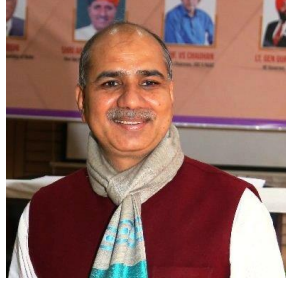

## प्राचार्या की कलम से



मुझे वर्ष 2023-24 के लिए अदिति महाविद्यालय की वार्षिक रिपोर्ट साझा करते हुए अत्यंत हर्ष हो रहा है। महाविद्यालय ने विविधता, समावेश और सामाजिक प्रासंगिकता के सिद्धांत पर काम किया है। महाविद्यालय ने इस वर्ष लगभग 28 प्लेसमेंट और 30 इंटरशिप के साथ अन्य लक्ष्यों को प्राप्त करने के लिए कड़ी मेहनत की है। महाविद्यालय का बुनियादी ढांचे पर भी काम हुआ है, रैंप का निर्माण किया गया है, ग्रिल और होल्लिंग पाइप लगाए गए हैं और शौचालयों को उन्नत किया गया है। इन बदलावों से महाविद्यालय में सुधार हुआ है। छात्राएं महाविद्यालय के आसपास के गांवों में इको-टूरिज्म और ग्रामीण पर्यटन को बढ़ावा देने के कार्य में अपना सहयोग दे रही हैं।

एनसीसी की छात्राओं ने हमेशा की तरह अपनी गतिविधियों का बखूबी प्रदर्शन किया और पीएम की रैली का हिस्सा बन खेलों में बहुत अच्छा प्रदर्शन किया। अन्य रचनात्मक स्नातक परियोजनाओं में भी जैसे नशीली दवाओं के दुरुपयोग और सौर ऊर्जा से संबंधित मुद्दों को भी हमारी छात्राएं बढ़चढ़कर अपना सहयोग दे रही हैं। महाविद्यालय के महिला विकास सेल ने एक कानूनी साक्षरता पाठ्यक्रम आयोजित किया और छात्राओं की समस्याओं के समाधान के लिए कानूनी सेल भी स्थापित किया गया है। असेसमेंट डेवलपमेंट सेल के तहत कई सर्वेक्षण किए गए हैं। कई ऑडिट भी किए गए हैं। एनईपी का कार्यान्वयन भी सफलतापूर्वक किया गया है।

छात्राओं के बीच जागरूकता बढ़ाने के लिए, चुनावी साक्षरता क्लब शुरू किया गया है जहाँ छात्राओं द्वारा चुनाव कराने में सरकारी एजेंसियों की मदद की। उन्होंने चुनाव बूथों तक बुजुर्ग लोगों के परिवहन और आवाजाही में भी मदद की। महाविद्यालय में विंग्स नामक एक इन्क्यूबेशन सेल की स्थापना की गई है। कई व्याख्याताओं ने स्कोपस-अनुक्रमित पत्रिका में पत्र प्रकाशित किए हैं और महाविद्यालय ने अपनी खुद की एक पत्रिका शुरू की है। संकाय विकास कार्यक्रमों के साथ-साथ व्याख्याताओं की क्षमता निर्माण अच्छी गति से चल रहा है।

महाविद्यालय में आपदा प्रबंधन प्रशिक्षण भी दिया गया तथा राष्ट्रीय आपदा प्रबंधन संस्थान एवं ज़ोन 4 सॉल्यूशंस के साथ लगभग 300 प्रतिभागियों के लिए आपदा प्रबंधन पर ऑनलाइन सम्मेलन भी किया गया। संकट के समय में उससे प्रभावी ढंग से निपटने के लिए महाविद्यालय ने आपदा प्रबंधन योजना भी तैयार की है। कॉलेज ने एसईएस आरईसी (सामाजिक उद्यमिता, स्वच्छता और ग्रामीण सहभागिता सेल) को सफलतापूर्वक तैयार किया है और महात्मा गांधी ग्रामीण शिक्षा परिषद, डी.एच.ई., एम.ओ.ई. के माध्यम से अपशिष्ट प्रबंधन, जल प्रबंधन, ऊर्जा संरक्षण, हरियाली, पोस्ट कोविड -19 में सुधार के लिए 10 कार्य समूहों का गठन किया है।

## DEPARTMENTAL ACHIEVEMENTS

### DEPARTMENT OF CHEMISTRY

Event: Student development program on Traditional Science and Digital Empowerment

The Department of Chemistry, Aditi Mahavidyalaya organized a two days Student development program on Traditional Science and Digital Empowerment on 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> August 2023. The event was organized in association with the Value Added Course (VAC) program committee of the college and was meant to enhance the understanding of participants in the field of science in ancient India and recent technological applicability of digital platforms in modern time. Dr. Bhupender Singh, Chemistry department served as the Convener of the SDP event with continuous support from Prof. Pooja Khanna, Coordinator of VAC programs.

The invited speakers for the event were Dr. Nityanand Agasti from Deen Dayal Upadhyaya College, University of Delhi, Dr. Reema Thareja from Shyama Prasad Mukherji College for Women, University of Delhi, Dr. Lokesh Rana, Zakir Husain Delhi College, University of Delhi, Dr. Pankaj Kumar Kandpal from Deshbandhu College, University of Delhi, New Delhi. Dr. Nityanand Agasti discussed the Indian contribution in the field of Chemistry in ancient times. He deliberated about the existence of different advanced chemistries in ancient India, particularly the metallurgy of copper (in the form of alloys as Bronze – Copper and Tin, and Brass – Copper and Zinc) during the Bronze age civilization. Further, emergence of Iron extraction and tools made up of Iron metal during the Iron age civilization enumerated the mighty existence of metallurgical chemistry in ancient India. Dr. Reema Thareja discussed the various practices of cyber security in digital platforms. She discussed with students about various methods being adopted to keep digital platforms safe and secure for the users including the two step authentication methods for email programs logins, message encryption (and decryption) technologies, secure transmissions of information via encryption (like emails and messages), and final discussion about the new secure software/operating system being developed by the India/Indian government. Dr. Lokesh Rana gave a detailed deliberation of astronomical objects, the mythological phrases with their relation to the existence of astronomical objects like distance between Sun, Moon and Earth. The students enjoyed the learning of calculations used in measuring the distances between different stars, planets, satellites, and asteroids. Dr. Pankaj

Kandpal discussed the ethical issues involved while using the digital platforms like emails, messages, photo sharing, social media platforms etc. He also briefed the students about the need and implementation of Right to Information action along with discussion about the procedure to be followed for getting information using RTI (Right To Information). There was active participation by twenty-five students of the college in this event.

All participating students were provided with refreshments, ensuring a comfortable and enjoyable visit. Dr. Parul Chopra and Dr. Lovely Chauhan efficiently coordinated the trip, ensuring smooth logistics and enriching learning opportunities for the students throughout the visit. Overall, the visit to the National Art and Craft Museum was a valuable educational experience, allowing students to appreciate India's rich artistic heritage, craftsmanship, and cultural diversity. It complemented their academic studies by providing practical exposure to traditional art forms and crafts.

## DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION – B.El.Ed

Department of Education at Aditi Mahavidyalaya is running Bachelor of Elementary Education (B.El.Ed.) and BA (P) (Education) programmes. The academic session 2023-24 was an eventful session full of workshops and activities.

The brief mention of the activities and events of the department are as follows:

### Compulsory Activities/ Workshops:

- The Orientation of the B.El.Ed. and B.A. First year students were held on Nov 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2023-24. Students were oriented about their theory and practicum courses, their importance, criteria and annual examination. Rules and regulations of the college regarding attendance and internal assessment were also briefed to students.
- Students learnt techniques of theatre for enhancing teaching – learning in a school classroom. Theatre workshops were organized throughout the year for the B.El.Ed first year students by Mr. Manish Saini, National School Drama. These workshops provided an opportunity to discover the links between education and theatre.
- Skills of craft in paperwork (origami, paper cutting, collage making), painting (drawing, batik, tie and dye), clay modeling, mask making, puppet making, and paper mache were enhanced through craft workshops held by Ms. Harpreet Kaur throughout the year.
- School Contact Programme was organized in various MCD schools near Aditi Mahavidyalaya, Bawana for B.El.Ed first year students. This practicum enabled students to explore creative ways of organising activities with children. Eight to ten students were placed under the mentorship of one teacher, who provided regular feedback.
- Self Development workshops for the B.El.Ed second year students were conducted by Miss Rabeea Saba Kosar, (Free-lancer). These workshops helped students to being aware of their strengths and limitations, developing sensitivity, open mindedness, positive attitudes and ability to communicate with children and adults.
- Story telling sessions were organized by Ms Isha Bhargava and Arshad Alam Khoobi and his team from Talent Delhi 6 Quissa Goi for the BEIEd second year students. These workshops focused on skills of story-telling and how to use stories as a medium to facilitate expression, imagination and creative use.
- Innovative School Visit in the physical mode for B.El.Ed third year students were organized by Mr Hemant an innovative school visit to Digantar Shiksha Evam Khelkud Samiti located at Jaipur, Rajasthan.

- Students taught for a block period of 2 weeks in pairs in a government elementary school. They choose two or three topics or units of study in each subject with the aim to develop these units. These units could be those which the students have critically analysed.
- Mr Himmat Singh Negi, theatre artist, actor, director and trainer associated with Jazba theatre group and directed famous plays like Court Martial, Mayaram ki Maya and Madhavi, conducted theatre workshops for BEEd third year students throughout the year. It focused on developing linkages between theatre and various school subjects. It also helped learners' in realizing their own potential.
- B.El.Ed third year students were placed in different MCD schools in Delhi for school observations and teaching of primary school children.. The purpose of these observations was to document and reflect on actual classroom practices of teachers engaged in teaching of language, mathematics and environmental studies. During their teaching students developed and transacted thematic plans in the different subject areas to explore different ways of working with children.
- The academic session for B.El.Ed. 4<sup>th</sup> year began on 20<sup>th</sup> July 2022. The compulsory practicum component School Internship forms a major part of B.El.Ed 4<sup>th</sup> year curriculum. According to the course guidelines, students were placed in schools for an overall period of 16-17 weeks (depending upon the working days). This included nearly one week for observation and teaching for approx 12-13 weeks in MCD primary schools (classes 1<sup>st</sup> to 5<sup>th</sup>) and for 4- 6 weeks in Delhi Administration middle schools (classes 6<sup>th</sup> to 8<sup>th</sup>). They carried out various internship related practicum like maintaining regular planning files, writing reflective journals, doing research based internship projects, and developing resource rooms as colloquial activity in schools. They performed all duties of regular teachers (except financial matters).

SUPPLEMENTARY / ADDITIONAL ACTIVITIES / SEMINAR / WORKSHOP  
ORGANIZED BY B.EL.ED DEPARTMENT 2023-24

- On the occasion of Teachers' day (5<sup>th</sup> September 2022), Department of Education organized an online programme on the Theme: "Idea of Teacher and Teaching in NEP- 2020". The Keynote speaker for the programme was Dr Sanjay Sharma from School of Educational Studies ,Hari Singh Gour Vishwavidyalaya, Sagar, M.P. He highlighted the role of NEP 2020 in the progression of teacher education which was followed by an interesting discussion by the faculty and students.
- An orientation on "Happiness Curriculum" was organized on November 11<sup>th</sup> 2022. Dr. KaramVir Singh from SCERT was invited as the resource person. He talked at length about implementation of the Happiness Curriculum in the school education system.

Various batches of B.El.Ed. Alumni attended this occasion with happy smiles and relived their fond memories of the college days.
- Participation in 65<sup>Th</sup> Annual Flower Show, University Of Delhi: As a preparation for the event Garden committee 2023-23, Aditi Mahavidyalaya, organised craft based workshops for B.El.Ed. year students on 20<sup>th</sup> and 22<sup>nd</sup> February 2023. During these workshops, our resource person Ms. Harpreet Kaur facilitated students to innovate a wide variety of flower pots and

planter pots using readily available material and waste water bottles. It was an enriching experience for students and they all enjoyed enhancing their creative skills. Our students, under the guidance of Garden Committee 2023-24, then participated in Delhi University 65<sup>th</sup> Annual flower show (Pushpotsava 2023) on 2<sup>nd</sup> March 2023, held at Buddha Garden, North Campus to celebrate the centennial blossoming of University of Delhi. Theme for our stall was to promote Sustainable Development Goals as proposed by the G20 Summit. It was done by creating awareness about reusing and recycling waste material such as old plastic bottles, coconut shells, glass bottles etc to be used as flower pots. Those pots were beautified using old clothes, jute threads and motifs, and planters were put for sale. Feedback books were filled by people who visited our stall at the event. They were highly appreciated by esteemed guests for their contribution in promoting sustainable development goals. - Parents and Teachers Interactions/ Meetings Held with B.El.Ed Students 2023-24: Online interaction cum orientation meetings were organized for B.El.Ed. students 2023-24 and their parents with the teachers of B.El.Ed. Department. The meetings for batches of B. El. Ed 4<sup>th</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, and 1<sup>st</sup> year students were held on different dates. The purpose of these sessions were to initiate Good Practices in the Department and develop a cordial atmosphere for students, parents and the department. **ONLINE WORKSHOP ON "GEOSPATIAL TECHNOLOGIES":** The three days online workshop was organized by the Department of Geography on 16<sup>th</sup> to 18<sup>th</sup> November 2024 at Google Meet platform in Collaboration with Swastik Edustart. The program started at 2:00PM with the welcome address by Miss Suhani. The guest speaker was Dr. Bratati Dey, ICSSR Post Doctoral Research Fellow (Founder member of Swastik Edustart). There were about 60 students of 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Year B.A. Geography students participated in the workshop. Opening remarks and introduction on the theme was given by Dr. Bratati. She highlighted numerous applications of Geographic Information System (GIS) and its relevance in the present context. Some of them were Geo-information, Maps, Predictions along with (A.I) and Estimations. The workshop ended at 4:00 PM on 18<sup>th</sup> November. Henceforth, the workshop served as a great learning opportunity for the participants and it successfully concluded.

**WORKSHOP ON FUNDAMENTALS OF REMOTE SENSING:** The department of Geography organized a workshop on "Career opportunities in Geo-Informatics" on 2<sup>nd</sup> December 2023 in the GIS lab of the Department of Geography for spreading awareness about career choices, Geospatial Programs and technologies in Geo-informatics among the students. This workshop was sponsored by Netra Institute of Geo-informatics on "Fundamentals of Remote Sensing", New Delhi. Total 50 students attended the Orientation including students from other courses as well. Mr. Ravindra Tiwari (Head of Dept- Geo-Informatics) and Ms. Devashri Talukar (Faculty, NIGMT) were resource persons. The workshop was organized for

B.A. (Hons) second and third year students the main goal of the workshop was to orient the students with respect to careers in GIS & Remote Sensing and to give an opportunity to experience hands-on practical on “ERDAS” a remote sensing software.

PTM/Parents Teachers Meeting (Online mode): The department of geography conducted an online PTM in the last week of March, 2024 for B.A. Hons and B.A. Programme semester II, IV and VI students. The meeting was headed by Prof. Punyatoya Patra, TIC, department of Geography along with senior faculty Dr. Anju Singh. All other faculty members joined according to their specializations. The purpose of the online PTM was to interact with parents regarding their wards performance in terms of their scholastic and co-scholastic areas with special focus on their attendance in classes. Various parents attended the online meeting along with their wards. It was observed that parents were very excited and enthusiastic about it.

ONE DAY LOCAL TRIP: One of the most exciting activities that everyone enjoys is the trips. The department of Geography organized a one day trip to Sanjay Van and a visit to JNU Campus for B.A.(Hons) Geography and B.A. Programme students whereas total 56 students along with six faculties visited the place. Sanjay Van is a large urban forest area near Vasant Kunj and Mehrauli in Delhi, India. It is spread over an area of 443 hectares. It is one of the densest forest areas in the green lungs of the city. After visiting Sanjay Van on the same day around at 4:00PM, students got an opportunity to interact with Professor Kaushal Kumar Sharma, Dean, School of Social Sciences, JNU at CSRD lecture hall in the SSS-III building. Prof. Sharma deliberated upon the importance of field trip and the nature of geographical enquiry one should look at as budding geographers. He stressed on the concepts of changing notion of space, time and reality and asked the students to survey among themselves about how they remember any particular phenomena or event and its linkage with the concept of mental map. He ended the interaction by wishing them all the best for their future and advised them to religiously follow college curriculum as it would help them build a better foundation for their future studies.

LONG EXCURSION FIELD TRIP: The Department has organized a one-week long field trip, i.e. from 3rd April to 10th April, 2024 to Vishakhapatnam and surrounding areas to study the impact of cyclones on the coastal region of Andhra Pradesh. In this trip thirty-seven students of B.A. Hons. Sem VI students along with four faculty members have visited Cyclone Warning Centre, University of Andhra Pradesh, fishermen villages to collect both secondary and primary

data related to their study. In the Cyclone Warning Centre, the students were exposed to all the equipment and methods used to warn the local people during the advent of cyclones. Prof. P. Suneetha, Head, Department of Meteorology and Oceanography, Andhra University has given the exposure to our students regarding the types of research they are doing on cyclones in their department. Prof. K. Srinivas Rao, Principal, College of Science and Technology, Andhra University also interacted and guided our students. Our students with the help of the students of Andhra university have interviewed little more than 400 villagers of Jallaripet and Bimanipattanam villages using the structured questionnaire. As a part of the curriculum, the students have written individual reports on the basis of their field study. Besides, during the field study, they have also visited Rushikonda beach, Borra caves, coffee plantation areas and tribal museum in Araku valley.

“DHARITRI” GEO-FEST 2024: “Dharitri” – The Geographical Society organized an Annual Inter-college Geo-Fest on 18th April, 2024 on the theme "Women at the forefront of climate action", which was inspired by the UN International themes. To speak on the theme, a dynamic feminist academician Prof. Anindita Datta, Head, Department of Geography, Delhi School of Economics, University of Delhi was invited as resource person. She delivered a talk on the topic “*Women at the forefront of climate action: Feminist Solidarity, mutual aid and Gendered Possibilities to build back better in crisis and recovery*”. She begins by stating that Disasters are typically perceived as tragedies resulting in the loss of lives and property. However, adding a different perspective to it, she argues that disasters are a ‘window of opportunity’ to build back better, that is they present a chance to address pre-existing conditions, such as sex equity. Through the process of recovery and rebuilding after a calamity strike, we can actually create a more utopian and more egalitarian society.

In order to create awareness among the students, a group dance followed by a *Nukkad Natak* was performed by our students with a focus on the significance of the role of women in the society and climate change. Further in line, various inter-college competitions were organized namely, Tulika the Poster making competition, through my lenses (Reel making and Photography competition, Magellan of Globe the Map Pointing and Quiz and Khul ja-sim-sim the Treasure Hunt, wherein, total around 150 students from different colleges of Delhi University were participated. Further to that, the prize distribution ceremony and the group photographs were conducted at last.

B.EL.ED. Second year Field Trip: The survey covered a full inventory of soils in relation to the geomorphological setting, their morphological and physio-chemical properties, taxonomic classification, problems and potentialities associated with the soils, their management needs and recommendations for scientific land use planning. The department of geography conducted a field survey for B.El.Ed. second year students along with 3 faculties to Kamla Nehru Ridge, University of Delhi. They have gained very insightful and interesting knowledge about the Kamla Nehru Ridge that is home to a diverse range of flora and fauna, showcasing the rich biodiversity of the area. Students encountered various species of plants and animals, highlighting the importance of preserving such natural habitats in urban environments. They also experienced a butterfly conservatory. Students got to know about the different species of butterflies and their host plants; some of those plants are very common and can be seen in our houses as well. There was a historical monument like the flagstaff tower and the Chaurburja Masjid is also located which is the main stream of the 1857 revolt. As a part of curriculum 27 students have attended the trip to Delhi University Ridge area and prepared the report.

**EARTH DAY CELEBRATION:** The department of Geography in collaboration with Eco Club and Department of History organized Earth Day on 22<sup>nd</sup> April, 2024. The spirit of the event was laid in the theme of “plastic v/s planet” which not only aimed to spread a vibrant light on the malicious use of plastic but a reminder that we are the only ones who can make it possible. To fulfill the noble cause, our guest speaker, Mr. Aditya Patel, Assistant Director, DRDO, Ministry of Defence, Government of India, provided a wonderful insight on the matter through his informative speech. In conclusion, Mr. Patel added, “Indiscipline leads to another indiscipline but discipline can also lead to discipline as well”. With reference to the book “Atomic Habits”, he encouraged the audience to inculcate small but productive habits in their lives. Youth with their ultimate potential can steer the wheel of change not only in terms of plastic misuse but also with other ecological problems faced by. We are not at a war with plastic but we are indeed on a war with misuse of it and the consequences faced by the innocent. Everyone enjoyed the event.

Eminent counsellors from I.B.H.A.S. Ms. Rashi Manaktala and Ms. Elica Anand were invited as resource persons to conduct the program. Principal of the college Prof. Mamta Sharma congratulated Prof. Sadhna Jain, Convener of the Skill Development Committee, and Prof. Manisha Wadhva, Nodal Officer 'Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav' for this noble endeavor, and warmly welcomed the speakers as well as students for beginning the new academic session with such a sensitive discussion. Under her esteemed leadership, our college has always stood as a weapon for the all-round development of students to ensure their present and future well-being. She enlightened the students about 4 quotients that everyone ought to work on to achieve mental,

physical, and social fitness. These were the Intelligence Quotient which represents the intellect of the students, Emotional Quotient representing their character, the Social Quotient which represents personal charisma and the Adversity Quotient, a new paradigm in self-development that ensures coming out of adverse situations without hampering the natural course of life. Citing example of the J.K. Rowling, she stressed that students to have an open-minded approach and a firm belief in themselves to achieve accomplishment. Prof. Sharma encouraged the students to dream and envision big, take utmost care of their health, and remain connected to their loved ones to have a fulfilling life. Ms. Elica an alumni of Aditi, expressed her happiness to come back to college now as a mentor of students and explained how the college had played a role in mentoring her path. The resource persons oriented students about the importance of physical and emotional health, and that the two go hand in hand in making a complete individual. The students were explained about numerous disorders and neural challenges they or someone they know might be facing, and that their existence is more prevalent than we know. The first step in treating the patient is acceptance of the situation and believing that it is real and can be cured. They explained that lack of awareness of the mental disorders and societal stigma associated with them causes disease aggradation in many cases. Students were curious to know if they could help someone facing such a challenge and were happy to learn that they also could contribute towards well being of the patient even from a close distance. The relevance of the topic in today's youth can be seen in the increasing number of young self-acclaimed deaths, who are not able to face the adversities life throws with self-belief, and they give up on the beautiful gift 'life' that the creator has chosen for them. The session reached fruition with students' queries being efficiently answered by the esteemed resource persons with a promise to conduct such sessions soon for other students of the college too.

3.RCI approved Continuous Rehabilitation Education for Special Educators on Social Communication Disorders

A Three-day National level Continuous Rehabilitation Education (CRE) approved by the Rehabilitation Council of India (RCI) has been organized by Aditi Mahavidyalaya in joint

collaboration with IAHRW and Bharati College University of Delhi from 17.8.23-19.8.23 on Social Communication Disorders (SCD) with the inspiration of Prof Mamta Sharma. It was jointly organized by Aditi Mahavidyalaya, Bharati College Janakpuri, and the Indian Association of Health, Research, and Welfare. More than 300 participants from eight states attended it. Each day had two sessions.

Prof Mamta Sharma, Principal Aditi Mahavidyalaya addressed the esteemed gathering of professionals. She mentioned that the event not only showcases our commitment to understanding and addressing crucial challenges but also emphasizes the power of knowledge and collective efforts in shaping a more inclusive and empathetic society. She mentioned that while communication is the cornerstone of human relationships, for some, it can be a complex puzzle to decipher. People with SCD may experience difficulties in understanding and using verbal and nonverbal communication cues, which can include gestures, facial expressions, body language, and even tone of voice. She emphasized that as educators and responsible members of society, it becomes our duty to embrace and support those who grapple with Social Communication Disorders. We must strive to create an environment where understanding prevails over judgment, where patience triumphs over impatience, and where inclusivity is valued over exclusivity.

Prof Saloni Gupta, Principal of Bharati College mentioned while addressing the gathering that in a world that thrives on interconnectedness and communication, it is essential for us to recognize the challenges faced by individuals who experience Social Communication Disorder. She emphasized that by engaging in discussions, workshops, and sharing of experiences, we have the chance to reshape our perspectives and attitudes towards Social Communication Disorder.

The sessions were taken by eminent clinical psychologists, therapists, and special educators like Dr. Roma Kumar, Ms. Satinder Kaur Walia, Dr. Ashima Srivastava, Ms. Rashi Bijlani-Dance Movement Therapy, Ms. Sonam Sachdeva, and Dr. Archana Sharma. The eminent speakers delve into its etiology, diagnosis, characteristics, role of dance movement therapy, evidence-based interventions, and the role of parents, practitioners, and special educators in Social Communication Disorders.

Prof Sharma, in the valedictory session, emphasized the need to create a more empathetic and effective learning environment, ensuring a brighter future for individuals affected by SCD by

tailoring interventions to individual needs in their work settings through the learnings imbibed by the CRE.

Dr Sonia Kaushik on behalf of Prof Saloni Gupta, Principal Bharati College, wished all success to the participants and expected each participant to take the learnings to their workplace and execute it for the betterment of mankind.

On April 22, 2024, EMPATHY, the Psychology Association of Aditi Mahavidyalaya, hosted a seminar on "Scopes and Careers in Psychology" with Dr. Akanksha Bhatia, a career counsellor and founder of Manrahi, as the resource person. The seminar provided insights into various psychology career paths, including college options, admission criteria, salary prospects, and more. The first session focused on emerging fields and CUET exam policies, while the second session highlighted career prospects across traditional and offbeat psychology disciplines. Dr. Bhatia addressed queries with clarity, leaving students grateful for the valuable guidance and inspiration in their psychology career journey.

On April 23, 2024, EMPATHY, the Psychology Association of Aditi Mahavidyalaya, in collaboration with Jaipuria Institute of Management, hosted a session on "Leveraging LinkedIn" with Asst. ## **DEPARTMENT OF SOCIAL WORK**

### **Orientation Programme**

The day continued with discussions on the global agenda for social work in 2030, narratives of empowerment, cross-cultural competencies, and problem-solving techniques. An interactive feedback session allowed students to reflect on their field experiences, fostering a deeper understanding of real-world applications. On the final day, a panel discussion on 'Inclusive Development in India' brought together esteemed resource persons, including Prof. Archana Kaushik from the University of Delhi and Mrs. Rita Panicker Pinto from Butterflies NGO. Coordinated by Dr. Aneesh T.V. and guided by Dr. Seema Rani, the session, moderated by Prof. Sunita Bahmani, delved into the challenges and achievements in fostering inclusive growth in India, drawing from the rich experiences of the panelists. The Orientation Programme proved to be highly successful, equipping students with a comprehensive understanding of social work's intricacies. From theoretical foundations to hands-on experiences, the programme ensured that students are well-prepared for the multifaceted journey ahead in the realm of social work.

### Panel Discussion on “Inclusive Development In India”

The concept of ‘Inclusive Development’ is one of the major themes of 'Panch Pran' announced by the Hon'ble Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi. The Department of Social Work organised a panel discussion on 'Inclusive Development in India' on August 18, 2023, as part of the closing ceremony of the Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav celebration, in the library reading hall of Aditi Mahavidyalaya, Bawana. Dr. Seema Rani delivered the welcome speech as well as the keynote address. The principal, Prof. Mamata Sharma, delivered the inaugural speech. Dr. Manisha Wadha, Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav's Nodal Officer, attended the occasion and delivered a speech. Prof. Sunita Bahmani, Professor of Social Work at Aditi Mahavidyalaya, introduced distinguished panellists and moderated panel discussions. One of the resource persons was Prof. Archana Kaushik, a professor of social work at the University of Delhi. Professor Kaushik has made significant contributions to gerontological social work. She discussed the demographic transition and the importance of older people's values and experiences in the development of nations. She also emphasised the country's growing elderly population and the role of youth in protecting and collaborating with elders for inclusive development in India. Rita Panicker is the founder and director of Butterflies, a non-governmental organisation in New Delhi that has been working since 1989 to protect and empower street-connected and vulnerable children. Rita was invited to join the Committee for drafting the Model Guidelines for Foster Care Assessment and Monitoring Manual, 2005, by the Ministry of Women and Child Development, Government of India. Mrs. Rita shared the experience of the NGO Butterflies, which implemented various measures to combat poverty during COVID. She discusses the importance of economic freedom and financial independence for street-connected children in terms of an inclusive development approach. She presented several case studies involving the NGO Butterflies' money-saving programmes for street-connected children. The panel discussion highlighted distinctive interventions by civil society organisations in the areas of elderly people and children to ensure inclusive development. Students had the opportunity to learn about various case studies of non-governmental organisations (NGOs) working with the elderly and children in the development field. The closing ceremony ended with a vote of thanks by Dr. Aneesh T.V. coordinator of the programme.

Online session on “Social Work Response to Environmental Sustainability”

The Department of Social Work, Aditi Mahavidyalaya, University of Delhi, in collaboration with the National Association of Professional Social Workers in India (NAPSWI), organized an online session on 'Social Work Response to Environmental Sustainability' on 20<sup>th</sup> August 2023. Career Guidance session was organized on 21<sup>st</sup> March 2024 by the Department of Social Work. The objective was to explore and familiarize students with various academic aspects of different universities. Prof. Beena Antony Reji (Field Work Coordinator) welcomed both the resource persons. Mr. Ram Chauhan introduced himself and his prominent organization named Silver Line Foundation, which has its head office in Dwarka, Delhi. He introduced his vision and the target population of the organization, which is children and women. He provided information about many projects run by the organization. Mr. Akhand from ISRD, who is also an advocate, works for TI and mainly focuses on HIV/AIDS & Drug users. He is working in the South West Delhi region. Thirty-three students attended and participated in the session.

#### Webinar on the "Scope of Social Work"

The Department of Social Work organized a webinar on the "Scope of Social Work" on March 23rd, 2024. Dr. Kirti Arya, Medical Social Welfare Officer at AIIMS, New Delhi, served as the resource person for the webinar. Dr. Arya provided insights into the nature and scope of medical and psychiatric social work in India, drawing from her extensive experience at AIIMS, particularly during the pandemic. She emphasized the pivotal role of social work within multidisciplinary teams and shared valuable perspectives on the significance of social work in addressing public health, mental health, and counseling challenges. The session proved enlightening for students, introducing them to emerging areas within the field of social work and highlighting the crucial role it plays in various sectors of society.

#### **Rural Camp**

During the academic year 2023-2024, the rural camp was organized at the Young Men's Christian Association (YMCA), Campsite, Sattal, Uttarakhand from 1st April to 4th April 2024. YMCA is a non-governmental federation, with each independent local YMCA affiliated with its national organization. The organization strives for human empowerment, harmony, and high ethical standards. Mr. Harshul, the assistant secretary of the YMCA, described the history and significance of the YMCA and shared the vision, mission, and activities of the YMCA in India. Students visited Kotani and Mehra villages and conducted various Participatory Rural Appraisal (PRA) techniques such as Transect walks, social and resource mapping, daily routine, seasonal

diagrams, and timelines. Dr. Seema Rani, Teacher in Charge (TIC), Dr. Mali Devi Sawariya, Dr. Aneesh T.V., and Dr. Rakesh Choudhary accompanied students to the village for PRA. The field coordinator of the YMCA mobilized SHG members for PRA. Students conducted presentations based on PRA conducted in villages before faculty members and Mr. Harshul, the assistant secretary of the YMCA.

#### Webinar on "Accessing Universities for Social Work as a Career: An Awareness Session"

The Department of Social Work successfully hosted a webinar titled "Accessing Universities for Social Work as a Career: An Awareness Session" on Wednesday, April 17th, 2024, from 5 PM to 6 PM. Coordinated by Dr. Mali Devi Sawariya, this webinar aimed to provide valuable insights for students interested in pursuing social work as a career path. Targeted specifically at second and third-year students pursuing B.A. (H) in Social Work, the webinar served as a vital platform for students to gain insights into university admissions and career prospects in the field. The session, hosted on Google Meet, was attended by 25 students who actively engaged with Dr. Kapoor, asking questions and discussing various aspects of social work education and careers. Through collaborative efforts and insightful discussions, the webinar significantly enhanced awareness and empowered students to make informed decisions about their academic and professional futures. 3. Group Discussion (Samvad): Social Media and the Presentation of Self: A Game Changer or Status Quo-ist, 6/4/2024. The event garnered an enthusiastic response from students. It was argued that it is a Game Changer as it sometimes helps to bridge inter- generational gap by teaching-learning of new skills; provides a global reach for marketing; encourages creativity and enhances knowledge through virtual student mobility. Others argued that Social Media is not encouraged in rural india, especially for women; based on algorithm, it doesn't suggest content that one doesn't like, thus re-affirming the established opinions.

4. The Department also brought out its Newsletter- The Sentinel on 'Women Led Development'. Envisioning development as expansion of freedom and capabilities, it chronicled women of substance, national and international, besides 'My Very Own Icon' depicting the unsung contributions of women of everyday.

The Keynote address on this occasion was given by Mr. Vijay Kumar, Chairperson Katha Manch, Delhi. Ms. Arpna Founder Chenab Hills 'KitabGhar' Jammu and Kashmir, Joint Presentation by Mr. Murari Jha and Mr. Chandan Jha Fulbright scholars on the topic 'Building Bridges through Books: Read with a Teacher', Experience sharing from Umang Democratic School, Ganaur, Sonipat, Haryana Workshop "Dafli Sang Samwa" by Katha Manch Kurukshetra Team (Haryana) under the leadership of Mr. Virendra and Mr. Rahul Nagpal, were the major highlights of the day 1.

Inaugural session of Day 2 started with lightening of lamp, university kulgeet followed by college kulgeet and felicitation of the invited guests and speakers. Opening of the abstract booklet was done .Dr. Punita Gupta (Convener Library Committee and organiser of the seminar cum workshop recited the famous poem of Late Md. Safdar Hazmi '*kitaabein kuch kahna chaahti hai...*'. Prof. Dr. Mamta Sharma, the principal, gave the welcome speech. Her talk focused on the value of reading and writing for pupils and how it fosters the development of stronger communication and creative skills. She emphasized the complete personality development that comes from reading well. Mr. Vijay Kumar, the Katha Manch Chairperson, discussed the seminar's scope. He reiterated the clearly defined goals and the ways in which these two days of discussion would benefit teachers, students, librarians, and readers.

Prof. Ravinder Kumar, Chair of the College's Governing Body, Dean of the Cultural Council University, and Head of the Punjabi Department at the University of Delhi, presided over the session. During his presentation, he talked about some of his college and early childhood recollections as well as the importance of books in life. He used several traditional Punjabi texts to demonstrate his thought process. The Chief Guest of the University of Delhi's Faculty of Law,

Prof. Rajani Abbi, Proctor, delivered the presidential address. Prof. Abbi spoke mostly about young people's involvement in nation-building and the role that reading well plays in it.

Prof. K. P. Singh, the keynote speaker, discussed libraries and readability. He is the Director of Gandhi Bhawan, University of Delhi, and a professor in the department of library and information science at the University of Delhi, Treasurer College Governing Body. He included allusions to Puranic and Vedic texts in order to help students grasp the significance of reading and writing as well as the old customs. The discussion was lively and participatory. Prof. Neelam Rathi, who coordinates the IQAC, discussed the significance of these talks for academic institutions.

37 presenters including faculty, research scholars, librarians and undergraduate and postgraduate students delivered 23 research papers at the two locations. Seven Universities and Institutions, three departments from the University of Delhi, two departments from West Bengal and Uttarakhand, librarians from colleges, research scholars, MA MEd, MLiSc, BTech, BEIED, and honors geography students gave presentations on a range of topics linked to libraries and reading.

The post-lunch special lecture on Swadhyaya: The Art of Awareness and the Role of Hybrid Libraries in Raising Awareness was given by Prof. Rajesh Kumar, Professor of Practice, Yoga expert, Manav Rachna Institute of International Research and Studies.

Professor Ajay Pratap Singh, Director General of National Library of India, Ministry of Culture of India and Government of India was the guest of honor for the Valedictory session. Professor Singh highlighted the Indian library concepts of ancient times and the developments over the years and the role of technology in libraries and emerging concepts of e-libraries and e-books and how readers access these resources.

College inaugurated its human library during the Valedictory.

Overwhelming feedback was received from the participants (students and teachers) on both days. On the first day, 150 registered participants participated in the workshop, and on the second day, more than 200 participants participated in the paper presentations



2) The college library organized the second Graduate Research Seminar GRADS 2023 on October 12, 2023 under G20 Presidency on the

theme, “A Road to Rome: Bilateral ties between Bharat and Italy. Entries were invited in Essay and paper presentation categories. 20 Essays and more than 20 research papers and essay presentations were done by the students of different colleges and departments of University of Delhi. There were around 120 participants who attended the seminar along with the teachers. In order to facilitate a dialogue, each group had a teacher mentor/s. Participants presented their essays and papers on varieties of topics like food, tourism, trade, economy, geographical similarities and differences, international relations, social lives, culture etc. and how it can become a source to build long lasting relations between both the countries. Best Essays and presentations were awarded.

This seminar was an opportunity for graduate students to present their research and use the space for critical and reflective discussion of their research with other researchers and mentors.

### **MAGAZINE COMMITTEE- *ADITI LIPI***

The faculty and student representatives constitute the magazine and the newsletter committee. The Committee meets periodically to discuss and select articles for publication. Where necessary it also commissions articles from faculty and non-teaching staff of the college. The name *Aditi Lipi* is inspired by the essence of the word *Lipi*. It is the record, in writing, of the orality of a set of people. In the beginning people used figures of objects to express their ideas. They were called ‘pictorial writings’ and are found, even now, in caves around the world, where the aborigines lived. Gradually, letters took the place of pictures to convey the thoughts, ideas and feelings of all involved. Published annually, this is a third issue of *Aditi Lipi*. Earlier, the college magazine was published under the name of *Navya*. The magazine is published with the objective to provide a platform for students to express themselves through various forms of writing like research articles, comments on current topics, literary/ creative writing and general knowledge extracts. It encourages freedom of expression and provides a medium for exchange of thoughts and information.

Keeping this in view, Debating Society organized two debate competition in Hindi as well as English language in month of September, 2022. The topic of the debate was -Is being an entrepreneur better than being a government servant? /क्या एक उद्यमी होना सरकारी सेवक होने से बेहतर है ? Around 18 students participated in the competition from various departments such as BA (Programme), BA(H) Geography, B.El.Ed B.COM, B.COM HONOURS etc. Students performed exceedingly well and such was the finesse in their thought which made us think that the future of India is in bright hands. Cash prizes were given to the top three winners in both English and Hindi language individually.

## **SAKSHAM PRAMAAN PROJECT**

Aditi Mahavidyalaya under the Saksham Pramaan Project has collaborated with Tata Institute of Social Sciences (TISS) in supporting the National AIDS Control Organisation (NACO), Ministry of Health and Family Welfare in its fight against HIV/AIDS. This initiative is funded by an international organisation- Global Fund to fight against AIDS, Tuberculosis and Malaria (GFATM). This project supports the National AIDS Control Program by assisting in the evaluation of organisations working for High-Risk Groups (HRGs) and bridge populations (Migrants & Truckers) at the grass root level spread across the country. At Aditi Mahavidyalaya under this project, we are working on the capacity building of the evaluators and coordinating the evaluations of all Targeted Interventions (TI) and Link Worker Schemes (LWS) of the northern states of India. Aditi Mahavidyalaya is coordinating with the State AIDS Control Society (SACS) of 8 states and union territories- Jammu Kashmir, Ladakh, Punjab, Himachal Pradesh, Chandigarh, Haryana, Uttarakhand, Delhi and Uttar Pradesh.



The project has been completed 16 months in Aditi Mahavidyalaya since it started on 27<sup>th</sup> October 2021. The project's first task was to empanel evaluators for conducting evaluations of Targeted Interventions and Link Worker Schemes of the northern states of India. Saksham Pramaan started the project with selection of eligible evaluators and their empanelment. These selected evaluators received training in the virtual medium. So far, a total of 127 evaluators have been empanelled by the Saksham Pramaan project at Aditi Mahavidyalaya. Among these trained evaluators, 86 have participated in the Targeted Intervention & Link Worker Scheme evaluations in the states/UTs of the north zone.

The Saksham Pramaan project is also required to support and coordinate with the State AIDS Control Society for conducting evaluations in the regions. The planning of the evaluation calendar, scheduling the dates, selection of empanelled evaluators for conducting evaluations, report checking and their database management; these tasks are performed by Saksham Pramaan at Aditi Mahavidyalaya. There were 219 TI projects and 3 LWS projects evaluated in Financial Year 2021-22. In the current financial year 2023-24, a total of 71 TI projects and 6 LWS projects have been evaluated so far. Saksham Pramaan also participated in capacity building of project staff in November 2021 in Delhi & and Training Need Assessment (TNA) workshop in Bhubaneswar in January 2023.

### **UNNAT BHARAT ABHIYAN**

Unnat Bharat Abhiyan program was formally launched by the Ministry of Education (MoE) (formerly Ministry Human Resource Development (MHRD)) in presence of The President of India on 11th November, 2014. The Mission of Unnat Bharat Abhiyan is to enable higher educational institutions to work with the people of rural India, in five identified villages of Bawana around college in identifying development challenges and evolving appropriate solutions for accelerating sustainable growth.

### **VOICES SOCIETY**

On August 19, 2023, the Voices Society of Aditi Mahavidyalaya, University of Delhi, organized a webinar titled "Voices Against Domestic Violence: Breaking the Walls" focusing on the legal provisions for protecting women against sexual harassment at the workplace in India. Under the guidance of Principal Prof. Mamta Sharma and with the support of Prof. Sunita Bahmani and Dr.

Mali Devi Sawariya, the event was coordinated by Kavita (President), Shagufta (Vice-President), and Kirti (Secretary). Prof. Neena Pandey from the Department of Social Work, University of Delhi, delivered a detailed presentation on the Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition, and Redressal) Act, 2013, outlining its key provisions and procedures. The event concluded with a vote of thanks by Dr. Mali Devi Sawariya and a feedback collection to gauge the impact of the webinar.

On July 14-15, 2023, the Voices Society, in collaboration with the National Service Scheme (NSS) of Aditi Mahavidyalaya, University of Delhi, organized a relief effort titled “Delhi Flood - Urgent Appeal for Contribution to Flood Relief Efforts.” Under the guidance of Principal Prof. Mamta Sharma, Programme Officer Dr. Mali Devi Sawariya, and Voices Society Coordinator Prof. Sunita Bahmani, with key student facilitators Kirti (President) and NSS volunteers, the initiative aimed to provide essential supplies to flood victims. The event was conducted in three phases: collection of essentials on July 14, procurement and organization on July 15, and distribution to affected areas like Kashmere Gate and Laxmi Nagar on July 16. Essential items distributed included dry rations, sanitary napkins, and packed food. A follow-up on July 19 involved further distribution and assessment of needs. The response highlighted critical needs such as clean water and medical treatment. Overall, the initiative effectively provided essential aid, demonstrating Aditi Mahavidyalaya’s commitment to community service and relief efforts.

On September 10, 2023, to mark World Suicide Prevention Day, the National Service Scheme (NSS) and Voices Society of Aditi Mahavidyalaya, University of Delhi, hosted a webinar titled "Life: A Pathway to Hope and Healing." The event, conducted under the guidance of Principal Prof. Mamta Sharma, NSS Programme Officer Dr. Mali Devi Sawariya, and Voices Society Coordinator Prof. Sunita Bahmani, featured Ms. Vaishali Goel, a counseling psychologist, as the resource person. The primary objective was to raise awareness about suicide, reduce the stigma around mental health issues, and provide support and resources for those at risk. The webinar began with an inauguration by Principal Sharma, followed by a discussion led by Dr. Mali on the importance of addressing suicide. Ms. Goel covered myths, facts, and strategies for dealing with suicidal thoughts, including warning signs and available support resources. The session concluded with a Q&A, where attendees engaged in discussions about recognizing suicidal tendencies and providing help. The event was well-attended by 40 volunteers, who gained valuable insights into suicide prevention. Overall, the webinar effectively met its objective of

increasing awareness and providing actionable information on suicide prevention, reflecting NSS and Voices Society's ongoing commitment to societal betterment.

- Attended the online Refresher Course on Social Work and Social Sciences (IDC) organized by the Centre for Professional Development in Higher Education (CPDHE), UGC-HRDC, University of Delhi, which took place from 22 August 2023 to 4 September 2023.
- On 2 June 2023, awarded certification as a trainer for imparting training on Prevention of Sexual Harassment (POSH).
- On 14 November 2023, received appreciation for the Remedial Classes Research Action Project Qadam, which benefited 40 children from Bawana J.J. Colony. This project was recognized as the best practice of the college in association with Our Rights Social Society.
- Served as a resource person on the Evaluation Panel for the workshop titled "Building and Sustaining Leadership and Capacity," conducted by the WAVE Foundation on 27 February 2024.
