Two Best Practices

1. Sustainability in Action: Building a Green and Responsible Future

Aditi Mahavidyalaya champions environmental sustainability through innovative and impactful initiatives that extend beyond the classroom. The college's Earth Day celebrations, themed "Plastic vs. Planet," emphasize the critical need to reduce plastic usage and adopt eco-friendly practices. The annual Food Fest showcases traditional Indian cuisine and millet-based recipes, promoting sustainable agricultural practices and raising awareness about the nutritional and environmental benefits of indigenous grains. Collaborations with the Eco Club further bolster the institution's green agenda through activities such as tree planting, waste recycling, and workshops on air quality and renewable energy. These efforts not only educate students about sustainability but also inspire them to become active participants in global environmental movements. By integrating environmental consciousness into academic and extracurricular activities, Aditi Mahavidyalaya nurtures a generation of environmentally responsible citizens.

2. Empowering Women: Bridging Justice, Health, and Leadership

Aditi Mahavidyalaya stands as a beacon of women empowerment, fostering inclusivity and self-reliance through targeted initiatives. Legal literacy workshops and the establishment of a legal aid clinic provide students and community members with critical knowledge and access to justice. Collaborations with the TISS SAKSHAM Project have led to impactful campaigns, such as TB awareness drives, addressing healthcare disparities among women. In the financial year 2023-24, the college evaluated 71 Targeted Intervention (TI) projects and six Link Worker Scheme (LWS) projects, reflecting its commitment to comprehensive outreach. Saksham Pramaan's participation in capacity-building workshops in Delhi (November 2021) and Training Need Assessment (TNA) sessions in Bhubaneswar (January 2023) further underscores this commitment. Skill-building workshops on self-defense, digital literacy, and women's rights equip students with tools for personal and professional growth. By addressing systemic barriers and promoting gender equity, Aditi Mahavidyalaya exemplifies a holistic approach to women's empowerment, ensuring their active participation in shaping a more equitable society.

Institutional Distinctiveness

Aditi Mahavidyalaya, a constituent college of the University of Delhi, exemplifies its institutional distinctiveness through its unwavering commitment to inclusivity, academic excellence, and community engagement. The college fosters holistic development by integrating skill-building, sustainability, and social responsibility into its educational framework. Distinctive initiatives include



promoting rural tourism, implementing the National Education Policy (NEP), and establishing the incubation cell "Prings" to encourage entrepreneurship.

Rooted in the philosophy of "This is mine, that is his," say the small-minded; the wise believe the world is one family (Maha Upanishad 6.71–75), the institution transcends traditional classroom learning. Students engage actively in societies, clubs, and workshops on digital literacy, legal rights, and women's empowerment, fostering leadership and social awareness.

Collaborations with organizations such as the TISS SAKSHAM Project underscore the college's dedication to community welfare. Through initiatives like TB awareness campaigns and a legal aid clinic, Aditi Mahavidyalaya ensures access to justice and inclusivity. In 2023-24, the institution evaluated 71 Targeted Intervention (TI) projects and six Link Worker Scheme (LWS) projects, while also conducting capacity-building workshops. These efforts reflect the college's vision to empower students and communities alike, creating a sustainable and equitable society.

1. Infrastructure Limitations:

- **Gap:** The college faces constraints in infrastructure to accommodate the increasing number of applicants.

- **Measures:**

- **Expansion Plan:** Develop a comprehensive plan for infrastructure expansion, including construction of additional classrooms, laboratories, and recreational facilities.
- **Utilize Space Efficiently:** Optimize existing space utilization through renovation and redesign to accommodate more students and enhance facilities.
- **Technology Integration:** Embrace digital infrastructure to facilitate remote learning and reduce the strain on physical infrastructure.

2. Talent Management:

- **Gap:** Recruitment of permanent faculty members remains a challenge, affecting teaching quality and continuity.

- **Measures:**

- **Streamlined Recruitment Process:** Work with university authorities to expedite the recruitment process for permanent faculty members, ensuring timely appointments.
- **Faculty Development Programs:** Implement comprehensive faculty development programs to enhance teaching skills, research capabilities, and academic leadership among existing faculty members.
- **Guest Faculty Pool:** Establish a pool of experienced guest faculty members to fill temporary gaps and maintain continuity in teaching.

3. Balancing Teaching and Research:

- **Gap:** The college struggles to balance intensive teaching commitments with rigorous research endeavors.

- **Measures:**

- **Research Support Mechanisms:** Provide dedicated support mechanisms, such as research grants, sabbaticals, and research assistantships, to encourage faculty engagement in research activities.
- **Integrated Curriculum:** Integrate research-oriented components into the curriculum, allowing students to engage in research projects from the undergraduate level.
- **Collaborative Research Initiatives:** Foster collaborations with industry partners, research institutions, and international universities to facilitate research projects and enhance research outcomes.

Measures to Fill Identified Gaps:

1. Infrastructure Development:

- Develop a comprehensive infrastructure expansion plan, prioritizing the construction of additional classrooms, laboratories, and recreational facilities.
- Implement technology upgrades to support digital learning initiatives and alleviate pressure on physical infrastructure.
- Seek funding opportunities from government schemes, corporate partnerships, and alumni contributions to support infrastructure development projects.

2. Talent Acquisition and Development:

- Collaborate with university authorities to streamline the faculty recruitment process and expedite appointments.
- Invest in faculty development programs focused on enhancing teaching skills, research capabilities, and academic leadership.
- Establish a guest faculty pool to address temporary staffing gaps and ensure continuity in teaching.

3. Enhanced Focus on Research and Innovation:

- Allocate dedicated resources, including research grants and assistantships, to support faculty engagement in research activities.
- Integrate research-oriented components into the curriculum to encourage student participation in research projects from the undergraduate level.
- Forge partnerships with industry stakeholders, research institutions, and international universities to facilitate collaborative research initiatives and enhance research outcomes.

By implementing these measures, AMV College can address the identified gaps and strengthen its position as a leading institution for women's education and empowerment in India.

Recommendations/Observations

The audit was based on ten parameters:

I. Curriculum

The evaluation of the curriculum highlights several commendable aspects alongside opportunities for academic enrichment.

Commendable Aspects:



- **Expert Involvement in Curriculum Design:** The collaboration with experts from industries and international universities in crafting the curriculum reflects a commitment to aligning academic programs with industry trends and global standards.
- **Adoption of OBE & LOCF:** The implementation of Outcome-Based Education (OBE) and Learning Outcome-based Curriculum Framework (LOCF) underscores the institution's dedication to ensuring student-centered learning experiences. The utilization of a software platform supported by a Learning Management System (LMS) further enhances the effectiveness of these frameworks.
- **Well-Structured Curriculum Components:** The curriculum structure encompasses a diverse range of components, including Ability Enhancement Courses, Skill-Based Modules, Value-Added Programs, Job-Oriented Training, Foundation Courses, and Online Learning Modules. This holistic approach ensures a comprehensive educational experience for students.

Recommendations for Academic Enrichment:

- **Integration of Skill Development Components:** While the curriculum incorporates various components, there is a need to emphasize skill development across all courses. Integrating practical skill-building exercises, workshops, and industry-relevant projects into the curriculum can enhance students' employability and readiness for the workforce.
- **Incorporation of Latest Developments:** To ensure academic relevance and currency, each course should allocate a unit to explore the latest developments in the respective fields. This could involve integrating case studies, research findings, and industry updates to provide students with real-time insights into emerging trends and innovations.
- **Embrace Interdisciplinary Perspectives:** Encouraging interdisciplinary collaboration and integration within the curriculum can foster a holistic understanding of complex issues and promote innovative problem-solving skills. Incorporating interdisciplinary projects, guest lectures, and cross-disciplinary electives can enrich students' academic experiences and prepare them for multidisciplinary workplaces.
