further grew to accommodate Korean studies programs from 2000 and with this the nomenclature of the department changed to the present Department of East Asian

G20 SUMMIT AND BHARAT-ITALY CONFLUENCE

A bilateral meeting was held between with H.E. Ms. Giorgia Meloni, Prime Minister of the Italian Republic and Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi on the sidelines of the G20 Summit in New Delhi. This was the second visit of Prime Minister Meloni to India following her State visit in March of this year, strategic partnership was discuss under bilateral relations. Italy's support for India's G20 Presidency was appreciated by PM Modi, by joining the India - Middle East - Europe Economic Corridor and the Global Biofuel Alliance. India and Italy have completed 75 years of establishment of diplomatic relations. Diverse areas of the India-Italy Strategic Partnership and cooperation in areas like defence and new and emerging technologies were also took stock of the progress. For the greater global good both the Prime Ministers noted the need for G7 and G20 to work in consonance. Prime Minister Modi got appreciation for the successful G20 Summit by Prime Minister Meloni.



CONFLUENCE: BRIDGING BHARAT AND ITALY

Aditi Mahavidyalaya is proud to showcase and discuss the "Confluence: Bridging Bharat and Italy" and express gratitude to the University of Delhi for giving the college this unparalleled opportunity. India and Italy have known for their ancient civilizations and rich cultural heritages. Italian port cities were important trading posts on the spice route for over 2000 years, which offered opportunities for interactions in the fields of art, culture and philosophy. In 85 AD, Emperor Domitian built 'Piazza Navona' which restored in the third century has four fountains refereeing four rivers in which Ganga was also represent in addition to Danube, Nile and Rio della Plata. A street was also named after Maharshi Valmiki in Rome. Many streets, squares and schools are also named after many Indian leaders in which Mahatma Gandhi is prominent one. . 'The Divine Comedy', written by Dante Alighieri, referred Indus and Ganga rivers in his poem. During virtual summit of India-Italy in November 2020, former Prime Minister of Italy Mr. Giuseppe told the Prime Minister of India that Dante had referred the river Ganges, in his epic poem "Divine Comedy".

The travel of the Venetian merchant, Marco Polo to India in the 13th century and travelogue about his experiences; Mahatma Gandhi's visit to Rome in December 1931 and presence of Indian troops during the World War II in Italy can significantly seen as bond between countries At present, after the UK, Italy has second largest Indian diaspora in Europe.



Since 1976, bilateral agreement for cultural cooperation between India and Italy had been in existence. Under the Cultural Exchange Programme (CEP) a renewed agreement in 2004, offers a general framework for facilitating the exchanges. recently Italian Prime Minister signed MoU by renowned Yoga Associa-tion named 'Sarva Yoga International' with Morarji Desai National Institute of Yoga. Italian Hindu Union (IHU) in Dec 2012 was ratified by the Italian Parliament. Its aim is to promote the study and research of the ancient philosophical and religious traditions of Hinduism under 'Sanatan Dharma'. Since 2015, Italy has recognized 'Deepawali' as the official festival, at the Senate premises Deepawali celebrations are held annually.

In November 2020, during the Virtual Summit between PM Modi and PM Conte, they have exchanged Notes on the Rules of Procedure for approval of co-production status between the countries. In 2006, a Memorandum of Understanding signed between the Ministry of Cultural Heritage and Activities of the Government of Italy and the Ministry of Culture of the Government of India on cooperation for conservation of paintings of the Ajanta and Ellora caves, MoUs/Agreements were also signed between Indian and Italian universities and institutions.

Departments of Indian Studies, where Indian languages such as Hindi, Tamil, Urdu, Sanskrit and other subjects such as history of modern India, Indian culture, art, religion and philosophy, and also Indian performing arts are taught in several universities in Italy. On April 22, 2021, MoU was signed to renew the cooperation and decided to finalize the agreement for the establishment of a shortterm ICCR Chair in the University from 2021-2026 between the Indian Council for Cultural Relations (ICCR) and the University of Naples L'Orientale. during 2020-2021, Approximate 4920 Indian students were studying in various universities in Italy.

Many Italians such as Ileana Citaristi, an Italian-born Indian Odissi and Chhau dancer known for Indian dances, is the first dancer of foreign origin to be conferred the 'Padma Shri' for her contributions to the Odissi. The Indian Council for Cultural Relations (ICCR) awarded the Distinguished Alumni Award to Francesca Cassio, Professor of Music, in recognition of the significant achieve-ments in the field of Indian music and promoting goodwill and friendship between Italy and India. The Indian Prime Minister's Award 2019 was awarded to Antonietta Rozzi for outstanding contribution for promotion of Yoga. To popularize Indian Culture under the framework of the 150th anniversary of Gandhiji periodical and stand-alone events

were organized by the Embassy of India, Rome in collaboration with various local cultural, spiritual associations and academic institutions including universities. Important one are - Italian Association of Sanskrit Studies, Sakshi Association, Italian Yoga Federation, Sarva Yoga International, Sanatana Dharma Samgha (Gitananda Yoga), IYENGAR Yoga, Sri Sri School of Yoga, Self-Realization Fellowship - Rome, 3HO Healthy Happy & Holy Organization, Sahaja Yoga, Isha Foundation, Heartfulness, Asia Institute Turin (AIT), Italian Hindu Union(IHU), , Italian Institute for the Mediterranean and Oriental Studies (ISMEO), International Institute of South Asian Studies (ISAS) etc.

The college library committee created the Graduate Research Seminar GRADS as a way to promote and support undergraduate research writing and presentation. The University of Delhi's many colleges responded enthusiastically to the Committee's invitation to submit research papers for reading and essay submission for the second edition of GRADS, which was held on October 12, 2023.
