Dr Meetu Luthra, Associate Professor, Physics Department, Bhaskaracharya College of Applied Science, University of Delhi was distinguished the speaker for the event. Dr Meetu Sethi elaborated the journey of invention of the modern semiconductor, by John Bardeen, Walter Brattain, and William Shockley, who developed the first transistor in 1947. Their invention laid the foundation for all modern electronics, making semiconductors essential to the digital age. She discussed different types of semiconductors - classified as intrinsic or extrinsic (n-type and p-type), which are crucial in modern technology. She explained that semiconductors power devices like computers, smartphones, and solar cells by controlling electrical currents.
